Submitted herewith is the report of the annual examination and audit of the accounts of the Town of Salem for the fiscal year ended December 31, 1969, which was made by this Division in accordance with the vote of the Town. Exhibits as hereafter listed are included as part of the report.

One of the enclosed audit reports must be given the Town Clerk as part of the permanent records.

SCOPE OF AUDIT

Included in the examination and audit were the accounts and records of the Board of Selectmen, Town Treasurer, Tax Collector, Town Clerk, Trustees of Trust Funds, Water Department, Sewer Construction Accounts, District Court and Kelley Library.

FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

Comparative Balance Sheets - General Fund - December 31, 1968 and December 31, 1969: (Exhibit A-1)

Comparative Balance Sheets - General Fund - as of December 31, 1968 and December 31, 1969, are presented in Exhibit A-1. As indicated therein, the Net Debt of the Town increased by \$345,834.64 in 1969, from \$3,375,886.45 at December 31, 1968 to \$3,721,721.09 at December 31, 1969. Salem

Comparative Balance Sheets - Non-Revenue Accounts -December 31, 1968 and December 31, 1969: (Exhibit A-2)

Comparative Balance Sheets - Non-Revenue Accounts as of December 31, 1968 and December 31, 1969, are included in Exhibit A-2.

Analysis of Change in Financial Condition - General Fund: (Exhibit A-3)

An analysis of the change in financial condition -General Fund - during the year is made in Exhibit A-3, with the factors which caused the change indicated therein.

Comparative Statements of Appropriations and Expenditures -Estimated and Actual Revenues: (Exhibits A-4 and A-5)

Comparative statements of appropriations and expenditures, estimated and actual revenues for the fiscal year ended December 31, 1969, are presented in Exhibits A-4 and A-5. As indicated by the budget summary, Exhibit A-5, a net overdraft of appropriations of \$319,957.78, less a revenue surplus of \$131,179.28, resulted in a net budget deficit of \$188,778.50.

Water Department: (Exhibits E-1 thru E-7)

The activity in the several Water Department accounts during the fiscal year is presented in Exhibits E-1 thru E-7.

Sewer and Water Construction Accounts: (Exhibits F-1, F-2 and F-3)

Summary statements of special water and sewer construction accounts are contained in Exhibits F-1, F-2 and F-3.

District Court: (Exhibit G)

A statement of the District Court accounts for the fiscal year is included in Exhibit G.

Kelley Library: (Exhibit H)

The activity in the Kelley Library operating account during 1969 is summarized in Exhibit H.

Trust Funds: (Exhibit I)

Exhibit I contains a summary statement of Trust Fund principal, income and investments.

Statement of Long Term Indebtedness: (Exhibit J)

A statement of the outstanding long term indebtedness of the Town as of December 31, 1969, showing annual debt service requirements, is presented in Exhibit J.

AUDIT PROCEDURE

The accounts and records of all town officials charged with the custody, receipt and disbursement of public funds were examined and audited in accordance with generally accepted auditing standards, and accordingly included such tests of the accounting records and such other auditing procedures as were considered necessary in the circumstances.

Verification of uncollected and unredeemed taxes was made by mailing notices to delinquent taxpayers as indicated by the Collector's records. The amounts of uncollected and unredeemed taxes as indicated in this report are therefore subject to any changes which may be necessitated by the return of verification notices.

GENERAL COMMENTS

Current Surplus:

The current surplus (excess of total assets over current liabilities) decreased by \$194,834.64 in 1969, from \$250,113.55 to \$55,278.91, as shown herewith:

Authority to Exceed 1969 Budgetary Appropriations Granted by Tax Commission:

As indicated by the Budget Summary (Exhibit A-5), there was a net overdraft of appropriations of \$319,957.78 in 1969. The net overdraft of budgetary appropriations subject to the provisions of the Municipal Budget Law which the Town had adopted, however, amounted to \$89,088.40 computed as follows:

In determining the amount of net overdraft of budgetary appropriations in the foregoing computation, it should be noted that the "overdraft" in "Overlay" was subtracted from gross overdrafts of appropriations for the year. This procedure is necessary because "Overlay" is an amount which is fixed by the Board of Selectmen rather than appropriated by the voters at Town Meeting. Accordingly, expenditures on account of "Overlay" (tax abatements) are not subject to the limitations imposed by the Municipal Budget Law on other Town Appropriations.

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The Tax Commission on January 7, 1970, pursuant to the provisions of R.S.A. 32:10-a, granted the Board of Selectmen authority to exceed 1969 appropriations in an amount not in excess of \$92,337.05. Therefore, the net overdraft of budgetary appropriations of \$89,088.40 as computed hereinbefore is deemed to have been duly authorized.

