TOWN WARRANT

THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Hebron, in the County of Grafton in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Hebron Community Hall on Tuesday, the twelfth of March next at nine of the clock in the forenoon to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To choose all Town Officers for the year ensuing.
- 2. To see what sums of money the Town will raise and appropriate for the ensuing year for expenditures enumerated in the proposed budget appearing in the Town Report. Copy of the budget is attached to the posted Warrant.
- 3. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.
- 4. To see if the Town will vote to give two per cent cash discount on taxes if paid thirty days from date of tax bill.
- 5. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to sell property bought by the Town at Tax Sale.
- 6. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate \$100.00 for the Hebron and Groton Athletic Association.

7-a. To see if the Town will vote to adopt a plan for extending to employees of the Town the benefits of title II of the Federal Social Security Act (Old Age and Survivor's Insurance) as authorized by Chapter 101 of the Revised Statutes Annotated Amended by Chapters 301 and 332 of the Laws of 1955 and to raise and appropriate the sum of \$65.00 to defray the town's share of the cost thereof.

7-b. To see if the Town wishes to exclude from the plan services in any class or classes of positions filled by popular election.

7-c. To see if the Town wishes to exclude from the plan services in any class or classes of positions the compensation for which is on a fee basis.

- 7-d. If a plan for Social Security coverage is adopted, to see if the Town will authorize the selectmen to execute on behalf of the Town the necessary agreement with the State of New Hampshire to carry into effect the plan and to see if the Town will designate the Treasurer as the officer to be responsible for the administration of the plan.
- 8. To see what action the Town wishes to take in the matter of snow removal from town roads and/or dooryards. The present five year contract expires May 1, 1957.
- 9. To transact any other business that may legally come before the meeting.

Other articles may be added before the Warran't is posted.

REPORT OF STATE HEALTH OFFICER

The following is a report of the activities carried on for your town by the N. H. Department of Health, Bureau Public Health Nursing, for the year 1956.

The children of Hebron were included in the Salk Vaccine program for protection against poliomyelitis in the clinics held at Plymouth in January, July, October and November, 1956.

A total of about 25 children, between the ages of six months and 20 years completed two shots of the vaccine. The children who received their first shots with the October, 1955, group received their third or booster shots at the November clinic. There were three in this group. The children of High School age were given shots at the High Schools where they attended. A little better than 80 percent of eligible children in the community took advantage of this program.

I wish to express my thanks to Mrs. Williams, the School Nurse, members of the school personnel and any who furnished transportation or assisted in any way to make this available to the Hebron children.

Home visits have also been made on infants, preschool children and mothers, and assistance given where necessary.

At this writing it seems that Hebron will again need to meet a small deficiency of approximately \$200. This is due to an increase in the cost of transportation of somewhat more than this figure. In a small school district budget it is impossible to have much leeway nor is it too desirable. Yet when items are figured on actual needs deficiencies will be quite common due to new pupils attending high school, increases in transportation, or emergency repairs. We all know that costs of operating a car have increased materially in the past few years and everything points to more of the same in the years to come. Your understanding of these problems in the past has been appreciated.
