TOWN WARRANT

STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Meredith, qualified to vote in town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said town on Tuesday, the 13th day of March, 1945, at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To bring in your ballots for Town Clerk, one Selectman for one year, one Selectman for three years, Treasurer, Collector of Taxes, Chief of Police, Traffic Officer, one Trustee of Trust Funds for three years, two Library Trustees for three years, and a Road Agent.
2. To choose all other necessary Town Officers.
3. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.
4. To hear the report of the Budget Committee and act thereon.

5. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate towards defraying the expense of Memorial Day and specify how same shall be expended.
6. To raise such sums of money as will be necessary for the repairs of Highways and Bridges.
7. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for General Highway Expenses.
8. To see what sums of money the Town will vote to raise toward the eradicating of White Pine Blister Rust. (By request).
9. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise toward defraying expenses of the Town Library.
10. To see if the Town will vote to raise \$402.10 for Town Road Aid, provided the State will contribute \$1,608.38.
11. To see if the Town will raise \$2,012.32 to be set aside for future construction of Parade, Pease, Oak Hill Road, provided the State will set aside \$4,024.64 for this purpose.
12. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise toward the support of the Public Health Nurse.

13. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise for the benefit of the Laconia Hospital.

14. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate toward the support of the Fire Department.

15. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$295.00 to the Lakes Region Association which is (1-100 of 1%) one one-hundredth of one per cent, of the assessed valuation, for the purpose of publicizing and promoting the natural advantages and resources of the town, together with other towns in the Lakes Region. (By request).

16. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of \$500.00 to lower the grade for permanent improvement on Robinson Hill in the west end of the Town. (By Request).

17. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate \$1,500. for improving Packard Hill on the Meadowbrook Road. (By request).

18. To see what action the Town will take relative to the leasing of the Town Hall.

19. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for the payment of Old Age Assistance and for the benefit of indigent persons chargeable to the Town of Meredith.

20. To see if the Town will vote to raise \$300.00 to defray the expenses of Band Concerts for the season of 1945. (By request)

21. To see what sum the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the purpose of establishing a Capital Reserve Fund to be used for future construction of a fire station by the Town and Fire District.

22. To see if the Town will vote to support United States membership in a general system of international cooperation, such as that proposed at the Dumbarton Oaks conference, having police power to maintain the peace of the world. (By request)

23. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

FOREST FIRE SERVICE

My first year as forest fire warden is complete and I appreciate the support and cooperation I received which in turn kept the fire loss very low.

The big factor was the issue of burning permits which could only be granted this year on rainy days and the manner in which the permittees handled their respective fires. Also the constant cooperation of the look-out towers covering our territory.

Over one hundred permits were granted this past season and only nine alarms in for forest fires with a cost of \$201.85 of which part was paid by one or more parties who failed to get a permit. Right here should be mentioned that forest fires of which the cause cannot be put onto an individual, that is unlawful fire, the expense is born equally by the Town and the State.

It should be of interest to know the amount of forest fire equipment we have available here to combat fires when they break out; there is very little left to be needed in the line of small tools. Some day we would like to make up a forest fire truck and possibly a few more tool boxes. The equipment includes:

35 Knapsack pumps	17 Lanterns
25 Shovels	36 Waterpails
12 Fire rakes	4 Canteens
18 Hazel hoes	3 Tool boxes
18 Pulaski tools	1 Water bag
15 Axes	10 Garden rakes
2 Cross cut saws	2 Saw wedges

This is supplemented by our regular equipment on our trucks and trailers. These small tools are bought on a fifty-fifty proposition with the State Forest Fire Prevention Service.

ANOTHER ENEMY TO CONQUER

Here is a home front fight that everyone can get into. Last year in this State 558 brush and forest fires burned over 4,648 acres of land, of which 2,788 acres were valuable timber and young growth. With available man power the lowest of any year since the war started, you can help to keep this loss down by preventing these fires from starting.