Publication of Auditors' Summary of Findings and Recommendations Mandatory:

The complete text of the auditors' summary of findings and recommendations, included as part of the annual audit report which is made to the Board of Selectmen by this Division after completion of the audit and examination of the Town accounts must be published in the next annual report of the Town, pursuant to the provisions of R.S.A. 71:27-a.

If such summary of findings and recommendations is not so published, the Tax Commission, at the expense of the Town, may cause such summary to be separately published and distributed.

Treasurer:

The general fund checking account should be reconciled monthly with the Treasurer's cash book balance. Adjustments resulting from such reconciliations should be recorded promptly on the Treasurer's books as well as on the Town's records. Note, Bond & Coupon Register:

The provisions of R.S.A. 33:12 require the Treasurer to keep a note, bond and coupon register as prescribed by the State Tax Commission.

Security Deposits:

The Treasurer should set up appropriate accounts for the recording and control of such security deposits as may be placed in his custody.

The Selectmen should examine the Tax Collector's lists of uncollected taxes of the above levies and abate such taxes thereon as appear to be uncollectible.

The inclusion of uncollectible taxes on the annual financial statements of the Town tends to misstate the Town's current financial condition.

Tax Overpayments and Refunds:

During 1969, the Tax Collector received numerous tax overpayments, the total of which amounted to \$5,445.33. In addition, overpayments of \$2,722.50 received in 1968 were owed taxpayers by the Town as of January 1, 1969. Salem

The receipt of these overpayments creates special accounting problems in that the excess collections should be duly recorded on the general accounts of the Town. Refunds to taxpayers should be made expeditiously and accurately and the proper tax accounts affected should be charged for refunds paid.

Unfortunately, the records do not indicate that adequate accounting controls have been maintained in connection with such tax overpayments. Additionally, we found considerable delays in paying refunds due taxpayers in many instances. Several duplicate refunds were discovered. In a few cases, incorrect amounts were refunded. Because proprietary accounts are not kept on the Town books, refunds of overpayments were charged to the "Overlay" account rather than to the various tax levies affected. This latter practice substantially increased audit expenses for the year as the auditors were required to analyze all items debited to "Overlay" for the purpose of reclassifying to the proper accounts those charges which were actually refunds of tax overpayments.

For the purpose of eliminating the confusion which has attended the accounting for receipts and refunds of tax overpayments heretofore, we recommend implementation of the following procedures:

1. A "refund authorization voucher" should be prepared in triplicate by the Tax Collector when overpayments are detected on the tax warrants.

This form should be designed to show the date of authorization, tax account number, name and address of taxpayer, amount of tax assessed, amount of tax paid, date paid, amount of overpayment to be refunded, type of tax and year of levy, date and amount of refund by Treasurer, and such other information as may be desirable.

2. The original and duplicate copies should be sent to the Treasurer for the orderly processing of refunds due taxpayers.

3. The triplicate copies should be retained in the Tax Collector's office to serve as a ledgerless file of outstanding refunds due taxpayers.

4. When refunds are paid, the Treasurer should note on the copies which he received, the date and amount of payment refunded (to whom refunded if to other than the taxpayer) and should return the duplicate copies to the Tax Collector.

5. Upon receipt of the duplicate copy, the Tax Collector should collate these with the triplicate copies which were originally retained and transfer these vouchers to a paid file.

With the adoption of the above steps, both the Tax Collector and the Treasurer will be aware of outstanding refunds due taxpayers at any given time.

Finally, in recording refunds paid, the Treasurer should debit a special "Overpayments Refunded" account and should discontinue the practice of charging "Overlay" for such refunds.

Double Entry - Accrual Basis General Accounting System Again Recommended:

The accounting records currently maintained to record the financial affairs of the Town, excluding Water Department accounts, consist primarily of journals of cash receipts and expenditures, budgetary accounts (revenue and appropriation ledgers), tax warrants and sewer rental warrants. General ledger proprietary accounts are not kept.

In view of the extent and complexity of Town operations and the constant need for up-to-date and reliable financial information concerning the affairs of the Town, we again recommend the adoption of a double-entry basis general accounting system with appropriate general ledger proprietary and nominal accounts. A complete self-balancing group of accounts should be established for each fund; i.e., general fund, non-revenue (bond) fund, sewer fund, etc.

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The use of the mechanical equipment utilized for present record keeping will minimize the amount of work required in maintaining the additional accounts suggested above and thus will create a minimum of additional cost to the Town.

