WARRANT

THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Stewartstown, in the County of Coos in said State qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the town house in said town of Stewartstown on Tuesday, the 8th day of March next, at ten o'clock in the forenoon to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To see if the town will vote to accept State Aid.
- 2. To see if the town will vote to accept the budget, as approved by the Budget Committee and raise money for the same. If not, to see what sum of money the town will vote to raise to defray town charges for the ensuing year as follows:
 - (a) Town Officers' Salaries.
 - (b) Town Officers' Expenses.
 - (c) Election and Registration.
 - (d) Town hall, office and other buildings.
 - (e) Damage and Legal Expenses.
 - (f) Health Department.
 - (g) Town Dump Expense.
 - (h) Vital Statistics.
 - (i) General Expense of Highway Department.
 - (j) Civil Defense.
 - (k) Interest on Temporary Loans.
 - (1) County Tax.
- To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for support of poor.
- To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for support of libraries.
- To raise such sum of money as may be necessary for care of cemeteries.
- To see if the town will vote to raise two thousand seven hundred dollars (\$2,700.00) for street lighting.

- To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the following departments.
 - (a) Police Department.
 - (b) Fire Department.
 - (c) Sewer Department.
- To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise in addition to that required by law for the town maintenance.
- To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for winter roads.
- 10. To see if the town will vote to discontinue the use of the Town grader for one year and hire the work done. To see if the expense won't be much less than to repair and maintain the Town Grader which is over seventeen years old and the motor completely gone.

- 11. To see if the town will vote to instruct the Selectmen to sell the old snow plow by sealed bids.
- 12. To see if the town will vote to raise five hundred dollars (\$500.00) to identify the Clarksville and Stewartstown town line.
- To see if the town will vote to rescind a vote taken March
 12, 1901 establishing the price of rent on lots now vacant at Big Diamond Pond owned by the Town of Stewartstown.
- To see what sum of money the town will vote to charge on all vacant lots at Big Diamond Pond.
- 15. To see if the town will vote that no lots will be leased for over a period of two years to any person who has not at least started building on them.
- 16. To see if the town will vote to instruct and authorize the Selectmen to administer and dispose of at a public auction any and all real estate now owned and acquired by the town through Tax Collector's deeds.
- 17. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to incur debts, for temporary loans in anticipation of taxes of the Municipal year and pay out of the tax money when it is received.

- To see if the Town will vote to instruct its Selectmen to appoint all other officers as required by law not elected by Non-Partisan Ballot.
- To choose by Non-Partisan Ballot the following Town officers:
 - (a) Town Clerk.
 - (b) Selectman for three years ensuing.
 - (c) Town Treasurer.
 - (d) Two Road Agents.
 - (e) One or more Auditors.
 - (f) Overseer of Public Welfare.
 - (g) Collector of Diamond Pond Rent.
 - (h) One or more Sextons,
 - (i) Trustee of Trust Funds.
 - (j) One library trustee for three years ensuing.
 - (k) Two members of the Budget Committee for three years ensuing.
- 20. To transact any other business that may be legally brought before this meeting.

Superintendent's Report

To The School Board and the Citizens of the School District
of Stewartstown

FOREWORD

If the age old saying "the proof is in the pudding" still holds true, and it is strongly suspected that it would be extremely difficult to come up with anything the contrary, then it would seem to follow that possibly a brief look at two of the outcomes attributed to our overall educational effort provide opportunity for comparison. The two areas we have particularly in mind, the technological and the sociological, in so far as performance is concerned, furnish perhaps as contrasting pictures as could be chosen. Certainly, from the standpoint of the utilization of know how in the former, no matter in what direction we may look, as compared to that of a decade ago, our accomplishments have been truly phenomenal. We are told that, so tremendous has been the acceleration of the progress made during this short period of time, what has been accomplished exceeds even that of the whole previous century. And now to actually witness what is taking place in our present day space program is almost beyond comprehension.

To turn now from the first of the two pictures we are to examine to look at the second, we are struck with the contrast of the hue between the two. This second one, which has to do with how we get along with our fellowmen, does not have the luster and the definiteness that stands out so eminently in the first. It jolts us into a greater awareness of that which every single one of us very well knows, whether or not admitted, that it is one matter to determine what things can do and in getting them to do it, and that it is quite a different matter to determine what we can or should do and in getting us to do it. The distance across this wide gap between really knowing and actually doing, considered either individually or collectively, has been narrowed little if any down through the many years. How to bring these two parallel fields of endeavor nearer together is still our greatest unsolved problem, and should constitute our major educational objective. The big question is, will we ever acknowledge this grave responsibility that is ours and really face up to the challenge? Past circumvention causes one to wonder.

