You are hereby notified to meet at the Willis School House in said Dummer on Tuesday, the 5th of March, next at 7:30 of the clock in the evening to act upon the following subjects:

3. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for the maintenance of Town buildings and make appropriations of the same.
4. To see what sum of money the town will raise and appropriate for Social Security.
5. To see what action the Town will take toward fire protection and make appropriation for the same.
6. To see what action the Town will take toward paying for dump.
7. To raise and appropriate such sums of money as may be necessary for the repair of highways and bridges and bush cutting.
8. To raise and appropriate such sums of money as may be necessary for snow removal.
9. To raise and appropriate such sums of money as may be necessary for general expense of the Highway Department.
10. To see if the Town will vote to accept T.R.A. and make appropriation for the same.
11. To raise and appropriate such sums of money as may be necessary for the support of town libraries and new lighting system.
12. To raise and appropriate such sums of money as may be necessary for Town Poor.
13. To raise and appropriate such sums of money as may be necessary for the support of Welfare.
14. To see if the Town, with other towns in Coos County, will vote to support the North Country Community Services, Inc., and raise and appropriate \$187.00 as their share of the expense.
15. To raise and appropriate such sums of money as may be necessary for the maintenance of cemeteries.

16. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate any sum of money for the White Mountains Region Association and the N. H. Municipal Association.
17. To see what sum the Town will raise and appropriate for interest and notes.
18. To see if the Town will vote to give discount on taxes.
19. To see what action the Town will take towards raising money for the Town's share of the ambulance.
20. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the withdrawal from the Revenue Sharing Fund established under the provisions of the State and Local Assistance Act of 1972 for use as set-offs against budgeted appropriations for the following priority purposes and in amounts indicated or take any other action hereon:

REPORT OF DUMMER BICENTENNIAL

1773 – 1973

Fund raising events for the Bicentennial began months in advance of the actual celebration. Towns people joined in a fondue party, a real old fashioned box lunch, an adult variety show, "Memories" and a children's variety show. The theme of working together was thus started early in our preparations and continued until Dummer had settled back into normal routine.

The Dummer Bicentennial Celebration, held on July 14–15, was a huge success. The credit goes to the teamwork of the committees which was made up of nearly the entire town in one phase or another.

Thanks and appreciation to Raoul Gagnon for his donated labor and use of machinery in clearing the river bank where the canoe races finished; the landscaping at the Willis School where the large tents were placed; and certainly for digging the pit for baking the beans.

The parade with about 45 entries was enjoyed by an estimated crowd of 2,500 people, and the Bean Hole Supper on Saturday evening planned for about 800 people drew a crowd of more than 1,000.

An antique display (headed by Carlton Holt) in the Willis School was visited by hundreds of people.

A Hot Dog Concession gave everyone a chance for a snack both Saturday and Sunday.

The game tent was a popular spot with all of the children.

There were many participants in the log rolling contest, soap-box derby, and various other sports.

A dance was held at the West Milan Town Hall on Saturday evening with a full house, some couples danced in the street outside. Music was furnished by the Croteau family.

The souvenir committee provided the following for sale:

- 250 – Silver coins
- 650 – Bronze coins
- 100 – Ceramic Tile
- 700 – Cookbooks
- 1,000 – History books

A quilt made by several of the local ladies with family name embroidered on it and a muzzle loader with two bronze coins in the stock were raffled off.

The church service on Sunday, July 15, was broadcasted by George Lewis over Station W.M.O.U. The guest speaker was Rev. Richard Reynolds, a former pastor. Roland Sias, guest organist; soloist, Cheryl Hamlin Partain, both natives of the town, and soloist, Maynard Curtis of Hallowell, Maine.

It would be impossible to list all the people, time, and talents that were so willingly given to make our 200th Anniversary such a tremendous event. I wish on behalf of the Town of Dummer to say — Thank you.

1. To determine and appoint the salaries of the school board and the truant officer and fix the compensation of any other officers and agents of the District.
2. To hear the reports of agents, auditors, committees, or officers heretofore chosen and pass any vote relating thereto.
3. To see if the District will raise and appropriate \$2,000.00 and place said sum into the bus capital reserve fund.
4. To see if the District will vote to authorize the school board to make application for and to accept, on behalf of the District, any or all grants or other funds for educational purposes which may now or hereafter be forthcoming from the United States Government, the state of New Hampshire, private individuals or corporations or any Federal or State Agency and to expend the same for such projects as it may designate.
5. To see if the District will vote pursuant to RSA 31:105 to provide indemnification for district employees, school administrators, school board members, district officers or agents from personal loss or expense including reasonable legal fees and costs, if any, arising out of any claim, demand, suit or judgment by reason of negligence or other act resulting in accidental injury to a person or accidental damage to property providing the indemnified person was at the time of the accident acting within the scope of his employment or office.
6. To see if the District will establish a committee of three to review the AREA plan with Berlin for the purpose of amending same, said committee to be appointed by the school board (or moderator) and report its findings and recommendations to the next annual meeting (or at a special meeting duly called).
7. To see what action the District will take in appointing a cooperative school district planning committee of three voters, including a member of the school board, two of whom shall be appointed by the moderator and one of whom shall be appointed by the school board, to work with a similar committee