Water Department:

The general ledger accounts of the Water Department have not been maintained for the fiscal years 1963 thru 1969. Furthermore, plant, property and equipment accounts have not been updated during this period.

As a result, we were unable to prepare reports showing the results of operations for the fiscal year ended December 31, 1969, and the financial condition of the Water Department at the aforementioned date.

The schedules concerning Water Department accounts which are part of this report are therefore limited to statements of cash receipts and expenditures.

We cannot place enough emphasis on the importance of keeping the general ledger accounts as well as the plant, property and equipment accounts up to date. Therefore, it is recommended that immediate action be taken to have these records posted to a current date.

Delinquent Water Accounts Receivable:

As of December 31, 1969, uncollected water accounts amounted to \$73,159.19 according to the records of the Water Department. A list of the outstanding accounts as of that date was examined by the auditors and compared with the individual detail accounts. Except for minor discrepancies, the list was found to be correct.

However, the examination of the individual ledger accounts disclosed a high incidence of delinquency in the accounts. Many accounts showed past due items of two or more quarters. Some 139 accounts, with unpaid charges dating back as far as five years, were aged and it was found that these accounts owed \$23,072.35 at December 31, 1969, or 31.5% of the outstanding receivables on that date. The total activity in these accounts over the five-year period amounted to \$33,443.88, and collections were only 10.371.53 - 31.0% of the amounts billed. Charges owed by town employees and officials (18 accounts) at the end of the fiscal year amounted to \$1,280.81. Here again, there were unpaid charges dating back to 1965. Charges billed against properties which were acquired by the Town through Tax Collector's deeds amounted to \$554.13 and, likewise, dated back several years. A tabulation of the foregoing accounts with a breakdown showing the amounts owed by year of billing is shown herewith: Town

It is quite obvious from the foregoing statistics that efforts to enforce collection of delinquent water rents have been very lax.

Serious losses of water revenues may be incurred unless a more positive program of collecting these delinquent accounts is adopted. In this connection, it should be pointed out that an effective method of securing payments of water rents is to adopt and enforce regulations which will automatically terminate water service unless accounts are kept on a current basis.

Kelley Library:

We again recommend the use of columnar journals with appropriate classification of receipts and expenditures be adopted to record the cash activities of the Kelley Library.

District Court:

In accordance with the statutory provisions of R.S.A. 502-a:9, the net receipts of the District Court are required to be paid to the Town Treasurer on or before the fifth day of each month. This requirement was not complied with in 1969.

Trust Fund Investments:

It is recommended that the Trustees of Trust Funds review some of the investments which currently yield low revenues and consider placing funds so invested in more productive securities or bank accounts.

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Salem

Conclusion:

The provisions of Chapter 184 of the Laws of 1955 require that this report or the summary of findings and recommendations (letter of transmittal) shall be published in the next annual report of the Town.

We extend our thanks to the officials of the Town of Salem for their assistance during the course of the audit.

REPORT OF THE RECREATION DIRECTOR - 1970

The year of 1970 was one of transition for the Recreation Department. In June, Mr. George Bruso, Director of Recreation, left Salem for another position. The programs were continued by Mrs. Sally Sweet, Recreation Department Secretary, and the Recreation Committee as best they could without someone to administer and coordinate activities.

The Department served 52,127 people during 1970. The major portion of these were served during the summer months in instructional and recreational swimming at Millville Lake and at the five playgrounds.

The year 1971 will be a year of re-evaluation and projected growth. The Recreation Department plans to expand programs for adults and girls. A new concept in recreation programming of offering programs for adults on a pay-as-you-go basis will be explored. In order to expand programs for all ages and the total community, we must begin to plan for expanded facilities, such as: tennis courts, multiple use areas (play, skating, etc.), and a park complex that would serve the total community with picnic areas, sports area, children's play area, and nature trails. These are long range plans that would help to assure the residents of Salem a Recreation Program of which they may be proud.

The Recreation Department philosophy is to provide a Recreation Program to meet the recreational needs of the total community. We are here to serve you. We would welcome your comments, suggestions, and help in improving the Recreation Program.

EDUCATION AND TRAINING

The Department was honored by the selection of one of our members to attend the F.B.I. National Academy. It is one indication of the progress we have made in our effort to provide the Town with an efficient Police Department.

Two of our officers have completed the first basic training course conducted by the New Hampshire Technical Institute.

Several officers are continuing advance courses at St. Anselm's College.

During the past year, we have received a grant of \$2,048 to up-date the Detective Division and a grant of \$4,400 to provide with matching funds, the appointment of a Juvenile Officer.