Keep in mind these simple rules:

1. Always get a permit from your forest fire warden before starting any fires in the open. Burning under certain conditions is permitted.

2. Never burn unless you have enough help to control your fire—a permit does not excuse you of negligence in case it gets away.

3. Always report any uncontrolled fire promptly to your forest fire warden. Minutes lost are acres lost.

4. Be especially careful with cigarettes, matches and pipes. Smokers caused most of our fires.

5. Never leave a fire unless it is dead out. You can't feel safe while there is a spark left.

REPORT OF SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

In days like these, it is necessary for education, like industry and other phases of civilization, to do more than mark time or just keep going at a traditional rate. We must work fast, or be accused of providing opportunities that are "too little and too late." The great difficulty lies in perceiving the proper direction in which to move, and in avoiding steps which represent wasted motion or costly mistakes.

Better health of school children is one aim of unquestioned worth. Our school lunch program, providing nutritious noon meals at low cost, is proving its value in better attendance and more effective learning. By taking advantage of Federal funds, the cost to pupils and community is kept at a minimum. The emphasis on physical education, which is now a required part of the high school curriculum, is another valuable feature of our present program. This work should also be emphasized in the elementary grades.

Our course in mechanic arts, consisting almost entirely of woodworking, is handicapped by lack of space. Machines are already being made available for schools—surplus equipment not needed for the war effort—but these would be of no use to us without a place to put them. Lack of room and equipment is also a factor in relation to a course in typewriting, which should be a part of our curriculum.

For years, at the high school building, there has been no suitable place for a pupil to be made comfortable if taken ill at school. In an effort to provide suitable accommodations for such an emergency, the School Board has made available the room on the first floor formerly used for the superintendent's office. This makes a very satisfactory teachers' and nurse's room, and fills a long

felt need. The superintendent's office is now located in the Chase Block, opposite the library; the rental expense of the place being shared by Meredith and the other five school districts in the supervisory union.

Along with our plans for an improved curriculum, better accommodations, and modern equipment, we must bear in mind that much of the time we must carry on "business as usual" in our classrooms. The strain and worry of war, which affects almost every family, should have sole antidote as far as our children are concerned; and they should be entitled to normal play, normal growth, and a fundamentally sound background of character and knowledge.

This means, first, that the schools must provide opportunity for children to serve and to develop responsibility. Many such activities are carried on today. A "Bundle Day" last October provided, from the six districts of this supervisory union, nearly a ton of used clothing for needy children here and abroad. The milkweed pod collection, providing floss intended for sailors' life jackets, netted over \$90 worth at 20c a bag, all schools in the union doing their share. Many pupils from time to time write letters to service men, buy war stamps and bonds, and do their share in many other ways.

In the second place, the schools must keep up the standards of basic education. Soldiers need to read and write accurately or they will misinterpret orders. The multiplication table is more necessary than ever, as mathematics is the basis of so many military calculations. In this real sense, "business as usual", meaning stress on the old-fashioned fundamentals, is vitally important.

As a third point, the school and home together should strive to keep the emotional stress of war from spoiling the childhood of our boys and girls. The children cannot help being conscious of the presence of anxiety in their home or on the part of the teacher. But laugh-

ter play, rest, and freedom from fear are as necessary for normal growth, as are study, work and responsibility.

Finally, it has been said that the foreign policy of a nation is made in the nursery. A child who is taught, at the age of four, not to pick on a younger or weaker playmate, is less apt to favor imperialistic domination by his government when he is forty. Just as we are learning now to wage war, we must learn—beginning now—to wage peace. Our children as well as adults need to be interested in and informed about world affairs. Only by intelligent effort shall war be eliminated from the earth, the sea, and the air.

REPORT OF HEADMASTER

To the Superintendent of Schools, the Board of Education, and the Citizens of Meredith:

The teachers and pupils of Meredith High School join me in appreciation of your constant support and your enthusiastic interest in our welfare and activities.

