TOWN WARRANT

THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Barnstead in the County of Belknap in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at Town Hall in said Barnstead on Tuesday, the 14th day of March, next, at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
- 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations for the same as recommended by the Budget.
- 3. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.
- 4. To see if the Town will vote to allow a discount on property taxes paid two weeks after approval of tax rate by the State Tax Commission.
- 5. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to buy liability insurance on town labor and pay same out of the Highway Department.
- 6. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of \$200.00 for the Concord Hospital.
- 7. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of \$200.00 for the Pittsfield Town Dump.

- 8. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to dispose of the "Old Town Tractor" by outright cash sale or trade-in value.
- 9. To see if the town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to purchase a "Rock Rake" at a cost of \$800.00 and appropriate money for the same.
- 10. To see if the Town will vote to discontinue electing the Road Agent and have the Selectmen appoint the Road Agent. Same to take effect Town Meeting Day in 1962.
- 11. To see if the Town will vote to discontinue paying the Tax Collector a percentage of collections and place the Tax Collector on a straight salary of \$600.00 per year.
- 12. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of \$332.00 over and above the Fire Department Appropriation for the purchase of one 40 foot alumnium, three section ladder for the Center Barnstead Fire Co. By petition.
- 13. To see if the Town will vote to accept the sum of \$200.00 for the perpetual care of the graves of Leonard S. Palmer and Pearl S. Palmer located in the Frank E. Palmer lot at Riverview Cemetery in Barnstead, N. H.; \$100.00 of the amount for the perpetual care of the above mentioned graves and the other for the perpetual care of the remainder of the lot. By petition from Mrs. Eileen D. Everett, 50 Perley St., Concord, N. H.
- 14. To see if the Town will vote to appropriate the sum of \$100.00 same to be used for purchasing uniforms for the Town Police.
- 15. To see if the Town will vote to increase the salary of each of the Selectmen from \$400.00 to \$600.00 per year and appropriate money for the same, said increase to take effect now.

- 16. To see if the Town will vote to increase the regular Street Lighting appropriation by \$215.60; same to be used to pay for the installation and operation of two (2) additional street lights of "11,000 Lumen Mercury Luminaires." These lights to be installed at the junctions of Town Road and Route 28 above the new school and at junction of Town Road and Route 28 above Edward Kelley property.
- 17. To see if the Town will vote to change the purpose of "The Capital Reserve Grader Fund." This fund was established in 1949 for the purpose of purchasing a "New Austin Western Grader." The amount of the fund as of Dec. 31st, 1960 was \$11,660.49. The cost of a New Austin Western Grader Modell 99 is over \$25,000. A "Used Austin Western Grader," with a 90 day guarantee can be purchased for \$10,000. It is requested that the Town vote to change the purpose of the fund to permit the purchase by the Selectmen of a used grader as described above and to discontinue said Grader Fund.
- 18. To see if the Town will vote to raise the amount of \$5,000.00 for the repairs to the town hall, specifically the floor and foundation and the provision of a water supply system including lines. (Authorization made this work would be subject to bid and by contract specification.)
- 19. To hear the reports of Agents, Auditors, Committees or Officers heretofore chosen and pass any vote relating thereto.
- 20. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

TO THE RESIDENTS OF BARNSTEAD,

As chairman of the Board of Selectmen, I would like to briefly describe a few of the proceedings of the past year which I think deserve comment and which would be of interest to you.

Cut lumber and timber in Barnstead had an aggregate of over 2 million board feet in 1960.

Negotiations have been initiated with the property owners concerned for land use and acquisition to provide for a public swimming area and beach. Progress so far has been favorable.

Arrangements have been made with the Water Resources Board to regulate the water level in the Suncook Ponds so that the beaches will be exposed when the runoff is so high that they remain covered most of the summer. Also they have agreed to supervise the lowering of Pinkham Pond water level so that the summer residents will be able to clean the beaches.

A program for the restoration of the town hall has been proposed for the coming year with the idea that for a modest expenditure over the next two or three years we will see the building in repair and in a condition which will provide useful service for quite sometime. It will improve the community center and preserve the historical value of the old landmark which has housed your deliberations for so many years.

The Fish and Game Department has agreed to look into the fish management conditions of the Suncook River and will forward the results of its study when it is completed. Fishing should be improved.

Considerable time and effort were expended this year on assessing property, with the idea of completing coverage of the community in the coming year. Intentions are to employ the card file system adopted by the state and which is being adopted more and more by towns throughout the State. Initially in time expended it is a demanding process but once set up is far more economical and easy to use than the present system. I attended a working session conducted by the State Tax Commission showing its advantages and how it operates. It is a definite time saver.

Surplus food distribution as you may know is now handled by the County. Applications are available or may be obtained at the monthly distribution. At that timeeligibility is determined and a certification to this extent is renewable every three months thereafter.