At the present time, we have applied for a renewal of the grant for the Juvenile Officer and a new request for a grant to establish a pistol and revolver range.

TRAFFIC CONTROL AND HIGHWAY SAFETY

The Salem Highway Safety Committee, in conjunction with the Police Department, are again requesting a complete traffic survey of the Town. This action is necessary in order to qualify for numerous Federal and State financial assistance programs. The Granite State Electric Company, at the request of the Town Manager, have compiled a "Proposed Street Lighting Program" which would permit a modernization of outmoded "bug lights" with a mercury vapor street light and improved street lighting in the more heavily traveled areas.

We have applied for a grant from the New Hampshire Highway Safety Agency in order to expand our own safety program, in our school system and highway safety.

Hopefully, we can provide the safety officer with a vehicle fully equipped, with radar, etc.

During the past year there were 260 water samples taken to the New Hampshire Water Supply and Pollution Laboratory for analysis. Included were:

89 samples from public water system67 samples from private wells24 samples from sewage treatment plant48 samples from all swimming areas32 samples from drainage ditches

The continued cooperation of the School Department, teachers and nursing staff in the reporting of communicable diseases accounts for the majority of this report and is greatly appreciated.

During the past year a Rubella (German Measles) Vaccination Clinic was offered. A total of 2,682 school and kindergarten children were vaccinated. Again, this program was professionally conducted by Mrs. Goff and the nursing staff of the School Department, with many thanks to Doctor Quirinale and staff, Doctor Hajjar, Doctor Massey, members of the JayCee and Registered Nurses who helped make this program well worthwhile.

In addition, the Exchange Club of Salem ran a pre-school clinic for Rubella, in which Doctor Quirinale and staff with Doctor Divino administered vaccine to 286 children, with members of the JayCee's participating. Thank you very much for your generous help.

It is requested at this time that consideration of a school physician be contracted to assume the ever-growing needs of the school requirements.

It has been the practice of this Department to engage itself with the responsibilities delegated by the State Health Department laws and regulations and those enacted local ordinances which have been adapted for the purpose of environmental sanitation, for the inhabitants of the Town of Salem. Included are:

- 1. Surveys, reports, designs, direction, management, operation and investigation of works or programs for:
 - a. Water supply, treatment and distribution.
 - b. The collection, treatment and disposal of community waste, sanitary sewage, industrial waste, and refuse.
 - c. The control of pollution of surface waterways and ground waters and of surface and sub-surface soil.
 - d. Milk and food sanitation.
 - e. Housing and institutional sanitation.
 - f. Insect and vermin control and eradication.
 - g. Camp and recreational area sanitation.
 - h. The control of atmospheric pollution of air quality, and of life, noise and toxic materials.

Based on the above-mentioned requisites for one's individual survival, both environmentally and financially, it is sincerely the desire of this office that each and every person of age, firm and agency at this time begins to participate wholeheartedly in an effort to overcome our extensive, permissive, burden of pollution.

REPORT OF SALEM DISTRICT NURSING ASSOCIATION - 1970

One full-time nurse and one part-time nurse are on the staff of the Association. A physical therapist is also available when needed. The nurses are on duty from 8:00AM to 5:00PM Monday through Friday, and may be reached at 898-4737 or in their office on the lower level of the Municipal Building 8:00-9:00AM and 1:00-2:00PM Monday through Friday.

The services are available to all townspeople but must be performed with the written permission of the family physician.

The nurses make between 30 and 40 calls each week consisting of: visits to newborns; visits to crippled children to assist with exercises or to follow up clinic appointments; visits to the aged for general health care; visits to administer hypodermic injections; and visits for continual care after a hospital stay. A nominal fee is charged to those able to pay, but care is not refused to anyone unable to pay. The nurse can adjust the fee according to need for anyone who can only pay partial payment.

During the past year 1,829 visits were made. The following is a breakdown of categories and age groups:

REPORT OF THE SALEM HISTORICAL COMMISSION

1970

The last session of the New Hampshire Legislature passed the following act to enable towns to acquire and preserve Historic Sites and Buildings:

(1) Powers of Towns: Amend R.S.A. 31:4 as Amended (supp) adding at the end thereof the following new paragraph:

XLI To acquire, preserve and maintain historic sites and historic buildings within their limits.

(2) Takes Effect: This act shall take effect sixty days after its passage.

This was passed, and at the last annual town meeting, an article sponsored by the Commission was inserted in the warrant to raise \$1,000 each year for ten years to carry out this new act. This was passed and the \$1,000 was put in the hands of the Trustees of the Trust Funds so that it would build up a fund that could be used for the purpose outlined in the act.

