



#### TOWN WARRANT

#### STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Meredith, qualified to vote in town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said town on Tuesday, the 14th day of March, 1944 at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To bring in your ballots for Town Clerk, one Selectman for three years, Treasurer, two Auditors, Collector of Taxes, Chief of Police, Traffic Officer, one Trustee of Trust Funds for three years, one Trustee of Trust Funds for two years, two Library Trustees for three years, and a Road Agent.
- 2. To choose all other necessary Town Officers.
- 3. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.

- 4. To hear the report of the Budget Committee and act thereon.
- 5. To raise such sums of money as will be necessary for the repairs of Highways and Bridges.
- 6. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for General Highway Expenses.
- 7. To see what sums of money the Town will vote to raise toward the eradicating of White Pine Blister Rust. The State Forester requesting the sum of \$400.00. (By request)
- 8. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise toward defraying expenses of the Town Library.
- 9. To see if the Town will vote to raise \$401.57 for Town Road Aid provided the State will contribute \$1,606.26.
- 10. To see of the Town will raise \$3322.00 to be set aside for future construction of Parade, Pease, Oak Hill Road, provided the State will set aside \$6644.00 for this purpose.
- 11. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise toward the support of the Public Health Nurse.

- 12. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise for the benefit of the Laconia Hospital.
- 13. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate toward defraying the expense of Memorial Day and specify how same shall be expended.
- 14. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate toward the support of the Fire Department.
- 15. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$290.00 to the Lakes Region Association of New Hampshire to assist in Planning and Development of the town and for the issuance and distribution of printed matter and newspaper and magazine advertising calling attention to the resources and natural advantage of the Town, in cooperation with other towns in the Lakes Region.
- 16. To see if the Town will vote to petition the state tax commission to have an audit made by the division of municipal accounting January, 1946, and to make an appropriation to cover the expense of such audit. In case this article is approved it will not be required to elect local auditors at the March 1945 election.
- 17. To see what action the Town will take relative to the leasing of the Town Hall.
- 18. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for the payment of Old Age Assistance and for the benefit of Indigent Persons chargeable to the Town of Meredith.

- 19. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise for improving Reservoir Road. (By request).
- 20. To see if the Town will vote to purchase a tractor sidewalk snowplow, and to appropriate money for same.
- 21. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise for improving Tucker Hill Road. (By request.)
- 22. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

### FOREST FIRE SERVICE

Damage from Forest Fires here in Meredith this past year was very low and we hope that the coming year will be the same.

With so much timber being cut and the shortage of manpower we are asking the cooperation of all in keeping our costs of fires down. The first item along this line is to get a permit before burning.....this saves time and money as every smoke reported in from our State Lookout towers has to be investigated and these boys are on their job more than ever. If a permit has been granted to the location reported we will tell the tower man the story and he will then watch to see that the fire does not spread. If no permit has been granted we would have to investigate on the first call and report back to him what we had found.

Second thought is that all fires must be under control at all times.....remember a permit is null and void:

If the weather is unfavorable or proclamation closing the woods is in force

If a fire is kindled at an unspecified time and place If help and equipment is inadequate to control fire If fire does escape from control, no exemption implied by this permit from following liabilities:

- 1. Payment of damage to property of another
- 2. Payment of suppression costs to Town
- 3. Prosecution for failure to comply with regulations.

Third....Report all fires at once....the quicker we get a crew on the fire the smaller the damage will be. LUMBER IS A VITAL NECESSITY—let's keep it standing until needed.

# DIVISION OF MUNICIPAL ACCOUNTING STATE TAX COMMISSION

### Gentlemen:

In acordance with the vote of the Town of Meredith, we have audited the acounts and records of the Town and submit our report herewith, consisting of Exhibits A and B, and Schedules A to M inclusive. Copies of these schedules are with Selectmen, Town Clerk, Town Treasurer and Tax Collector.

