THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE
TOWN WARRANT

To the inhabitants of the Town of Epsom in the County of Merrimack in said State, qualified to vote in town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Epsom on Tuesday the eleventh day of March, next at ten of the clock in the forenoon until six of the clock in the afternoon to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.

2. To see what action the town will take upon the budget submitted by the Budget Committee.

3. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$765.06 for the maintenance, construction or reconstruction of Class V Highways, the State to contribute \$5,100.40 as provided in Chapter 83, Laws of 1953.

4. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow such sums of money as may be necessary in anticipation of taxes.

5. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to distribute the inventory blanks at the time of taking the Annual Inventory.

6. Pursuant to the Provisions of the Laws as revised, Chapter 292, Section 7, 1949. The following Article is submitted: Shall the Provision of Chapter 171-A of the Revised Laws relative to playing games of Beano be adopted in this Town?

7. To see if the Town of Epsom will vote to place the responsibility of Town Road construction, reconstruction and maintenance in the hands of the Select-

men, who shall appoint a responsible and competent person to perform the duties now performed by two Road Agents. (By Petition)

8. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to appoint a Chief of Police and necessary Special Officers. (By petition)

9. To see if the Town will vote to transact all Articles of business contained in the Warrant except those Articles appearing on the Warrant and voted upon by ballot at an evening meeting commencing at 7:00 P.M. on the day set for the Annual Town Meeting. (By Petition)

10. To see what action the Town wishes to take in regard to erecting road name signs at the entrances to all roads.

11. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money for the Concord Hospital to help offset an estimated operating deficit for the year 1958.

12. To transact any other business that may be legally brought before this meeting.

REPORT OF EPSOM VOLUNTEER
FIRE DEPARTMENT

For Year Ending Dec. 31, 1957

Following is submitted the annual report of the Epsom Volunteer Fire Department.

There were the usual run of small fires, with no damage great enough to report.

A few chimneys burned out with no damage. There were two forest fires which were the main expense of our 1957 fires. I would like to remark that we are badly in need of some forest fire tools.

I want to thank all firemen and citizens for helping to keep our fire loss at such a low level. We are repaid for so doing, not only in saving the expense of the fires but in insurance reductions. Any community with a continual heavy fire loss is a poor risk.

Rather than repeat my reports of previous years, I ask that all citizens read the fire report in your Town Report for the past several years (1956 in particular), and learn how *you* can keep the fire loss down. Learn the fire dangers, how to call the Fire Department and how the Fire Department can help you with your safety problems.

This is your Department and is as efficient as you make it.

FOREST FIRE PREVENTION IS EVERYBODY'S BUSINESS

New Hampshire faces a continuing challenge in its forest fire problem — 97 percent of all our forest fires being man-caused and preventable — a serious indictment of interest in our own welfare and that of our neighbor. Both the State and the towns are striving diligently to effectively meet the challenge through education of the public to the threat fire presents to our woodlands; by maintaining a well trained corps of wardens and deputy wardens in every community and by providing ample opportunity for all who wish to dispose of unwanted waste materials. Careless and perverseness, however, continue to be the big hurdles.

Thoughtlessly discarded lighted cigars, cigarettes and matches from moving vehicles, by hikers, hunters and fishermen; careless burning of debris during hazardous periods in dangerous locations; illegal burning; improperly extinguished debris, camp and cook fires — all result in serious loss of property, disruption of industry and farm work and unnecessary expenditure of town and state funds.

To meet the challenge successfully, the state, your community and your local forest fire warden need **YOUR** thoughtful and cooperative effort — The rules are simple.

1. Don't burn at home — use your town dump and avoid all fire problems.
2. If you do burn, be sure to secure a written permit from your local forest fire warden when the ground is not covered with snow. Permits are required for open debris fires, home incinerators, outdoor fireplaces and camp fires. Your warden is instructed to permit burning if weather conditions, site and type of burning are safe.

3. Be sure that all lighted material — cigars, cigarettes and matches — are completely out before discarding them. Use ash trays in automobiles.
4. Make certain that your debris, camp and cook fires are completely out before leaving them.
5. Insist that others be careful and comply with burning requirements.
6. Call the warden promptly when fire is detected and aid him to extinguish it.

Remember — the fire you prevent might be the one which could burn YOUR property.

3. To choose a Member of the School Board for the ensuing three years.
4. To choose a Treasurer for the ensuing year.
5. To determine and appoint the salaries of the School Board and Truant Officer, and fix the compensation of any other officers or agent of the district.
6. To hear the reports of Agents, Auditors, Committees, or Officers chosen, and pass any vote relating thereto.
7. To choose Agents, Auditors and Committees in relation to any subject embraced in this warrant.
8. To see if the district will vote to adopt a plan for extending to employees of the school district the benefits of title II of the Federal Social Security Act (Old Age and Survivor's Insurance) as authorized by Chapter 101 of the Revised Statutes Annotated Amended by Chapters 301 and 332 of the Laws of 1955.