appointed by the Milan School District, to study the feasibility of forming a cooperative school district in accordance with RSA Chapter 195 as amended by Laws of 1955, chapter 334; and to prepare a report to be presented to the voters at either a special meeting or at the next annual school district meeting or subsequent school district meetings thereafter.

8. To see what sum of money the district will vote to raise and appropriate for the support of schools, for the payment of salaries or school district officials and agents and for the payment of the statutory obligations of the district.
9. To transact any other business that may legally come before this meeting.

Report of the Superintendent

To the Citizens of the Town of Dummer:

My report is an attempt on my part to keep you informed of what has happened during the current year as well as to bring to your attention the problems which face or will face you and your school board in the coming year. Though I am sure my report will not cover all events, it will cover the essential ones.

School Warrant

Your school warrant this year has three articles which need your attention and on which some decision will have to be made.

Article No. 5 is new this year. The bill authorizing such an article was passed in the last session of the legislature and provides each community an opportunity to protect the agents of the town from personal legal responsibility for decisions they make as agents of the town. It in no way protects anyone from some illegal act they may have committed. In such cases they would bear legal responsibility for their actions like anyone else. On the other hand if one were to carry out his duties in a responsible fashion and someone wished to bring legal suit against him, if this article is passed, Dummer would be responsible for paying all legal expenses of the individual involved.

Article No. 6 on your warrant would establish a committee to meet with Berlin for the purposes of amending the AREA agreement. As the agreement may not be amended until it has been in force for 5 years, whatever changes would be made could not take effect until September, 1975.

Under this article two areas would have to be looked into. The first would be the grade arrangement in Berlin. Presently, grade 9 is part of the junior high school but because of the AREA agreement we must pay the high school tuition rate for those students. On the other hand if this were changed to 7 & 8 or 7-9 whichever grade arrangement prevailed at the time, we could pay the lesser rate for students in grade 9.

The second area which would need to be looked into would be the Milan-Dummer Cooperative School if such were to take place. In this case a change would have to be made to include only grades 7-12 and special education students. In either case a change would have to be made to allow Dummer to join a two town cooperative district were this to be the decision of the people.

Article No. 7 relates to the questionnaire which was sent out on the question of a two town cooperative school. This article would merely set up a committee to study the idea and bring a report back to the people. There would be no commitments on the part of either town to approve joining in such a venture.

As of the date of this writing there have been less than 75 of some 400 questionnaires returned. This is most unfortunate as the intent of the questionnaire was to determine the interest of the people in looking at something other than what is being done now. The study would perhaps prove nothing but it would at least give people enough information on which a decision could be made.

Tuition

The cost of tuitioning your children to Berlin continue to increase. To illustrate this point one has to but look at the following chart to see what has happened during the past 5 years:

Over the past 6 years you will find that the tuition costs for elementary children has risen 61.3%, for junior high students 114.7%, and for senior high students 53.4%. These figures represent large increases for a period of just six years.

Just as important as tuition rates is the number of students who will be attending the Berlin Schools. This year we budgeted for those students who were in town or expected to be in town. The final figure of students who actually reported to school in the fall of 1973 was far less than we anticipated. Again this coming fall, however, we are planning for the students who are in town now or who are expected to be in town by fall. The chart which follows illustrates the point quite clearly:

In the current year and in the coming year we seem to have a fairly stable tuition group. As long as this would remain your cost would not increase substantially. However, the school census shows some fairly large classes coming up which could enlarge your total tuition list to nearly 100 students. Were this to happen, your total tuition bill would be extremely high.

Budget

The proposed budget for 1974-75 shows an increase of only \$565.94 over 1973-74 on the gross budget. This is perhaps the smallest increase in the school budget during my tenure of 3 years in Dummer.

The significant part of this year's budget is the net budget. This shows a reduction of \$9,414.51 from a year ago. The reduction was caused by fewer tuition students attending Berlin Schools this year. The resulting savings to be realized will substantially reduce the amount to be raised in the coming year.

Summary

Perhaps the most important action you will be required to take this year will be on Article 7. Your decision itself will not guarantee that anything will change. It will however, provide an opportunity to look at another alternative, perhaps the last time such an opportunity will be available, to look at some other way of providing for the education of your children.

In closing, I wish to extend my thanks to the Dummer School Board, the district officers, the bus driver as well as the voters of Dummer for their support during the past year.
