State of New Hampshire TOWN WARRANT

To the inhabitants of the Town of Windsor in the County of Hillsborough in said State, qualified to vote in Town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town House in said Windsor on Tuesday, the 2nd day of March, 1976, the Town Meeting to open at the conclusion of the School District Meeting; which is called for at 6 P.M., to act upon the following subjects.

- 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
- 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray Town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.
- 3. To hear reports of Auditors and Agents heretofore chosen and to pass any vote in relation thereto.
- 4. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate \$3,150.00 for highways.
- 5. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate \$100.00 for Town mapping.
- 6. To see if the Town will vote to accept State Aid on its highways and raise and appropriate \$22.87 as the Town's share.
- 7. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate \$250.00 for Police and Fire expenses.
- 8. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate \$75.00 for the upkeep of the Town House.
- 9. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate \$45.00 for Street Lighting.
- 10. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate \$50.00 for the upkeep of the Town Cemeteries.
- 11. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of Taxes.
- 12. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to use all or any amount of surplus to alleviate the tax rate.
- 13. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate \$50.00 to donate to the Hillsboro Rescue Squad.

- 14. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate \$1,500.00 to be paid to the Town of Hillsboro for the use of the public sanitary receiving station in Hillsboro, N. H.
- 15. To see if the Town will vote to authorize with-drawal from the Revenue Sharing Fund established under the provisions of the State and Local Assistance Act of 1972 for use as setoffs against budget appropriations in the amount indicated; and, further to authorize the Selectmen to make pro rata reductions in the amount if estimated entitlements are reduced or take any other action thereon:

- 16. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate \$100.00 for legal expenses.
- 17. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate \$55.76 as an annual membership fee in the Southwestern New Hampshire Regional Planning Commission.
- 18. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate \$300.00 to help pay the cost of printing a bicentennial commemorative issue of the History of Windsor.
- 19. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

FOREST FIRE WARDEN'S REPORT

Upon the recommendation of town Selectmen and City Councils, the Division of Forests and Lands appoints a forest fire warden and several deputy forest fire wardens in each town and city every three years. The town or city warden is responsible for maintaining a force of men and adequate equipment to suppress any wildfire that occurs in his town or city during his term of appointment. The fire warden must authorize all open burning when the ground is not covered with snow. No open fires can be authorized between 9 a.m. and 5 p.m., unless it is raining, without the additional permission of the state district fire chief.

Any person wishing to kindle an open fire when the ground is not covered with snow must first obtain the written permission of the forest fire warden. Camp and cooking fires also require the warden's permission.

The Division of Forests and Lands, through its Forest Fire Service, assists all cities and towns in meeting these requirements by training the warden and deputy forces in wild-fire suppression tactics, making hand tool suppression equipment available at fifty percent of cost, supplying pieces of Federal excess property for use as fire attack vehicles and sharing up to fifty percent of the cost of wildfire suppression costs.

Wildfire prevention is also a joint state, city or town program. Smokey Bear is available from the Forest Fire Service for local fire prevention programs. Posters and Junior Ranger kits are available for distribution by local fire departments upon request to the Forest Fire Service. Each forest fire warden is expected to carry on a continuous wildfire prevention program within his town or city.

To see if the District will vote to authorize the School Board to make application for, and to accept on behalf of the District, any and all grants or other funds for educational purposes which may now or hereafter be forthcoming from the United States Government or from the State of New Hampshire for the school year 1976-1977.
- 6. To see what sum of money the district will vote to raise and appropriate for the support of schools, for the payment of salaries for School District officials and agents and for the payment of statutory obligations of the District.

7. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS REPORT

Human services in the overall spectrum of health, education and welfare have been subjected to constant public encounters as well as the extraordinary inflation of consumer goods and services. The life sustaining aspects of education providing academic skills and vocational competence are generally well accepted. Public education is constantly changing in scope beyond the basic skills in reading, writing and computation as conservation education, ecology, career education, and overall health and nutrition education have made significant impact. The constant demands of keeping up to date in preparing our children for national and international economic, political and social elements have broadened and intensified educational concepts.

Federal and State legislation have presented us with programs beyond any criteria previously anticipated. The mandated special services for the handicapped has significant impact on financial resources but provides a necessary component. Educational pressures have been increasing through the years for more and more individualization of instruction on the one hand and concurrently we live in a world society with more and more reliance on interdependency of nations and people. Every child should be given the availability of services to ensure his legal right to obtain a competent education. To deal effectively with people and resources requires breadth of academic programming and training.

The weight of taxpayer concerns are genuine in seeking accountability of operation and fiscal control. However, budgetary limitations should be in the form of realistic constraint considering necessary services for all children not arbitrary axing wherein the resultant impact cripples services, programs, and plant maintenance. Education, too, has been victimized by inflation of goods and services. Although we are a service agency we cannot provide adequate instructional growth without the materials and tools for instruction.

Our communities are projected for steady growth over the next several years. We are in a receiving residential area as the metropolitan and suburban populations shift millions of people to the rural areas on the fringe of the industrial belt. There has been pupil population growth in some of our communities and with it has come a critical need for expanded facilities.

We thank you sincerely for your interest and concern in

providing the best possible education for our children. We seek your support in providing an adequate budget as well as extending yourselves in support of fine education.