Mr. Howard E. Turner was appointed by the Selectmen for a three-year term.

Mr. Henry Corcoran, Jr. was appointed by the Planning Board to the Commission, replacing Mr. John S. Turner who resigned.

A request for a used furniture shop in the District was denied.

Mrs. John Belko stated there were funds from "America, the Beautiful Fund" of Washington, D. C., which might be available in helping a site design for the grounds of the "Old Town Hall." A request has been made but, as yet, there is no answer. The Salem Jaycees requested permission to paint and clean up around the old Hose House and Common. This was gratefully accepted, providing there was no change in the architecture.

REPORT OF INDUSTRIAL CONSULTANT - 1970

In 1970 throughout New England, there was a definite decrease in industries' desire to move or to build new plants. The cutback in Government spending hit everywhere, including Salem. One large industry is not housed here due to cancellation of Government orders. A plant already located in Salem had order cutbacks, but in true Yankee spirit has come back even stronger.

During the spring of 1969 we coordinated the resettlement activities of a major electronics firm to Salem. A site was chosen, a building designed, and all final costs approved by the firm - then the cutback. We are assured, however, that when the upturn arrives, Salem is the primary site.

A newly established Salem firm had orders cut, resulting in the reduction of 45 persons. We helped them bring in one firm with 20 employees; they found a firm that took space for 60 more, and a third firm is negotiating for their industrially-zoned land for a service industry.

Battenburg Laboratories, now employing 40 people, outgrew their 2,500 sq. ft. and added on in 1969. They have just leased 3,200 sq. ft. of manufacturing space and are starting production on a new product that will promote the hiring of 25 more people by spring.

The 1970 figures showed that Salem has grown 100% in 10 years, which induced many more commercial businesses to investigate Salem. This action resulted in:

1. A large national chain has acquired land and will start a 119,000 sq. ft. building in March.

2. Another major chain has 25 acres of land under option and plans for a large covered mall.

58

3. The T.M.E. Company (formerly the 1st Elliot Group) completed their 25,000 sq. ft. plant during the summer and have been designing and building new equipment for a unique industrial process. They are now ready for production and are hiring people.

4. The owners of a large tract of industrially-zoned land have just completed plans for a 6-months concentrated advertising campaign aimed at manufacturers, industrial brokers, and large construction companies.

The past year showed greater activity of the Salem Industrial Commission. Two units of membership were formed – a six-member active board and a 25-member associate board. After much deliberation by the combined boards, a decision was made to form a Local Development Corporation. The aim of this Corporation – to make funds available to help bring in new industry and to help local industry to expand.

This Corporation is in the early stages of maturity and more will be heard of it in the near future.

We do not consider the total amount of \$5,981.85 which is due for meters, stock, labor, equipment and the services of subcontractors a serious condition of our accounts receivable, because the bulk of this amount is due from subdividers who are required to install water services before completing their roads. These amounts have to be paid in full before the water can be turned on and any unpaid balances are normally cleared at the time the property is sold. The \$37,437.00 which is due for water is, however, a serious situation and we will continue to enforce our policy of shutting off water for any delinquent accounts in an effort to reduce this amount in 1971. 1969 - 1,525 customers owed an average of \$479.69 per customer. (\$73,153.19) 1970 - 1,073 customers owed an average of \$409.64 per customer. (\$43,954.49)

The accounts receivable list issued on December 31, 1970, still carries 182 accounts that were also on the accounts receivable of the previous year. ACTIVITIES IN 1971

Water improvements were made on Ackerman St., Colonial Drive, Henry St., Alta Ave., Marsh Ave., and Millville St. A tapping sleeve, gate and valve have been installed at the corner of North Policy and Webster Streets for the replacement of the 2-inch galvanized main on Webster St. and work on the actual replacement will begin this spring.

A new pit was installed at the Pumping Station on North Policy St. and two new hydrants were installed on South Broadway just south of Cluff Crossing Road.

One hundred fifty-five (155) applications for new services and changes of services were processed and one hundred forty-nine (149) new accounts were added.

Nine hundred thirty-seven (937) work orders were processed in response to customer service calls.

Four (4) investments in U. S. Treasury Bills earned a total of \$910.81 in interest.

One thousand eight hundred ninety (1,890) sewer bills totaling \$47,232.71 were prepared and submitted to the Tax Collector for collection. With many new customers now on the sewer lines, we expect to bill approximately 3,200 accounts in 1971.



