TOWN WARRANT

THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Bennington in the County of Hillsborough in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Bennington on Tuesday, the 9th day of March, next at ten of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.

2. To see what sum of money the Town will raise and appropriate for highways and bridges.

3. To see if the Town will vote to accept State Aid for Class V roads and raise and appropriate money for the same. The Town must raise \$349.29 and the State will contribute \$2,328.60.

4. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow such sums of money as may be necessary in anticipation of taxes.

5. To see what action the Town will take in regard to real estate purchased by the Town for non-payment of taxes.

6. To see if the Town will vote to transfer any balance in the Fire Department appropriation to a Capital Reserve Fund to be used toward the building of a new fire station. (Proposed by the Fire Department)

7. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$500.00 for purchase of hose by the Fire Department. (Proposed by the Fire Department)

8. To see if the Town will vote to amend the Bylaws of the Fire Department to provide that the minimum age for joining the department be reduced from 21 to 18. (Proposed by the Fire Department) 9. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$191.00 for the support of the Monadnock Family and Mental Health Service Clinic in Keene.

10. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$449.00 to support the services of the Monadnock Community Visiting Nurses Association, Inc.

11. To see if the Town will vote to adopt an ordinance requiring building permits and to authorize the Selectmen to appoint a building inspector. (Proposed by the Selectmen and Planning Board)

12. To see if the Town will vote to adopt an ordinance regulating the keeping of farm animals and poultry on small lots, or take any other action related thereto. (Proposed by the Selectmen and Planning Board)

13. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate \$1,000.00 to acquire land, options or easements, required for the construction of the proposed domestic sewage and industrial waste treatment facility or take any other action related thereto. (Proposed by the Selectmen and the Planning Board)

14. To see if the Town will authorize the appointment of a committee of four, appointed by the Moderator, who, together with the Board of Selectmen, would be authorized to execute a contract for the purchase of a new town truck and a new plow at a cost not to exceed \$15,000. Also to authorize the Selectmen to issue serial notes to fund this purchase. (Proposed by the Selectmen and the Budget Committee)

15. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$800.00 to enable the Water Department to install a shut-off valve on the water main on the Francestown Road. (Proposed by the Water Department)

16. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate to acquire certain land of Frank and Ardell Johnson situate in North Bennington to be used as the site for a solid waste disposal facility (Town Dump) or take any other action in relation thereto.

17. To see if the Town will vote to authorize a contract between the Town and the Town of Antrim for the creation and operation of a solid waste disposal facility (Town Dump), or take any action in relation thereto. (Proposed by the Selectmen and the Planning Board) 18. To see if the Town will (a) appropriate a sum of money for constructing sewers and sewerage facilities and a sewage treatment and waste disposal plant, (b) authorize a contract between the Town and the Town of Antrim relating to the construction and operation of such facilities and plant and the disposal of sewage or waste collected in the Town of Antrim, (c) authorize a contract between the Town and Monadnock Paper Mills, Inc., relating to its payment of a portion of the cost of construction and operation of such a plant, (d) authorize the selectmen to contract for federal or state aid in relation to such facilities and plant, (e) determine whether any appropriation under this article shall be raised by borrowing or otherwise, or (f) take any other action in relation to the foregoing.

19. To see what sum of money the Town will raise and appropriate for Statutory requirements and to carry the articles and appropriations of the School District into effect.

To transact any other business that may legally come before this meeting.

It will be proposed by the Board of Selectmen and Planning Board that the consideration of the articles on town sewage and the development of a joint dump with the Town of Antrim will be postponed to a Town Meeting at a later date. This will provide sufficient time to provide all the necessary information to the voters of the Town on both projects through the procedure of a public hearing or hearings devoted to a full explanation and review.

REPORT OF FOREST FIRE WARDEN AND DISTRICT CHIEF

The 1970 forest fire season was a quiet one in this area, quiet in part because of your continued cooperation and favorable weather conditions.

Fires that did occur were, for the most part, caused by debris burning, children and smokers.

The elimination of these three causes of forest fires would drastically change this picture-to bring about this change we make the following suggestions:

1. When the ground is not covered with snow a permit to burn must be obtained from the Forest Fire Warden. This permit covers waste burning, even if in an incinerator, grass burning, as well as garden trash and brush burning - such burning is restricted by regulation prior to 9:00 A.M. and after 5:00 P.M. with the following exceptions:

Commercial or Industrial burning is permissible at any time under normal conditions but only with the

approval of the District Chief and a written permit from the Forest Fire Warden.

