

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## 1916 CHARLES S.B. KNOWLES 1973

Charles Knowles, more commonly known to those who knew and loved him as "King", was born in Seabrook, May 16, 1916 and died in the line of duty August 12, 1973.

He was first appointed a Police Officer in 1938 and had served under eight Chiefs in his thirty four years of service. He belonged to numerous Police Organizations, the Rand Memorial Church, the Star in the East Lodge AF & AM of Exeter, and the East Gate Club of Seabrook.

"King" served the Town well, and will never be forgotten by those who knew and loved him.

To the inhabitants of the Town of Seabrook in the County of Rockingham, in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet in the lower hall of the Seabrook Firemen's Association Building, Route 286, on Tuesday, March 5, 1974, at 9 o'clock in the forenoon and to cast ballots until at least 6:30 o'clock in the evening of the same day, and to meet in the upper hall of the Seabrook Firemen's Association Building, Route 286, on Thursday, March 7, 1974, at 7:30 o'clock in the evening to act on the following articles:

ARTICLE I: To elect by Non-partisan ballot: One Selectman, and one Assessor for a term of Three (3) years; One Trustee of the Trust Funds for a term of Three (3) years; a Road Agent; a Chief of Police; a Chief of the Fire Depart-. ment; Three (3) Constables; Two (2) members of the Budget Committee for a term of Three (3) years; a member of the Park Commission for a term of Three (3) years; and any other officers for the ensuing year.

(On the Official Ballot)

ARTICLE II: To choose two (2) delegates to the Constitutional Convention.

(On the Official Ballot)

ARTICLE III: To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,365,000.00, said amount to be raised by the issuance of bonds or notes of the Town, the discretion of fixing the date, maturities, denominations, interest rate or discount rate, place of payment, form and other details of said notes or bonds and for providing for the sale thereof to be delegated to the Board of Selectmen; for the purpose of adding to and improving the municipal water system and the acquisition of such real estate as is necessary for the project.

ARTICLE IV: To see if the Town will vote to authorize and empower the Selectmen to contract for or accept grants of federal or state aid or both for said project thereby giving the authority to borrow in anticipation of said aid.

ARTICLE V: To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes and to renew and refund Town notes.

ARTICLE VI: To see if the Town will vote to revise the salaries and wages of Town officials and employees.

During the year, 265,492,380 gallons of water were pumped, an increase of 9,363,480 gallons over previous year.

Of this amount, 120,051,860 gallons were commercial and industrial use, Bailey Division being our largest user has installed a large reservoir for recycling and added fire protection that could save about 16,000,000 gallons annually.

43 new services were connected to the system, plus four larger connections, Race Track, Large Apartment, Shopping Center and a 39 lot development.

In fiscal 1972-1973, 1235 calls were made 407 of which were made at no charge. It is the policy of the agency to scale fees or provide service on a no-charge basis to those patients unable to pay. In addition to Nursing Service the services of the Physical Therapist and Speech Therapist were utilized in Seabrook.

178 Childred from Seabrook are being followed at our Well Child Clinic. They receive physical exams, immunization, counseling blood tests and developmental screening. This past year for the first time, we were able to offer a Dental Clinic for those children in our Well Child Clinic which included cleaning and topical fluoride treatment. In the past year we sponsored an immunization clinic in the school with the help of the school nurse, 209 children were immunized. A vision and hearing screening were also offered.

Visits are made monthly on those persons in your town who come under the State TB program to check on their medication supply, observe for adverse reactions and make appointments for the follow-up chest x-rays.

We also are involved with the Aftercare program in conjunction with the Seacoast Regional Counseling Center. Patients who have been discharged from New Hampshire Hospital are followed, appointments are made for them to be seen at the Counseling Center for medication reviews and additional assessment and much emotional support is given to both the patient and family.

Referrals are made to appropiate agencies when the need arises.

### CHILD & FAMILY SERVICES

### OF N.H.

### SEACOAST REGIONAL OFFICE

WHO: Seacoast Regional Office of Child & Family services of N.H. serves the seacoast area of Rockingham County and Durham in Strafford County. We are members of Family Service Association of America and Child Welfare League of America. Our Staff all hold Master of Social Work degrees.

WHERE: We are located at 24 Front St., Exeter. Tel. 772-3786

- WHEN: Families in crisis turn to us for counseling because of marital discord, uneasy parent-child relationships, conflicts in adolescence, unwanted pregnancy or any other problem.
- WHY: Our counseling practices insure concern and confidentiality. We are available when people are upset. By working with whole families we help members toward better communication. We also see people individually and we use the group method whenever it seems likely to be most helpful.

### WHAT WAS DONE IN 1973

Three hundred and sixty five families came to us and suxty more families used our services through our consultation with other agencies.

In Seabrook we worked with 14 families in this way.

### REPORT OF TRAFFIC SAFETY COMMITTEE

### FOR 1973

- 1: Established separate traffic lanes at 286-1A junction to eliminate a source of frequent accidents.
- 2: Had curve warning signs placed at the end of South Main Street and on the Centennial Road detour. Yield signs were also placed on Walton Road and Farm Lane while the railroad bridge was being re-decked.
- 3: The hazards of parking on the roadsides on routes 1 and 1A were eliminated by making these two main thoroughfares "NO PARKING" from the Massachusetts line to the Hampton and Hampton Falls lines.
- 4: The late Chief Knowles with the aid of the police safety officer surveyed the entire town, street for street, and established proper speed limits for each street. This included the beach roads also. An ordinance is in the making to es-tablish these speeds as as legal within the town.
- 5: The Safety Committee obtained a Radar Unit, with Federal assistance money, to aid in speed control on the most hazardous roads in the town.
- 6: Without cost to the town, the committee procured First Aid equipment for the Police cruiser. This is in addition to the equipment on the Ambulance/Cruiser.
- 7: Complaints received by the Selectmen and Police Department relative to dangerous parking, undue speeding etc., were followed up by members of the committee and suggestions made as to reducing these hazards.
- 8: The committee established safety rules for use at the dog track entrance and roads leading thereto, and assisted the track people on problems dealing with construction of the entrances as they pertained to the old and the proposed new road lines.
- 9: The committee has obtained from Federal Funds the sum of \$2500.00 to be used for a Highway Safety Traffic Control vehicle. This unit to be used for this purpose, only. It will carry the Radar unit and will handle all traffic problems, accidents, speed control, traffic movement etc. We are the first town in New Hampshire to be granted money for this purpose, and it is hoped that we can set an example for other communities to follow.

Report of Traffic Safety Committee

10: The committee still has several problems to overcome with regard to Traffic Movement. A major item is the Railroad Avenue-route 1 junction. Steady traffic on route 1 north and south almost precludes the possibility of entering from Railroad Avenue. However, the State has offerred a solution that could eliminate this problem. The solution is to make the parking area of the Post Office and the new bank in one unit; then a light arrangement would be established to handle cross traffic and north-south traffic, thereby eliminating the present problem altogether.

We, the Safety Committee, would like in passing, to pay tribute to the late Chief Knowles, who as a standing member of this committee did much to keep the rest of us on an "always moving ahead" basis.

It should be noted, that this committee is basically an advisory committee to the Selectmen.
