THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the Town of New Hampton in the County of Belknap in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town House in said New Hampton on Tuesday, the fourteenth day of March next, at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.

2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriation of the same.

3. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the repair of highways and bridges and make appropriations for the same.

4. To see if the town will vote to accept State aid and raise and appropriate money for the same.

5. To see how much money the town will vote to raise for Memorial Day and the decoration of soldiers' graves, and make appropriation for the same.

6. To see how much money the town will vote to raise for Old Home Day and make appropriation for the same.

7. To see how much money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the support of Laconia Hospital to be used to pay for the care of needy residents of the town.

8. To see if the town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to administer or dispose of any real estate acquired by the town through Tax Collectors' Deeds.

9. To see if the town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to hire money in anticipation of taxes.

By request.

10. To see if the town will vote to reimburse Peter Carlson for money paid in law suit Moody vs. Carlson and raise and appropriate money for the same.

By request.

11. To see if the town will vote to complete the road in the Southern part of the town across Lucian Fogg's pasture and raise \$300.00 for the same.

12. That every man or boy who applies for or receives the benefits of town aid shall be given work by the Selectmen or Road Agent at two dollars per day for the amount of aid which he shall receive.

13. That no truck and its driver shall receive over eight dollars a day when working for the town.

14. To see if the town will vote to have the tractors and snow ploughs put in first class condition in the month of November, of each year, under the supervision of the Selectmen.

15. To see if the town will vote to buy a new truck for the use of the town and raise \$700.00 for same and authorize the Selectmen make the purchase.

16. To see if the town will vote to employ those who owe for back taxes to pay up the same, holding two-thirds to apply on said taxes.

17. To transact any other business that may legally come before this meeting.

REPORT OF SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

To the Citizens of New Hampton:

This, my first annual report, will deal with the following topics:

- (a) Statistics of our schools.
- (b) School buildings, equipment, and textbooks.
- (c) Changes in supervisory unions.
- (d) Health and physical welfare.
- (e) Music supervision.
- (f) Teaching the fundamentals.
- (g) Recommendations for 1935-1936.

Examination of the foregoing table reveals the following interesting facts:

(a) The length of our school year (actual number of days that school was in session) was about $1\frac{1}{2}$ days shorter than the average for New Hampshire.

(b) Only one of our schools, the Fiske, had a percentage of attendance noticeably lower than the State average.

(c) The Village school had not a single tardiness during the year.

(d) With only one exception, the parents and citizens of New Hampton show a commendable interest in school work, as shown by the record of their visits.

School Buildings, Equipment, and Textbooks

In general, I found New Hampton's schoolhouses in a good state of repair, with good window lighting. All but one of the buildings are equipped with modern ventilating heaters; the Sanborn school uses a box stove. None of them, however, has modern chemical toilets.

For equipment and books, I found a lack of good globes and maps for teaching geography, and a variety of textbooks, a few of a kind, many of them badly worn. The School Board has authorized me to purchase a considerable number of new textbooks this year, and I hope that more may be provided next year to supply our needs.

Changes in Supervisory Unions

In 1933, the State Legislature, by cutting the appropriation for state-wide supervision of schools, made necessary a decrease in the number of superintendents employed, and a rearrangement of the school districts in various unions in such a way as to increase the number of teachers under each superintendent. New Hampton is now included with four other districts—Ashland, Meredith, Center Harbor, and Holderness.

Health and Physical Welfare

Until the present year, New Hampton has been one of the few districts in the state without the services of a school nurse. This year, by utilizing money left on hand at the end of last year, we have been able to employ one.

The school nurse makes the annual physical examination required by law, as our school doctor has heretofore done. In addition to this, she has personal conferences with many parents concerning the health of the children, arranges for clinics or hospital care when funds can be procured from individuals or organizations, and follows up cases that need attention. By her help many of the cases of poor eyesight, enlarged tonsils, defective teeth, etc., are corrected; whereas the school doctor's duty was done when he sent home a card to the parents—a reminder that is very often disregarded.

Miss Nichols has proved herself a willing worker and a competent nurse. If we are fortunate enough to retain her services for another year, she should be able to accomplish much more, as much of one's time at first is used in getting acquainted with the people, the territory, and the needs of the children.

Music Supervision

A very commendable beginning has been made in introducing our pupils to the elements of note reading in music. Such training as this should remove the disadvantage which rural children usually discover when they try to join the high school glee club or chorus, and find that they cannot read the music. Mrs. Adams deserves much credit for her efforts in bringing such an opportunity to New Hampton children.

Teaching the Fundamentals

Whatever other worth-while activities the schools may encourage or develop in our children, we must never lose sight of those old-fashioned necessities,—reading, writing, arithmetic, spelling and English. To aid in directing instruction in these branches, standardized tests are being given from time to time to determine the standing of each class and individual as compared with others in the same grade elsewhere. These tests have another valuable function—to determine the points of weakness in each pupil's preparation, and thus to guide the teachers in providing drill where it is most needed.

Recommendations for 1935-1936

(a) We should, in my opinion, continue the work of the school nurse and music supervisor for another year.

(b) We should purchase several new globes and sets of maps to replace the wornout and obsolete ones now in use.

(c) We should apply our annual repair appropriation, as in the past, to a thorough job on one schoolhouse each year, wherever the work is most needed.

Conclusion

Grateful acknowledgment is here made of the willing cooperation of parents, citizens, and teachers who have helped in many ways this year. Special mention should be made of the Grange, which sponsors our annual school fair and exhibit. Let us continue to work together for the good of the children.