- 2. Fires caused by children can be prevented only with' the complete cooperation of parents in the supervision of their children, keep matches out of reach of children, this action will help to prevent fires and may save a life, the life of your child. Try to explain this to your child, won't you?
- 3. Forest fires caused by smokers can be reduced in number by the exercise of more care in the discarding of matches and smoking material whether from a vehicle or by a hiker. In all cases, make sure that the butt or match you discard is out, dead out. Smokey says, "Thanks for your help", and invites you to join with him in setting a good example for others in the prevention of fires and the protection of our environment. REPORT OF THE PLANNING BOARD AND THE SELECTMEN Status and Recommendations on Current Major Projects

TOWN SEWAGE PROJECT

STATUS:

Final engineering now complete and now in process of review by the State Water Supply and Pollution Control Commission awaiting their approval.

Aid request forms have been filed and preliminary contacts made with the various Federal agencies involved.

Many meetings of the Bennington-Antrim Selectmen and Planning Boards have been held all fall and under guidance of Norman Makechnie and Douglas Hatfield, town counsel for the two towns, final draft agreements between Bennington and Antrim and between Bennington and the Paper Mill have been arrived at.

Arrangements have been made for the necessary easements and donation of land by Monadnock Paper Mills, Inc. Town counsel has in hand the arrangements for what few other easements will be required. A Fiscal Agent, the New England Merchants National Bank, has been selected to handle the necessary bond issues when the time comes. There is no financial obligation by the Town unless and until a bond issue is authorized and undertaken. However, it was recommended to us that the guidance of the bank's Bond Counsel, Palmer Dodge, would be very important in seeing that all necessary steps to authorize such bond issue were properly carried out.

The major unknown at the time of this writing is the availability and timing of State and Federal aid funds and we are in the process of holding meetings with the State and Federal officials in order to obtain a clearer understanding of this point.

At this writing we expect to include in the Warrant the recommended articles related to this project. However, it is the intention of the Selectmen and Planning Board to request that the Town Meeting defer consideration of such articles until a postponed Town Meeting at a later date.

It is the firm intention of the Selectmen and Planning Board not to ask for action on such articles until more definite information on the State and Federal aid status is available and only after having held a public hearing or hearings in which to review the project in depth and attempt to answer all questions.

The State of New Hampshire Official Order No. 1409 requiring abatement of pollution by July 18, 1970, has been extended to July 22, 1971, upon submission of evidence of our good faith efforts to comply with that order.

JOINT DUMP-BENNINGTON AND ANTRIM

Under the authority granted at the last Town Meeting, the Planning Board and the Selectmen have continued to work closely with Antrim and with town counsel for both towns in making arrangements for a joint town dump. A professional survey has been completed, approval obtained from the State Department of Public Health and they, in turn, have cleared this site with all of the other State agencies who are involved. Arrangements have been made to have the Department of Agriculture do a soil survey and analysis this spring which will serve as a basis for our planning for an entrance road and the specific areas where the earth-fill operation will be conducted.

It was originally our intention to arrange for a long term lease of this particular site and, after those arrangements had been made, to work out an agreement with Antrim providing for their use of the facility based upon an allocation of the expected operating costs. Upon completion of the survey data and as a result of preliminary negotiations with the owner and the conditions which they attached to the contemplated lease, it was decided by both representatives of Bennington and Antrim that it would be probably better to arrange to purchase the site — by negotiation, if possible; otherwise, by eminent domain. The site which it is intended to acquire represents a larger parcel of land than had been originally under discussion when it was expected that a lease would be arranged.

The Planning Board and Selectmen expect to include in the Warrant an article related to the purchase of this site. In view of the change in plans from the original intention to lease, the agreement regarding the use of this facility by Antrim has not been completed but a general agreement in principle of the wisdom of this approach has been arrived at.

BUILDING PERMIT ORDINANCE

As a follow-up to the sub-division ordinance which was adopted by the Town last year, the Planning Board will recommend the adoption of a building permit ordinance is intended to be of assistance to the Planning Board related to their having adequate notice of contemplated construction which would have a bearing upon the sub-division regulations and to assist the Selectmen in maintaining up-to-date records on building construction and additions related to their assessing duties.

ORDINANCE RELATED TO FARM ANIMALS

The Planning Board and the Selectmen have encountered considerable problems and there have been many complaints related to the housing of farm animals within the constricted areas of the Town. With advice and assistance of town counsel, it would be their intention to present to the voters an ordinance to solve such problems. Births Registered in the Town of Bennington, N. We include herewith in the Town Report a summary of the taxable property of the town. Where a Tax Credit of \$50.00 has been allowed to qualified veterans, we have so noted in the last column. In addition, as provided by the last session of the Legislature, there are assessment exemptions for those taxpayers over 65 who so qualify. The maximum exemptions available based upon the state definition that our assessments are at the rate of 44% true value works out to be \$2200 or the equivalent of \$5,000 of assessment exemption at Equalized Valuation. We have included these exemptions in this summary of assessments.

We have made every effort to provide an accurate record of the real estate ownership in Town including the acreage involved in each plot, but we realize that errors may have crept in since the last publication. In the event that any errors of listing are noted, we would appreciate it if they would be brought to our attention so that corrections can be made.
