We have examined the accounts of the Selectmen, Town Clerk, Town Treasurer, Tax Collector, Road Agent, Electric Light Commissioners, Water Commissioners, Treasurer of the Common Fund, Trustees of Trust Funds, Library Trustees, Overseer of the Poor, and Old Home Day Committee, and have found them correctly cast and properly vouched. **REPORT OF THE SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS
TO THE HANCOCK SCHOOL BOARD**

The rearrangement of the supervisory unions of the state, in the spring of 1934, brought about the transfer of three towns formerly in Union No. 47 to other unions, leaving Dublin, Hancock, and Peterborough to be associated with Jaffrey, Rindge, and Sharon.

While we regretted the break-up of former ties, I certainly appreciate keenly the support given me as a candidate for the re-organized union, and the pleasant relations that have existed since becoming officially connected with the Hancock schools last July.

No changes were made in the teaching positions of the district for the present school year.

In the upper grades of the grammar school, achievement tests have been given and the necessary follow-up work carried on.

Careful drill in the fundamentals in the lower grades is showing the progress that we have a right to expect.

The work in the high school, under the capable leadership of Miss Manchester, has been very satisfactory. Few schools of its size have the educational opportunities offered by the Hancock High School.

I desire to commend the loyalty of the teaching force of Hancock, and to express my appreciation of the co-operation of the School Board.
