7. To see if the Town will raise money for White Mountain Region Association.

- 8. To see if the Town will vote to raise \$250.00 for protection of Town property.
- 9. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

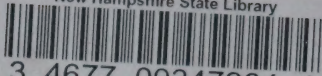
