## WARRANT FOR THE ANNUAL TOWN MEETING

## THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

(L. S.)

*To the inhabitants of the Town of Webster, in the County of Merrimack, in said State, qualified to vote in town affairs:*

You are hereby notified to meet at Grange Hall in said Webster on Tuesday, the eighth day of March, next at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.
3. To raise and appropriate such sums of money as may be necessary for the maintenance of highways and bridges.
  - a. Summer Maintenance
  - b. Winter Maintenance
  - c. Tar Roads
  - d. General Expense of Highway Department
  - e. Street Lighting
4. To raise and appropriate the sum of \$533.23 for Class V road construction.
5. To raise and appropriate such sums of money as may be necessary for public welfare.
  - a. Town Poor
  - b. Old Age Assistance
6. To raise and appropriate such sums of money as may be necessary for the support of the town library.



7. To raise and appropriate such sums of money as may be necessary for patriotic purposes.

- a. Old Home Day                      b. Memorial Day

8. To raise and appropriate such sums of money as may be necessary for the support and maintenance of the Hy-Mar Fire Department, including forest fires.

9. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the care of cemeteries.

10. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$400 for use in the connection with the state program for the eradication of White Pine Blister Rust.

11. To see if the town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$33.00 toward the operating deficit of the Concord Hospital, this amount being based on the number of patients admitted from Webster.

12. To authorize and empower the Board of Selectmen to borrow for the town, by the issuance of notes, a sum not exceeding \$20,000 in anticipation of taxes for the year 1960, said notes payable from said taxes within one year from the date of issuance, and to authorize the Board of Selectmen to determine the rate of interest on such notes and to provide for the sale thereof.

13. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$100 for the maintenance of the playground.

14. To see if the town will vote to raise \$25 to be expended in cooperation with the New Hampshire Forestry and Recreation Commission for the opening and maintaining of trails and old trails and old roads for forest fire protection. The New Hampshire Forestry and Recreation Commission to provide a matching sum not in excess of \$25 for this purpose.

15. To transact any other business that may legally come before the meeting.

## PREVENTION IS EVERYBODY'S BUSINESS

---

The year 1959 was fortunate from a forest fire standpoint. New Hampshire had the best record in the nation. Fewer acres were burned, suppression costs were substantially reduced and damage to woodlands held to a minimum. The record resulted from a combination of favorable weather conditions, an alert warden service and a cooperating public.

Yet, despite all this, there still persists a disturbing note — 58%, or 6 out of every 10 fires in 1959 were caused by careless smokers and debris burners. 10%, or one out of every 9 fires were caused by children. Careless, indifferent, thoughtless and independent minded individuals and failure of parents to properly supervise children and keep matches out of their reach, annually causes these unnecessary fires which cost large sums to extinguish and cause extensive damage. The elimination of these three causes of fire would radically change this picture. The rules are simple —

1. Before burning, secure a permit from your local forest fire warden — the law requires it.
2. Be sure to properly supervise your burning.
3. Make certain your fire is DEAD OUT before leaving it.
4. Don't throw lighted matches, cigars and cigarettes from moving vehicles—use your ash tray.

## SCHOOL WARRANT

## THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

*To the Inhabitants of the School District in the town of  
Webster, qualified to vote in district affairs:*

You are hereby notified to meet at the Grange Hall in said district on the 8th day of March 1960, at 1:00 o'clock in the afternoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose a Moderator for the coming year.
2. To choose a Clerk for the ensuing year.
3. To choose a Member of the School Board for the ensuing three years.
4. To choose a Member of the School Board for the ensuing one year.
5. To choose a Treasurer for the ensuing year.
6. To hear the reports of Agents, Auditors, Committees, or Officers chosen and pass any vote relating thereto.
7. To choose Agents, Auditors and Committees in relation to any subject embraced in this warrant.
8. To see what sum of money the District will raise and appropriate for the support of schools, for the salaries of school district officials and agents, and for the payment of statutory obligations of the district, and to authorize the application against said appropriation of such sums as are estimated to be received from the state foundation aid fund together with other income: the school board to certify to the selectmen the balance between the estimated revenue and the appropriation, which balance is to be raised by taxes by the town.



9. To see if the district will raise and appropriate the sum of Five Thousand (\$5000) dollars to convert the school lunch room into a classroom: to provide the necessary equipment, and to provide an additional teacher. (This plan is recommended by the study committee appointed at the last school meeting.)

10. To see if the district will raise and appropriate the sum of Twelve Thousand (\$12000) dollars to send the 7th. and 8th. Grades as tuition pupils to Warner.

11. To see if the District will vote to authorize the construction and equipment of an addition to the Webster Central School.

12. To see if the District will vote to authorize the issue of serial notes or bonds in the amount not exceeding Twenty Five Thousand (\$25000) dollars for the purpose specified in the previous Article and to authorize and empower the school board to determine the time and place of payment and the rate of interest on such notes or bonds, to provide for the sale thereto and to do any and all such acts as they may deem necessary to the issuance thereof, in accordance with the provisions of the Municipal Bond Statute, N.H. Revised Laws, Chapter 72, and any amendments thereto.

13. To authorize the school board, acting on the advice of the Building Committee, to enter into all contracts necessary for the construction and equipment of the addition.

For the third year we have the same teachers in the Webster School. Mrs. Mabel M. Anderson is the teacher of Grades 1-4 and Mrs. Ethel Colby teaches Grades 5-8. Miss Blanche C. Bailey continues to teach Music.

Our enrollment continues to show a gradual increase. At the present time there are thirty-three pupils in Mrs. Anderson's room and thirty-two in Mrs. Colby's room. Mrs. Anderson has thirteen first graders and eight second graders which is quite a task in itself.

A committee has been studying this problem and discussing two possible solutions. The first solution would be to add another room to the present building, and, with an additional teacher, split the grades in the following manner: Primary Room—Grades 1, 2 and 3, Middle Grades Room—Grades 4 and 5, and Upper Grades Room—Grades 6, 7 and 8. This combination of grades could be shifted depending on the number of pupils in each grade.

The other solution would be to have grades 1, 2 and 3 in the lower grade room; grades 4, 5 and 6 in the upper grade room and transport the seventh and eighth grades to another town where they could get the regular Junior High program. This program has certain obvious advantages in that the pupils would be in a class that had all seventh or eighth grade pupils and would have the added competition that some of them need. In addition they would have the advantage of having classes in Home Making for the girls and Shop for the boys as well as Physical Education.

The disadvantage is that the town would have to pay tuition and transportation for these children, plus an ever increasing tuition cost, due to the increasing cost of High School education, and plus the fact that

in a few years the number of high school pupils will more than double. This would mean a large increase in the budget.

In spite of these large increases in school budgets the state persists in making the towns raise over 90% of their money on a property tax, and I still have to be convinced that a man who has more cows than his neighbor is better able to pay taxes unless we can teach cows to do something else besides give milk.

These are indeed difficult days, but if we are to survive as a nation in this age of Intercontinental Ballestic Missiles, we must solve these problems and solve them well.