### Scope of Audit

The acounts of the Selectmen were examined for the fiscal year ended January 31, 1943, and the period February 1st to December 9, 1943. The accounts of the Tax Collector were examined from the date of our last audit (December 3, 1940) to December 9, 1943. Adequate examination of the accounts of the Treasurer Town Clerk, Road Agent, Overseer of the Poor, Trustees of Trust Funds and Library Trustees was conducted. The audit included the examination of vouchers and supporting data.

### **Finances**

Schedules A and B present a ten-year financial picture of the affairs of the Town. These were constructed from information on file in this Division.

### Indebtedness, Valuation and Taxes: (Schedule B)

The assessed valuation of taxable property increased. and the average local tax rate per hundred decreased

from \$4.11 in 1937 to \$2.96 in 1942, while the average rate for the whole state for the same period decreased from \$3.41 to \$3.23. In 1943, the average local rate was \$2.66, compared to the average state rate of \$3.03. From January 31, 1938 to January 31, 1943, Net Debt decreased from \$46,920.21 to \$9,434.55

## Appropriations and Expenditures Estimated and Actual Revenues—1942:

### (Schedules C and D)

As shown by the above statements, the excess of actual revenues over estimated revenues amounted to \$4,107.38, while appropriation overdrafts amounted to \$558.78, after giving consideration to taxes bought by the Town and charges for abatements and adjustments. However, included in actual revenues are additional taxes for the years 1942, 1941 and 1940 in the sum of \$677.69, together with \$1,278.44 returned from tax Sales Redeemed, and \$2,086.50 for rent of Equipment.

The year ended with a net Budget Surplus of \$3,548.60.

### ACCOUNTS OF SELECTMEN AND TREASURER

### (Schedules E, F and G)

All vouchers issued by the Selectmen during the year ended January 31, 1943, and the period February 1st to December 9, 1943 were examined. Road Agent's payrolls were also included. Invoices for general expenses of the highway department should always be attached to the payroll forms when filed.

Receipts of the Selectmen and Treasurer were checked by source, insofar as it was possible to do so. Totals of receipts and expenditures were verified. The Treasure's cash book balance at November 30, 1943 amounted to \$56,134.42 as set forth in Schedules F and F-1.

Additional taxes should be certified to the Tax Collector on warrants signed by the Selectmen. Errors and adjustments of original warrants together with abatements allowed should also be certified to the Tax Collector, signed by the Selectmen and copies of said data be filed with the records

### TAX COLLECTOR

The tax warrants of Collector Howard F. Weeks for the levies of 1939, 1940, 1941, 1942 and 1943 were audited as of December 9, 1943. Summaries of these warrants are set forth in Schedules H, H-1, H-2, H-3 and H-4.

We present a summary of Unredeemed Taxes and a Statement of Unredeemed Taxes, by Names of Taxpayers and years of levy in Schedules I and I-1.

The Securities and Savings banks' books representing the invested principal and unexpended income of

the various trust funds were examined. All funds as indicated by the trust fund records were accounted for.

### TOWN OFFICERS' BONDS

### (Schedule M)

The surety bonds of town officers were examined and found to be satisfactory as to form and amount. These are outlined in Schedule M.

### GENERAL COMMENTS

### **Exemption From Federal and State Taxes:**

Under the provisions of the 1942 Revenue Act, States and subdivisions of local government are exempted from the payment of excise taxes levied on purchases of certain commodities by the federal government. The exemption also applies to the transportation of property. A Schedule showing the taxes from which exemptions may be claimed by municipalities is included herewith.

When making purchases of materials or equipment, as indicated therein, the Town should require that invoices show the gross price, the amount of the tax, and the net price to the municipality. Exemption certificates should be filed to avoid payment of the tax.

It might be possible to recover the amount of federal tax included in purchases already made if the proper exemption certificates were filed with the dealers from whom purchases were made. It would be well to make inquiry of the Maxim Motor Company from whom the Fire Pump was purchased (Voucher No. 6156 in 1942).

