TOWN WARRANT

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Stoddard in the County of Cheshire in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Town of Stoddard on Tuesday, the ninth day of March, next at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.
3. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for Highways and Bridges for the ensuing year.
4. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for snow removal for the ensuing year.
5. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for the General Expenses of the Highway Department for the ensuing year.
6. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate anything for the observance of Old Home Day.
7. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate or set aside the sum of one hundred, sixty-seven dollars and fifty-seven cents (\$167.57) for T. R. A., so called.
8. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.

9. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the expenses of the Fire Department for the ensuing year.

10. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of thirty-nine dollars (\$39.00) to the Monadnock Region Association of Southern New Hampshire for the issuance and distribution of printed matter, newspaper and magazine advertising, calling attention to the resources and natural advantages of the Town in cooperation with the other thirty-seven Towns in the Monadnock Region.

11. To see if the Town will vote to accept the Provisions of the Municipal Budget Act.

12. To see if the Town will vote to petition the State Tax Commission to have an audit made by the Municipal Accounting Division and to make an appropriation to cover the expenses of such audit.

13. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

REPORT OF SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

To the School Board and Citizens of Stoddard:

I hereby submit my first annual report as superintendent of schools:

SCHOOL ORGANIZATION

School Board: Mrs. Charles Hill, chairman; Mr. Kenneth McClure; Mrs. Charles Swain.

Supt. of School: Howard F. Mason, Hillsboro, N. H.

Teacher: Mrs. Bessie Whitcomb, Hillsboro, N. H.

School Nurse: Margaret E. Harris, Keene, N. H.

PUPIL DATA

There were no pupils in grade 8 last year, and hence no graduating class.

The following pupils maintained perfect attendance for the full school year 1941-42: Ellen Mansell and Richard Mansell.

At the time school opened this fall there were 23 pupils at the Stoddard school. Since then several families have moved away and the present enrollment is 19.

GENERAL REPORT

One of my biggest problems last summer when I took over this position as superintendent, was to find a teacher for Stoddard. There was an extremely critical shortage of teachers at that time which has been growing steadily worse. The young girls graduating from the normal schools want to live in larger towns where they can find convenient transportation facilities, other young people, recreational facilities, suitable living conditions, and high salaries. I indeed felt fortunate to obtain the services of Mrs. Whitcomb, who, although she has not taught for over thirty years, was at that time considered a very satisfactory teacher in Stoddard. She resumed teaching as a patriotic duty.

The transportation of pupils to the school is the most difficult and expensive problem which Stoddard schools have to face. It is now, and has been for years, the largest item in the school budget. As long as people live long distances from the main highway probably little can be done about it. At present several pupils are being boarded near the school instead of being transported as this seems to be a more satisfactory solution.

The school pupils worked energetically at collecting scrap during the fall scrap drive. From the sale of this material, games were bought which the youngsters have enjoyed all winter. They are purchasing war savings stamps regularly and doing several other things to help in the "Schools at War" program. My one suggestion in regard to the pupils would be that parents do their best to have them at school every day, on time, unless they are sick.

I have enjoyed working with the school board who have shown a sincere and active interest in maintaining a good school in Stoddard. I also want to express my thanks to the P.-T. A. for their efforts in helping the school.