Twenty-one seniors graduated last year. Of these, three are in the Army, Royce Moulton, Francis Racine, and Wilmont White; Philip Davis, Kenneth Lang and John Humiston are in the Navy; Richard Higgins and Nancy Manson are Freshmen at the University of New Hampshire and Clara Chandler is a Freshman at the Keene Teachers' College; Louva Batchelder, Corinne Ramsdell and Mary Swinnerton are Cadet Nurses; Maude Horne, Frances Perkins, Marguerite Prescott and Marjorie Smith are in business college. The others are employed.

The outstanding development of the past year was the creation of a recreation room out of the balcony of the gymnasium. The growth of the 'teen age "canteen" in various parts of the country has attracted widespread attention, and is credited as one of the most effective means of preventing juvenile delinquency. The High School Club Room has been visited by many educators and others who have expressed high admiration for the arrangement and the conduct of the club. Credit for the development of the project goes to the Girls' Athletic Club under the sponsorship of Mrs. Jane Ambrose, Director of Girls' Physical Education. All alterations were made by the boys and girls, articles of furniture were contributed by friends in the community, and other articles needed were constructed in the school shop. The club was open one evening each week last year for senior high pupils, and during the current year

it is open a second evening for use by junior high pupils.

Rules of conduct for members of the club were made by the pupils. One boy and one girl each night act as host and hostess. One teacher is present each evening the club is open. Recreation consists of chess, bridge, checkers, cribbage, ping pong, volley ball and dancing. A reading corner is well supplied with books and magazines. Come in some Wednesday evening and see what a fine club your boys and girls are conducting.

Sales of war bonds and stamps last year amounted to \$6120.25, nearly three times the total for the previous year. For the current year to December 19, 1944 sales totalled \$4225.65. These totals represent sales in both the high school and the Lang Street school.

Registration was maintained at about the same level as for the previous year. No change was made in the curriculum as the inclusion of another year of mathematics and a year of Aeronautics provided four years of mathematics and of science available to all pupils. As in the past two years pupils participated in the harvesting of crops, although the demand for such help was slightly less.

The shop classes show a registration of 46 boys and the home economics classes 35 girls with an additional 25 girls of the seventh and eighth grades.

The Annual H. Stewart Bosson Junior Prize Speaking Contest was held March 14, 1944. First prize for dramatic selection was awarded to Laura Wilkins and first prize for humorous selection to Charles Cowing. These prizes of gold pins were provided by Mrs. Bosson who generously continues the support of this contest which was originally sponsored by Mr. Bosson.

Under the direction of Music Supervisor Donald Musgrove the school band has been making fine contributions to basketball games and other school activities. A Girls' Glee Club of 44 members and a Boys' Glee Club of 14 members meet regularly under Mr. Mus-

grove's direction. Aaron Barnard, a former member of the band and now in the U. S. Navy has loaned his bass horn to the school. We appreciate his thoughtfulness and generosity.

Physical education classes are in session four times each week. Military authorities and health specialists, pointing to the high percent of young men found unfit for military service, urge all high schools to provide the best possible physical training as the most effective means of improving the health and physical stamina of young men and women. Every boy in high school, upon graduation, faces the prospects of induction into the armed forces. Boys who have the opportunity presented by a well conducted physical education course and participation in supervised athletics have a great advantage when subjected to the severe physical regimen of military basic training. The urgent call upon young women to contribute to the national effort makes it essential that our girls, upon graduation, should be strong and sturdy. Full participation in the physical education classes makes it essential that every boy and girl be equipped properly with sneakers and gym suit and that towels be provided that a shower may be taken after each class to prevent the catching of colds. All parents are urged to see that high school pupils coming from their homes are properly equipped in this respect.

The twentieth annual meeting of the Alumni Association was held in the Grange Hall, June 15. The Alumni Loyalty Cup was awarded to Clara Chandler. The following officers were elected: Pres., Bradbury Sprague; Vice President, Victorine Ambrose; Secretary, Frances Plummer; Treasurer, Mrs. Robert Maloney; Auditor, Sedley Bartlett.
