To the inhabitants of the Town of Milan, in the County of Coos, in said State, qualified to vote in town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at K. of P. hall at West Milan in said town on Tuesday the 8th day of March, next, at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary town officers for the ensuing year.
2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year, and make appropriations for the same.
3. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for the repairs of highways and bridges for the ensuing year.
4. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for breaking roads winter of 1927 and 1928.
5. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for Trunk Line Construction.
6. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for Trunk Line Maintenance.
7. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for State Aid Maintenance.
8. To see if the town will vote to raise \$700.00 extra money to gravel the road over Milan Hill, summer of 1927.
9. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for Memorial Day and appropriate the same to the Grand Army.
10. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the purchase of books and supplies for the Public Library.
11. To choose by ballot one Trustee of Cemetery Trust Fund for three years.
12. To choose one trustee for Public Library for three years.
13. To see if the town will vote to accept State Aid on the Androscoggin Bridge at Milan.
14. To see if the town will vote to accept the provisions of Chapter 87, Section 1, of the Revised Statutes, on a section of the Berlin-West Milan road, so-called, and appropriate, or set aside

from the amount raised for highway work the sum of \$150.00 for this purpose.

15. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the Muzzy Hill special cut-off.

16. To see if the town will vote to discontinue the road from Harrison Lang's to the Higgins place.

17. To see if the town will vote to discontinue the road from Frank Hart's at West Milan to the Jack Lary place.

School Superintendent's Report

Milan, N. H., Feb. 1, 1927

School Board and Citizens of Milan, N. H.

Gentlemen:—

I herewith submit the annual report of the Superintendent of Schools. The statistical report covers the year July 1, 1925 to June 30, 1926 and the general report to Feb. 1, 1927.

At the beginning of the year Miss Natalie Corkum was transferred to the Jewett school, Miss B. Marion Brooks having resigned her position to accept one in another town and Mrs. Clara Egan was appointed teacher at the Milan Hill school. During the present year Mrs. Eunice Thurston resigned as teacher at the Hodgdon Hill school and Mrs. Addie I. Rounds was appointed to fill her position for the balance of the year. These are the only changes since the last report.

During the summer numerous repairs were made. The Hamlin school was painted on the outside and kalsomined on the inside. The Jewett, Milan Village, West Milan, and Milan Hill school rooms were kalsomined. At the Milan Hill school an indoor passage was made from the schoolroom to shed. The school properties are now all in good condition.

During the year special effort has been made to encourage pupils to read at home. After all, the true test of reading is whether children learn to read for their own pleasure and instruction. To this end most of your schools have had available Travelling Libraries from the Public Library Commission of Concord, and the scholars have responded very satisfactorily. It is hoped that the habit of reading good books will become well grounded in school days and continue throughout life. While oral reading has not been neglected, silent reading has received considerable emphasis, for a major part of reading in life is silent.

Arithmetic Standard Tests have been given throughout the system. These have been of material assistance in locating individual differences and in checking our progress with that of schools throughout the country. The Superintendent has also given general achievement tests to a good many pupils and has

had personal conferences with the scholars and teachers. While the judgment of teachers must be given considerable weight as they are in personal contact with the scholars every day, we must see that our children are broadening and securing knowledge and ability to express themselves in daily contacts of the world as well as in the classroom. Your schools are striving to do this, and are more and more successful each year.

Finally, I wish to add one statement relative to medical supervision. The response to the medical examiner's notices of pupils needing treatment has been fair, but there are undoubtedly a considerable number of young people doing mediocre and poor work who could compete successfully with their classmates if certain minor defects as teeth, tonsils, etc., were remedied. The best supervision, teaching, and text-books cannot overcome the handicap of physical discomfiture.

I wish to take this opportunity to express my appreciation of the cooperation of the school board, citizens, parents and scholars. It is a pleasure and privilege to work in such a harmonious atmosphere.