The State Planning and Development Commission has promised promotional help for Barnstead in acquiring a small business. Desirability of location, water supply, land value, tax rate, labor torce and many other items of concern were discussed with the state director in Barnstead last July 25th. There is much that the Town can do in this area to stimulate interest and promote a better climate for a business. In connection with this aid has been sought from the State Fire Marshall's office in an on site inspection of vacant buildings, which are in the immediate area of private homes and which are in their present condition fire hazards to the community. This is important relative to the protection of life and property from fire, fire hazards and related matters. Followed through, not only means protection for the

property owners near these structures but will do much to improve the value of their real estate, when these conditions are remedied.

More road signs will be made available and installed by the Department of Public Works when needed to guide the motorists and protect small children in areas where reduced speeds are necessary.

Union Telephone has agreed to look into the possibility of installing public telephones in the Lakes area at various places for the summer residents Now in case of fire or an emergency they are without this service.

Some consideration should be given in the immediate fututre for funds to start binding the old town records. They are in poor condition and in their present storage are continuing to deteriorate, some even now unlegible. These are important to you and the town and should be preserved.

Lastly, some general improvement has been noted in the growth of the community, about twenty new places went up in the last year with almost an equal number started. Few vacant properties remain for sale. With a lot of hard work and a little patience I am firmly convinced Barnstead's future will improve and reach new levels of accomplishment in planning and stimulation to bring a greater participation in the small business field. Your interest, cooperation and advice is needed.

TO THE PEOPLE OF BARNSTEAD, N. H.

I should like to explain some of the problems facing a Road Agent for the Town of Barnstead. Due to two letters I have received, as Road Agent, it seems to me that people do not like to face some of the facts that have been facing them for years. We are ready to complain and blame everyone else for things as they are but never want to go ahead ourselves to better them.

Take grading for instance. Some people expect the grader we now have, to grade clay, ledges, and rocks and still expect a road. As most of us know this grader is old and breaks maybe a little faster than one of the newer models and one that is built to do more than is expected of it. It is harder to keep these roads now than before, as we have more cars and went from 20 inch wheels to 14 inch. People never thought much of a rock in the road, but now they must be raked and picked up. As it stands now, you can grade and rake a road today, and one good shower and a few cars over it and the road is gone again.

The bushes is another problem. Before you have any roads these have to be cut. Cordwood and all, and a good bulldozer to widen them back where they were originally. To cut and spray and take care of the brush is going to cost money as usual.

People have said to me, "It seems funny that the money is all gone." By the time you keep, or try to keep, the roads plowed for you the way I am supposed to do, half of your money is gone. Then it is spring. When the mud starts and everyone wants the holes filled, not realizing that to fill one hole with a truck load of gravel, you have made many more holes. Therefore, by the time you have taken care of all the holes and washouts you have spent a few more thousand dollars. We have gained, I believe, by fixing two of the worse

places this year, Fred Merrill's hill and Larry's hill. It will save time in plowing and washouts. Since I have been your road agent, we have spent money and money fixing these places, and every year in the past they have never wanted to fix them right. So, if they are finished and the Beauty Hill road is done, we will save a lot of money, thus having it to spend on other roads.

Let's take what equipment that we have for sanding the roads. When I wanted the Town to buy two more sanders three (3) years ago, they told me they couldn't afford to. So I bought a second hand one myself. We have one old grader and two plows and That Is It, and the people want roads.

There seems to be a lot said about the night we had an icy condition and at 8:30 the Road Agent went bowling. This particular night, Edward Kelley, James Eastman and myself headed for North Barnstead, to do some sanding. At that time tt was approximately 15 degrees below zero. By the time we got loaded and got up by the church, the sand froze to the body of the truck. I almost hurt the two men that were on the back of the truck when the load shifted. I then thought how foolish it was to try to sand in the dark and the weather as cold as it was. Most people know that salt and sand doesn't amount to much when it is so cold. So we figuured we had done a full days work after sanding the bus route so the children could go to school. So we all took off for the bowling allies. Your Selectmen tried to find some to sand that night and found that it was impossible. How many men would go out under those conditions work and all day and all night too, for \$1.25 per hour?

We have all changed but some of us are trying to do things as they were done years ago and therefor it is going to take lots of money and time to bring these roads up to present day conditions. I have learned a few things since I have been in office, about the roads, the people and the way politics are run. I do believe that if we could run our town as we should. leaving our personal gripes out of it, and everyone help each other, that we could be a lot better off.

I think the Selectmen feel as though I have let you townspeople down and that there should be a change. If you people also think this way, then I am not the one to stand in the way and will step aside this coming year, hoping you will be more satisfied with the next man you put in office. I have tried my best to do the work that would help and benefit the people of Barnstead and I am sorry that it wasn't enough.


I do want you people to know, that as of January 7, 1961 your Road Agent received a letter from your Selectmen, stating that he was not to do any more work on the roads unless first told to do so by one or more of our Selectmen, because we are spending money not yet voted on.

I sincerely hope the people of Barnstead, with a lot of consideration and understanding of the cost of maintaining equipment and cost of everything pertaining to road building, can come up with an answer to improve our roads and our community in the future.

First- by setting a good example YOURSELF- being sensible and complying with the necessary laws and regulations governing fire in and near woodlands.

Second- by using YOUR individual influence in your community and valued council with others in insisting and encouraging them to do likewise.