TEACHERS

Of the three new teachers employed this year, one is at the West Stewartstown and two are at the Hollow Elementary School. At the former school Mrs. Marion P. Dowse, who received her training at Lyndon Normal School and who is a veteran teacher with many years of experience in Vermont, teaches Grades 4-5. At the latter school Mrs. Elizabeth C. Goodwin, who received her training at the same school as did Mrs. Dowse and who is also an experienced teacher, teaches Grades 1-4. Mrs. Sylvia M. Hibbard, a graduate of Plymouth Teachers College, and who is returning to teach in the same school after being away for a year, teaches Grades 5-8. The two teachers at the West Stewartstown School who have returned to work with us again in the district this year with respective Grades taught are Mrs. Cleora M. Richardson 1-3, and Mrs. Marcia A. Pond 6-8.

SCHOOL NURSE - HEALTH

We are very much pleased to report that in addition to the vitally important work customarily done by our school nurse in safeguarding the overall health of our children through the conducting of periodic checkups, physical examinations, and various clinics that a beginning has been made in dental care this year. This has been brought about by every district in the supervisory union taking advantage of a program sponsored by the State Department of Health and Welfare wherein up to a specified limit funds raised by a local school district are matched dollar for dollar for the care of children's teeth. Present plans are to expand this much needed service next year.

MAINTENANCE - REPAIRS

Although it has been a relatively short time since their installation at the time of the construction of the Hollow Elementary School Building in the summer of 1959, due to the serious deterioration that has taken place since that time, it has been necessary to make extensive repairs and replacements in both the heating and water systems during the past year.

At the West Stewartstown Building extensive renovations were made in the room occupied by the first three grades. Included in the work done was the replacement of the large outside windows on the south side of the room with smaller ones, and the lowering and replacing of the former plaster ceiling with an acoustical tile one.

In addition to the major repairs and renovations made listed above, a manhole was installed in the school grounds on the west

side of the Hollow School to take better care of the excessive flow-off of water which occurs during heavy showers, and quite exetnsive interior decorating was done in the West Stewartstown Building including the painting of the three porch floors, entire ground floor except in the boiler room, walls and ceiling in the School Lunch Room, and the walls and ceiling in the room occupied by Grades 6-8. New window shades, also, were purchased and put up in the new windows in the room that was renovated, and in the windows in the front of the building.

Such other repair work as was done on grounds and in building was general in nature and in keeping with the long standing policy of keeping school property in a good state of maintenance.

SCHOOL LUNCH PROGRAM

Without question, of all the programs conducted by the schools up and down the length and across the breadth of our State, there is none that contributes so materially to the overall physical well being and happy life of the boys and girls enrolled in our schools as does the School Lunch Program. Especially is this true of the programs conducted in the smaller schools, as is done in the West Stewartstown School, where it is usually the only one outside of the academic that is carried on for any length of time during the school year. The hard and diligent work of the operator, Mrs. Floris Ladd, plays no small part in the success of this local program.

ENROLLMENT AND ATTENDANCE

For the second consecutive year the total enrollment of 127, West Stewartstown 78 and the Hollow 49, is larger than it was the preceding one, as it was 120 a year ago at this time. Enrollments for the respective preceding eight years, beginning with year before last, show counts of 110, 132, 120, 124, 113, 112, 113 and 117. The average percentage of attendance last year on the West Side of the district was 96.49 while on the East Side it was 94.43. The total number of tardinesses during the past year of these schools taken in the same order was 42 and 8.

TUITION PUPILS

The number of pupils presently enrolled in schools outside the district of 70 is the largest that it has been in ten years since it was 61, 62, 55, 47, 47, 39, 45, 37, and 35, respectively for each of the previous nine years. Of the number of pupils for which the district is paying tuition for the current year, 24 are at Colebrook Academy, 44 are at Canaan High School, Canaan, Vermont, and 2 are at the Colebrook Elementary School.

NOTES ON THE BUDGET

It will be noted upon examination of subsequent pages in this report that the School Board's Budget of \$94,653.00 for 1966-67 is again somewhat larger, as was the case last year, than is the one recommended by the Budget Committee of \$94,153.00. In contrast to these respective budgets, the ones submitted for consideration for the current year were \$91,462.00 and \$90,512.00. Next year's estimated income of \$29,400 leaves \$65,253.00 or \$64,753.00 respectively to be raised by taxes by the town depending upon which one of the proposed budgets is adopted. Provision for increases in salaries, transportation, and in supervisory union costs, for the most part, explain the increase in the budget.

CONCLUSION

As has been done many times previously, I wish to express my sincere and deep appreciation to the members of the School Board, parents, teachers, and citizens for all the assistance and cooperation received as we have worked together down through the years to provide and maintain high standards in our schools.
