#### THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Rumney in the County of Grafton in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Rumney on Tuesday, the sixth day of March next, at two o'clock in the afternoon, at which time the polls shall be opened and shall close not earlier than seven-thirty in the afternoon, to act upon the following articles; all articles not on the ballot will be acted upon at seven-thirty in the evening.

- 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the ensuing year.
- 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and to make appropriation of the same.
- 3. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the maintenance of its highways and bridges.
- 4. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the maintenance of the Library.
- 5. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the care of the Cemeteries.
- 6. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the Fire Department.
- 7. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the care of the Common.
- 8. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Memorial Day and other patriotic purposes.
- 9. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Street Lights.

- 10. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the Care of the Dump.
- 11. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate \$512.41 to secure from the State \$3,416.08 for Town Road Aid.
- 12. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Civil Defense.
- 13. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$739.00 for the Pemi-Baker Home Health Agency, Inc.
- 14. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Ambulance Service.
- 15. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$100.00 for the New Hampshire Humane Society.
- 16. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to use \$3,437.97 of the Highway Equipment Capital Reserve Fund towards the purchase of a new truck and appropriate a sum sufficient to pay any balance, and also authorize the Selectmen to sell or trade in the present highway truck.
- 17. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$653.00 for the Lakes Region Mental Health Center, Inc.
- 18. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate to paint the Town Hall.
- 19. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the use of the Planning Board.
- 20. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$100.00 for the Conservation Committee.
- 21. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the preparation of a Town Tax Map.
- 22. To see if the Town will vote to authorize withdrawal from the Revenue Sharing Fund established under the provisions of the State and Local Assistance Act of 1972 for use as set-offs against appropriations in the amount indicated.

- 23. To see if the Town will vote to accept a parcel of land with buildings thereon as a gift from Rumney Grange #188, known as Rumney Grange Hall, the Grange reserving the right to use an appropriate part for Grange needs without charge.
- 24. To see if the Town will vote to construct a fire house at Rumney Depot and see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the construction of same.
- 25. To see if the Town will vote to borrow a sum of money not to exceed \$35,000.00 through the issuance of a note or notes of the Town in accordance with the N. H. Municipal Finance Act, towards the construction of the Fire House under Article #24.
- 26. To see if the Town will vote to amend the Rumney Mobile Home Park Ordinance of March 10, 1970, by amending Paragraph C, subparagraph 3, to read as follows:
- "A mobile home lot shall be completely developed before occupancy is permitted. The minimum size of any lot shall be 20,000 square feet, and all lots shall be at least 100 feet in width at any point. Any mobile home, or enclosed accessory structure attached thereto, shall be installed so that there is at least 40 feet between said home or structure to another adjacent mobile home or structure. No mobile home or structure shall be located closer than 20 feet to any lot line boundary, or closer than 25 feet to a paved street, access road, or service building within the mobile home park."
- 27. To see if the Town will vote to discontinue the old North Groton Road Bridge over Hall Brook and the North Groton Road from the northeasterly end of the bridge to its intersection with the new North Groton Road at the Rumney-Groton town line. (By request.)
- 28. To see if the Town will vote to adopt the following regulations: It shall be unlawful for the owner or keeper of any dog in the Town of Rumney to permit such dog to run at large on the public highways in said town or on the land of any person without the permission of the owner or occupant of said land. Except for the use of hunting coon, upland game, rabbits, bear, or bobcat, under supervision of the owner. Anyone violating this resolution shall be subject to a fine not exceeding ten dollars (\$10.00.) (By Petition.)

- 29. To see if the Town will vote to designate the East Rumney Road from Quincy Road to Campton-Rumney town line, as scenic under the provisions of RSA 253:17 and 18, for the purpose of protecting and enhancing the scenic beauty of Rumney and, further, that the Selectmen of said Rumney, shall, regarding such road or roads designated as scenic, file the appropriate request for suspension of specifications when making application to the Commissioner of PublicWorks and Highways for Town Road Aid funds under RSA 241:7 (L) (By Petition.)
- 30. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to administer, lease, rent, sell or otherwise dispose of any real estate or mineral rights acquired by the Town at any of its Tax Collector's sales.
- 31. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.
- 32. Shall the provisions of Chapter 171-A of the Revised Laws relative to playing Beano be adopted in this town.
- 33. To hear the reports of Agents, Auditors, and Committees heretofore chosen and to pass any vote relating thereto and to transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting. Given under our hands and seal, this 14th day of February, in the year of our Lord, nineteen hundred and seventy-three.