The Town is also exempt from the payment of the State tax on gasoline used for other than highway purposes. An account of gasoline so used should be kept and application for rebate filed with the State Treasurer within 90 days of purchase. (Revised Laws—Chapter 120—Section 10)

### **Conclusion:**

The accounts and records of all town officials were found in good condition and the accounting procedure, with the exceptions as noted, conformed to the standard procedure prescribed by this Division

The provisions of Section 31, Chapter 211, Laws of 1939, require that this report or a summary of its essential features shall be published in the next annual town report. This letter of transmittal should be included in its entirety, but the inclusion of Schedules is optional.

We extend our thanks to the officials of the Town of Meredith for the time and cooperation given during the course of our audit.

### REPORT OF SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

On the school buildings of Meredith, the school board is endeavoring to carry out a series of substantial improvements over a period of years, each of which should contribute to economy of operation or greater usefulness of the buildings. About four years ago we applied insulation to the ceiling of the Lang Street school; this has served to prevent the formation of ice near the eaves in cold weather, causing the melting snow to find its way under the shingles into the classrooms. Last year we insultated the ceiling of the gymnasium, with a similar result in mind. In both these buildings the insulation has saved much loss of heat. especially in the gymnasium, which has a steel ceiling through which heat can readily pass. This present winter we have worked on the Lang Street heating system providing thermostatic traps for each radiator, and a water pump which speeds up the circulation of the water on its return to the boiler. This improvement provides good circulation of heat to all rooms, with increased comfort to the pupils and marked economy in fuel consumption.

The provision of noon lunches in both the high school and Lang Street school is part of a nation-wide movement in the direction of better nutrition for school children. Purchase of food is largely reimbursed from Federal funds. The cafeteria type of meal service has been very popular among both high school students and elementary grades.

Fundamental teaching of reading, writing, arithmetic, spelling and the like go on in war time as always. Geography has taken on a new interest, as boys from our town are stationed in distant parts of the world. Weekly newspapers, written on the level of the various school grades, provide timely material for the study of current events. An effort is made to distinguish be-

tween true and false impressions in the propaganda which comes to our attention daily.

The work of the schools in developing good attitudes of citizenship and patriotism, and in giving children a thorough background of fundamental skill and knowledge, is recognized as a necessary wartime activity. The War Production Board gives to schools a high priority rating for the purchase of supplies and materials: the War Manpower Commission rates teaching high on the scale of necessary work. In fact, we all should realize that Hitler and other dictators worked for years to educate their followers while they were still children, so these boys would become loval soldiers later on. Winning this war for the Allies must depend largely upon men and women already out of school: winning the peace, and preventing future wars, depend in great measure upon the wisdom of those who are now in schools. The teacher in these days has indeed a grave responsibility.

### REPORT OF THE HEADMASTER

To the Superintendent of Schools, the Board of Education and the Citizens of Meredith:

The teachers and pupils join me in thanking you for your generous interest in and support of our efforts.

During the past year the school experienced its first full year under the impact of war. Various war-time restrictions curtailed many of our normal activities and brought about changes in others. The lowering of the draft age brought an element of uncertainty into the lives of several of our young men, and before the close of the year the following were enlisted in the armed forces: Volney Ackerman, Frederick Drew, Ervin Hodgdon, Francis McCormack, Donald Merrill, Clayton Moulton, Alvin Pickering, Cecil Smith, Howard Tilton, Normand Valliere, Edwin Vittum and Roger Wyatt, all from the Class of 1943. During the present year the following have entered the armed services: Charles Currier, Charles Hickey, Kendall Moulton of the Class of 1944, and Arthur Weeks of the Class of 1945. Clarence Taylor of the Class of 1944 enlisted during the summer. Present members of the school who are enlisted but on inactive status are: Lauris Avery and Ralph Mullen in the Army Air Force, and John Humiston in the Naval Reserve.