To see if the Town will vote to appropriate such sums of money as may be necessary to defray the expenses of operation of the Town; Town Officers' salaries and expenses; expenses of Election and Registration; Planning Board; District Court and Town Buildings; Ambulance; expenses of the operation of the Police, Fire, and Civil Defense Departments; expenses of the Town Dump, and damage by dogs; expenses of the Health Department; Summer and Winter Maintenance and General Expense of Town Highways; Street Lighting; Town Poor and Legal expenses; Social Security and Retirement (Town's share); Interest; and other necessary expenses pertaining to the operation of the Town of Salem, including Water Department, all such amounts being shown in the posted Town Budget.

Article 6. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen and Treasurer under the provisions of R.S.A. 33:71, as amended, to borrow, in anticipation of taxes, such sums as are necessary for the operation of the Town, and to set the rate, effect the issuance of notes, and to otherwise negotiate for the sale of notes to be paid within the present fiscal year.

Article 7. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen and Town Manager to apply, negotiate, and do all other things necessary to obtain such Federal Interest Free Loans, and to expend the same, as may be required for the preparation of plans and designs of Town Roads, Municipal Buildings, extension of the Water System and other Town functions.

Article 8. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen and Town Manager to apply for, negotiate and do all other things necessary to obtain such State and/or Federal funds as may be made available, and to expend the same.

Article 9. Shall Eighty thousand dollars (\$80,000) be appropriated for the purpose of glass covering two drying beds and purchasing portable heaters for the same at the Municipal Treatment Plant, and the Selectmen be authorized to borrow said sum under the Municipal Finance Act, to accept and contract for Federal Aid which may be expended in addition to said sum, and to accept and contract for State Aid? Article 10. Shall One hundred twenty thousand dollars (\$120,000) be appropriated for the expansion of the Municipal Treatment Plant by the addition of a trickling filter, and the Selectmen be authorized to borrow said sum under the Municipal Finance Act, to accept and contract for Federal Aid which may be expended in addition to said sum, and to accept and contract for State Aid?

Article 11. Shall Six hundred thousand dollars (\$600,000) be appropriated for expansion of the municipal water system, including construction of a 1.5 million gallon storage tank, and the Selectmen be authorized to borrow said sum under the Municipal Finance Act, to accept and contract for Federal Aid which may be expended in addition to said sum, and to accept and contract for State Aid?

Article 12. Shall Five hundred twenty-two thousand dollars (\$522,000) be appropriated for expansion of the municipal water system, and the Selectmen be authorized to borrow said sum under the Municipal Finance Act, to accept and contract for Federal Aid which may be expended in addition to said sum, and to accept and contract for State Aid?

Article 13. Shall Three hundred forty-two thousand, four hundred eighty dollars (\$342,480) be appropriated for expansion of the municipal sewerage system, and the Selectmen be authorized to borrow said sum under the Municipal Finance Act, to accept and contract for Federal Aid which may be expended in addition to said sum, and to accept and contract for State Aid?

Article 14. Shall Four hundred nine thousand, four hundred forty dollars (\$409,440) be appropriated for expansion of the municipal sewerage system, and the Selectmen be authorized to borrow said sum under the Municipal Finance Act, to accept and contract for Federal Aid which may be expended in addition to said sum, and to accept and contract for State Aid? Article 15. Shall Two hundred ninety-two thousand, nine hundred twenty dollars (\$292,920) be appropriated for expansion of the municipal sewerage system, and the Selectmen be authorized to borrow said sum under the Municipal Finance Act, to accept and contract for Federal Aid which may be expended in addition to said sum, and to accept and contract for State Aid?

Article 16. Shall One hundred thirteen thousand, four hundred dollars (\$113,400) be appropriated for expansion of the municipal sewerage system, and the Selectmen be authorized to borrow said sum under the Municipal Finance Act, to accept and contract for Federal Aid which may be expended in addition to said sum, and to accept and contract for State Aid?

Article 17. By petition: To see if the Town will recognize the Salem Municipal Employees Association as the bargaining agent for municipal employees and authorize the Selectmen to enter into collective bargaining contracts with the Association.

Article 18. To see if the Town will resolve, pursuant to the Housing Authorities Law of New Hampshire, that there is need for a Housing Authority to function in the Town of Salem, to be called, "The Housing Authority of the Town of Salem".

