



WARRANT.

To the inhabitants of the Town of Northumberland qualified to vote in Town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at Forbush Hall in said Town on the second Tuesday of March next, to act upon the subjects hereinafter mentioned. The polls will be open at said place and date from 9:00 o'clock in the forenoon until 6:00 o'clock in the afternoon for the reception of your ballots upon the election of Town officers under the Australian Ballot Law; furthermore, you are hereby warned that on said date and place, at 11:00 o'clock in the forenoon, the matters of appropriations and such other business properly coming before said meeting will be taken up for your consideration and action.

- 1. To choose by ballot a Town Clerk for the ensuing year.
- 2. To choose by ballot one Selectman for the ensuing three years.
- 3. To choose by ballot one or more Road Agents and other necessary Town Officers, Agents and Auditors for the ensuing year.
- 4. To choose by ballot one Library Trustee for the ensuing three years.
- 5. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for the support of Town Poor, and to pay Town Officers.
- 6. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for the support of the Police Department.
- 7. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for building and repairing highways and bridges,

including money for trunk line repairs, trunk line maintenance, state aid maintenance, and state aid construction.

- 8. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for sewer maintenance and sewer construction.
- 9. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for lighting streets for the ensuing year.
- 10. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for the support of the Public Library.
- 11. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for the observance of Memorial Day.
- 12. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise with regard to the employment of a district nurse.
- 13. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for Miscellaneous Expenses.
- 14. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for the widening and surfacing the streets known as Bearce Street and Hillside Avenue, both in the Village of Groveton.
- 15. To transact any other business that may legally be brought before said meeting.