The purchase of War Bonds and Stamps was begun last year and a total of \$2,314.55 worth was purchased. Sales for the current year amounted to \$1,292.85 at mid-year. The school recently received a citation from the Secretary of the United States Treasury.

The shortage of farm labor caused the Department of Agriculture to call on high school boys and girls to

help in the harvest of crops. From this school over forty boys and girls responded and contributed nearly 400 days of labor. Most of this work was done in the harvesting of apples, though considerable has been done in general farm labor.

The opening of school found our staff with one new member, Mr. Edward Hawsell of Berlin, N. H., replaced Mr. Connor. Mr. Hawsell is a graduate of the University of New Hampshire and has done graduate work at Cornell University. He teaches junior business training and conducts the physical education classes. At the opening of the basketball season we were without a coach for the boys team. Fred Weeks, Class of '43 has carried on this work.

Two new subjects have been provided to fill present urgent needs. Miss Langer teaches Global Geography, an adaptation of the old economic geography emphasizing the new concepts brought out by the increasing use of the airplane. World Problems is a subject for Seniors providing an understanding of the economic, social and political problems we are now facing, with a serious study of the plans for peace and security proposed to go into effect at the end of the war. This subject is taught by the Headmaster.

The Annual H. Stewart Bosson Prize Speaking Contest was held during the spring term. First prize for a dramatic subject was awarded to Philip Davis, and for humorous selection to Clara Chandler. Mrs. Bosson provided gold pins for the awards, as she has so generously done for the past several years.

Attendance during the past year, in spite of difficult conditions, showed a drop of only one half of one percent. Tardiness remained at the level of the previous year, one-half of one percent. Both percentages are well above the average of the state.

The shop work under the direction of Mr. Carleton Howe has an enrollment of 47 boys. Considerable reno-

vating and alteration work has been done about the school building and the gymnasium. This work has been done mostly by the two upper classes. Projects that are turned out include sewing tables, kitchen tables, drawing boards, and tables, lamps, ironing boards, wall brackets and shelves, and cabinets of various kind.

Instruction in music conducted by Mr. Donald Musgrove shows the following enrollments: Orchestra 21, Band 13, Glee Club 35, and General Music 36. All these activities are carried on during school hours. Credit toward graduation is given for membership in the orchestra and band.

Present conditions have temporarily forced us to dispense with the Pemigewasset Festival. The New Hamp shire State Music Festival, another war casualty, will be attempted again in May, 1944. There will be an All-State Band, All-State Orchestra, and All-State Chorus made up of delegates from many high schools in the state. We have sent our quota of young performers in the past and expect to do so again this year.

In the Home Economics Course a total of 57 girls are enrolled. The ninth and tenth grades are studying foods and nutrition. This consists of the fundamentals of nutrition and its importance in the daily diet. They study the art of table setting and service, and from time to time prepare and serve whole meals to put this knowledge into practical effect. Last fall this group did a large amount of canning of fruits and vegetables for the hot lunch program. They learned how to use the Victory Pressure Canner as well as the hot water method. The Clothing and Textiles Classes learn the selection of material, design, and construction of clothing, and remodeling of clothing. One pupil remodeled a man's suit into a good looking suit for herself.

The Hot Lunch Program is prepared and served under the direction of the home economics teacher. Pupils are rendering valuable assistance in preparation and

serving of these meals. An average of 65 pupils are served each noon. Balanced meals containing, among other things each day, a glass of milk and fresh vegetables are provided.

The 19th annual meeting of the Alumni Association was held in the Grange Hall on June 17th. The following officers were elected: Pres., Bradbury Sprague; vice president, Victorine Ambrose; Secretary, Mrs. Harry Plummer; treasurer, Mrs. Robert Maloney, and auditor, Sedley Bartlett.