Article 19. To see if the Town will vote to approve the application by the Housing Authority of the Town to the Federal Government for preliminary loans, and to authorize the Selectmen to enter into a cooperation agreement with the Housing Authority by adopting the following resolution:

"Be it resolved by the inhabitants of the Town of Salem that there exists in the Town a need for low-rent housing at rents within the means of persons and families of low income as defined in the United States Housing Act of 1937, as amended, which need is not being adequately met by private enterprise; that the application of the Housing Authority of the Town to the Department of Housing and Urban Development, Housing Assistance Administration, for a preliminary loan in an amount not to exceed four thousand five hundred dollars (\$4,500) for surveys and planning in connection with low rent housing projects of, not to exceed approximately seventy-five (75) dwelling units, be, and hereby is approved; and the Selectmen are authorized to execute, on behalf of the Town, an agreement with the Housing Authority providing for the local cooperation required by the Housing Assistance Administration pursuant to the United States Housing Act of 1937, as amended, and to act in any manner relating thereto."

Article 20. By request of the Salem Historic District Commission, to see if the Town will appropriate a sum of one thousand dollars (\$1,000) or any part thereof, each year for ten years to set up a fund so that the Commission could purchase, preserve, maintain and improve any historic building or site within the Historical District.

Article 21. To see if the Town will vote to sponsor a group living program, and if necessary, to authorize the use of Town property for such a program or authorize the renting of property for such program, and further, to see if the Town will vote to accept a Federal Grant in the amount of twenty-seven thousand, one hundred fifteen dollars (\$27,115) for such program, and authorize the Selectmen to expend said sum of money to further the program.

Article 22. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Seven thousand five hundred dollars (\$7,500) for a comprehensive Traffic Study of Salem through facilities offered by the State of New Hampshire, said \$7,500 representing the Town's share of a total cost of One hundred fifty thousand dollars (\$150,000). Article 23. To see if the Town will vote to reconvey to Frank Radulski land on the westerly side of Shannon Road, said land being a portion of the land originally purchased by the Town of Salem as the result of the adoption of Article 25 at the annual 1969 Town Meeting.

Article 24. By request of John A. Reece and others: To see if the Town of Salem will rescind the present dog leash law and replace it with the following:

A. Any dog, after investigation by the appointed dog officer, that is found to be vicious, a destroyer of public or private property or an excessive nuisance, shall not at any time leave the property of its owner or keeper unless under the restrained control of said owner or keeper.

Any owner or keeper shall have the right to appeal the dog officer's decision before the Board of Selectmen and the Salem District Court.

B. All dogs shall be kept under restrained control of their owners or keepers or on said owners or keepers property during the hours school children are being bussed to and from school.

C. Any dog in violation of the above shall be taken by the Town and shall be kept by the Town for not more than three days. The Town shall make every possible effort to notify the dog's owner that the dog has been taken.

D. If the owner of such dog does not claim the dog and pay all expenses incurred by the Town in caring for the dog, and license if necessary, within the three-day period set forth in Section C., the Town shall destroy the dog and shall make reasonable efforts to notify the dog's owner that the dog has been destroyed.

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E. The Selectmen may appoint various individuals to act for the Town in carrying out the provisions of this article.

Article 25. By request of Roy A. Sutherland and others: Shall the Dog Restraining Ordinance adopted by the Selectmen of the Town of Salem, New Hampshire, in 1970, be adopted by the Town.

Article 26. By request of John P. Ganley and others: To see if the Town will add dependents' coverage to the employees' health insurance and raise and appropriate the sum of Twenty-five thousand two hundred dollars (\$25,200) for the same.

Article 27. By request of Robert P. Mason, dba Mason's Super Market, and others: To authorize the Town to extend the water line (8-inch) from 105 Rockingham Road to Mason's Super Market, a distance of five hundred fifty (550) feet and raise and appropriate the sum of fifty-five hundred dollars (\$5,500) for same.

Article 28. By Petition: To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Twenty-two hundred dollars (\$2,200) to employ two counselors to work with youth during the school summer vacation period.

Article 29. By request of Harley G. Featherston and others: To see if the Town will vote to install a water main from Brookdale Road a distance of five hundred (500) feet along Bus Road and raise and appropriate the sum of Four thousand dollars (\$4,000) for the same. (The cost of said project is estimated to be Five thousand dollars (\$5,000), but Mitchell's Real Estate will contribute One thousand dollars (\$1,000) towards the cost of extension of the main in the event the Town adopts this Article. Article 30. By petition of William J. Falwell and others: To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of Eight thousand five hundred dollars (\$8,500) and will indemnify Spicket River Corporation not in excess of Eight thousand five hundred dollars (\$8,500) against any loss, cost or damage to which it may be subject in lowering the water level in Millville Lake, the removal of inanimate fish to eliminate pollution, restoring the level thereof and for the cost of any repairs to the dam and water control mechanism occasioned or revealed by such lowering and restoration.