### FOUNTAIN COMMITTEE REPORT

The Committee met with the Selectmen and found we had \$410.00 to work with. We investigated the possibility of repairing the old fountain. Missing parts and exorbitant repair costs prevented our being able to restore the old fountain. We wrote to three fountain dealers for catalogs of fountains similar to the old one and the prices ranged from \$1,750.00 to \$4,000.00, which eliminated this possibility.

A contribution of \$100.00 was received toward the fountain. Agreeing that others might wish to contribute, we published a notice asking for contributions. Receiving no replies, we decided to see what we could do with the amount we had to work with.

In contacting public spirited townspeople we were fortunate. Robert Morton has designed a fountain, Luther Packard consented to do the plumbing, and Roy Lyford the cementing and painting of the present bricked basin. We feel the final design will enhance the beauty of our Common, and cost within our limit of funds. A sketch of the fountain we recommend will be on display at the Town Hall for your consideration.

It is our opinion that not only for economy's sake, but for the practicality of maintenance and the simplicity of design, that this water cascade will help restore our Common to a place we can all admire.

With your consent, we are willing to continue as a committee and complete this project.

### REPORT of the FOREST FIRE WARDEN and DISTRICT CHIEF

In New Hampshire, forest fire control is a cooperative State-town program. The Town Forest Fire Warden, appointed by the Director, Division of Resources Development upon recommendation of the Selectmen and the State's District Forest Fire Chief is responsible for fire suppression and other related duties. The State shares equally with the town in the cost of most forest fires, except illegal and careless fires, which are charged to the responsible party. The State further provides fire detection services, prevention programs, fire training for town wardens and crews, and back up equipment for fire suppression.

By authority of the State, the Town Forest Fire Warden controls all outside burning in his town except backyard cooking fires. Any person wishing to kindle a fire when the ground is not covered with snow must obtain a fire permit, free of cost, from the Town Forest Fire Warden. No permits will be issued for fires between 9:00 A. M. and 5:00 P. M. unless it is raining, except for commercial purposes.

Please be careful when using fire, remember it can be an extremely useful tool when under control but once allowed to run wild it can become a disastrous and devastating force. Only you can prevent forest fires.

# EXPLANATION OF SUPERINTENDENT'S AND ASSISTANT SUPERINTENDENT'S SALARY FOR 1971-1972

Chapter 189, Section 48 Revised Statutes Annotated of the State of New Hampshire, requires that the school district annual report show the total amount paid to the Superintendent of Schools as per the following quotation: "Reports. Each superintendent of a supervisory union shall annually prepare a report of the total salary paid to the superintendent, showing in detail the amount paid by the state and each local school district, and their share of same. Said report shall be filed with the school board of each school district involved and shall be included in the annual report of the respective school district as a separate entry. A like report and entry shall be made for each assistant superintendent, teacher consultant, and business administrators, if any is in service in the union."

One-half of the supervisory union expenses is prorated among the several school districts of the union on the basis of adjusted valuations. One half is prorated on the basis of average daily membership in the school for the previous school year ending June 30th. The salary of \$15,700 which was received by the Superintendent of Schools of Supervisory Union #48 during 1971-1972 was made up as follows: \$2,500 paid by the State of New Hampshire and \$13,200 was prorated among the school districts comprising the Supervisory Union. Allowance for \$1,000 travel within the Union was also prorated as stated above.

The salary of the Assistant Superintendent during 1971-1972 was made up as follows: \$2,700 paid by the State of New Hampshire and \$10,500 was prorated as stated above. Allowance for \$1,000 travel within the Union was also prorated as stated above.