The agreement will not be binding on Spicket River Corporation, et al, in the event that the property and/or water rights are sold or transferred in the interim.

The foregoing procedure will be accomplished in late fall of the year so that the excessively prevalent Fanwort (Cabomba Caroliniana Weed) can be frozen out, and thus will assist in the removal of Fanwort and other deleterious material from Millville Lake.

Article 31. By request of the Salem Planning Board and others: To see if the Town will vote to accept the following streets as listed:

Ann Avenue from Pattee Road to Baldwin Road; Benning Street from Baldwin Street to the end of the existing street, about 125 feet east of Seed Street;

- Brown Street from Lawrence Road to the end of the existing street at the Spicket River;
- Crestwood Circle from Green Acre Drive to Marie Avenue; Darryl Lane from Dennis Drive to St. Mary's Lane;
- Dennis Drive from Old Rockingham Road to St. Mary's Lane; Fairmont Road from South Policy Street to the existing end of the street about 1400 feet easterly;

George Avenue from Main Street to the end of the existing street about 315 feet southerly; Green Acre Drive from Marie Avenue to Crestwood Circle; Hampshire Road from Route 28 easterly to the Massachusetts Line;

Henderson Circle from Main Street to Alta Avenue; MacGregor Avenue from MacLarnon Road to South Policy Street; Marie Avenue from Green Acre Drive to David Terrace; Mason Drive from Old Rockingham Road to the end of the

existing street about 350 feet north of Hidden Road; Messer Avenue from Pattee Road to Ansel Street; Morrison Avenue from Taylor Street to Dwight Avenue; Pattee Road from Route 28 to Messer Avenue; Pumping Station Road from Old Rockingham Road to

North Policy Street;

Rosewood Avenue from Pattee Road to Ansel Street; Seed Street from South Broadway to Benning Street; Senter Street from Lawrence Road to Otis Avenue; Smith Street from North Policy Street to the end of the existing street about 454 feet easterly;

Wheeler Dam Road from North Main Street to Shore Drive; Woodland Terrace from South Policy Street to Trolley Lane.

Article 32. By request of Beverly Isenberg and others: To see if the Town will vote to accept certain roads on the shore of Arlington Pond and adjacent roads known as the "Franz Acres Area". The following as shown on the Town Property Map: Lou-Al Road, Franz Road, Mary's Lane, Betty's Lane, and Alfred Drive.

Article 33. By request of Paul J. Shafer and others: To see if the Town will vote to install one (1) street light on pole number 4135 on Ann Avenue and raise money for the same. Article 34. By request of Arnold M. Priestley and others: To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of two hundred dollars (\$200) for the installation of a street light at 4 Bluff Street, pole number 4632.

Article 35. By request of William D. Robinson and others: To see if the Town will vote to install one (1) street light on pole number 6196 situated on Ermer Road and raise money for the same.

Article 36. By request of Edward R. Dube and others: To see if the Town will vote to install one (1) street light on Net Pole No. 7 over 35 situated on North Policy Street and raise money for the same.

Article 37. By request of Philip Smith and others: To see if the Town will vote to install one (1) street light on pole number 2020 situated on Wheeler Dam Road and raise money for the same.

Article 38. By request of Mildred A. Atwood and others: To see if the Town will vote to install four (4) street lights on pole numbers 2, 4, 5 and 7 on Juniper Road and raise money for the same.

Article 39. By request of John P. Mathews and others: To see if the Town will vote to install one (1) street light on pole number 5618 on Dana Road and raise money for the same.

Article 40. By request of Mildred Atwood and others: To see if the Town will vote to install two (2) street lights on pole numbers 4617 and 5616 on Dana Road and raise money for the same. Article 41. By request of Mrs. Mary A. Scholtz and others: To see if the Town will vote to install one (1) street light at the corner of Lawrence Road and Nancy Street, pole number 3275, and raise money for the same.

Article 42. By request of Ronald C. Grondin and others: To see if the Town will vote to install one (1) street light on pole number 6164 on Tyler Street and raise money for the same.

Article 43. By request of Beverly Isenberg and others: To see if the Town will vote to install one (1) street light between Nos. 6 and 8 Mary's Lane, pole number 4090, and raise money for the same.

Article 44. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of One hundred and fifty thousand dollars (\$150,000) or any part thereof, to widen Route 28 from Rockingham Boulevard to Cluff Road, involving rebuilding the intersection at Cluff Road and Route 28.
