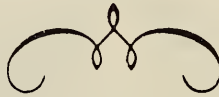

SUMMARY OF FINDINGS AND RECOMMENDATIONS

Board of Selectmen
Seabrook, New Hampshire 03874

Gentlemen:

Submitted herewith is the report of an examination and audit of the accounts and records of the Town of Seabrook for the fiscal years ended December 31, 1972 and December 31, 1973, which was made by this Division in accordance with the vote of the Town. Exhibits as hereafter listed are included as part of the report.

One of the enclosed audit reports must be given to the Town Clerk for retention as part of the permanent Town records.

SCOPE OF AUDIT

Included in the examination and audit were the accounts and records of the Board of Selectmen, Treasurer, Tax Collector, Town Clerk, Municipal Court, Water Department and Trustees of Trust Funds.

FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

General Fund:

Comparative Balance Sheets: (Exhibits 1 and 24)

Comparative Balance Sheets which disclose the financial condition of the general fund as of December 31, 1971 - 1972 and December 31, 1972 - 1973 are presented in Exhibits 1 and 24. As indicated therein, the Current Surplus of the Town increased by \$328.89 in 1972 and \$27, 539.12 in 1973.

Analysis of Change in Financial Condition: (Exhibits 2 and 25)

Statements presenting an analysis of the factors which caused the change in financial condition of the Town during the fiscal years ended December 31, 1972 and December 31, 1973 are presented in Exhibits 2 and 25, respectively.

The factors which caused the increase of \$328.89 in Current Surplus in 1972 were as follows:

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Comparative Statements of Appropriations and Expenditures - Estimated and Actual Revenues: (Exhibits 3 and 4; 26 and 27)

Comparative statements of general fund appropriations and expenditures, estimated and actual revenues for the fiscal years ended December 31, 1972 and December 31, 1973 are presented in Exhibits 3 and 4, 26 and 27.

As indicated in Exhibit 4, a revenue surplus of \$21,098.24, less a net overdraft of appropriations of \$10,911.88, resulted in a net budget surplus of \$10,186.36 in 1972. In 1973, as disclosed by Exhibit 27, a revenue surplus of \$42,205.75, less a net overdraft of appropriations of \$8,052.35, resulted in a net budget surplus of \$34,153.40.

Water Department:

Comparative Balance Sheets: (Exhibits 5 and 28)

Comparative Balance Sheets of the Water Department as of December 31,

1971 - 1972 and December 31, 1972 - 1973 are presented in Exhibits 5 and 28. As indicated therein, the Net Debt of the Water Department decreased by \$60,081.31 in 1972 and by \$55,476.38 in 1973.

The aforementioned statements do not give effect to accounts receivable, accounts payable and other accrued items. In addition, depreciation has not been recorded on utility plant in service and contributions in aid of construction have not been capitalized in current and prior years. Consequently, the statements do not present the financial position of the Water Department at December 31, 1972 and December 31, 1973 in conformity with generally accepted accounting principles.

Long Term Indebtedness:

Comparative Balance Sheets: (Exhibits 6 and 29)

Comparative Balance Sheets of the outstanding long term indebtedness of the Town as of December 31, 1972 and December 31, 1973 are shown in Exhibits 6 and 29. The long term debt decreased by \$31,837.15 during 1972 and \$31,910.63 in 1973.

Statements of Debt Service Requirements: (Exhibits 7 and 30)

Statements showing annual debt service requirements as of December 31, 1972 and December 31, 1973 are contained in Exhibits 7 and 30.

TREASURER

General Fund:

Classified Statement of Receipts and Expenditures: (Exhibits 8 and 31)

Classified statements of general fund receipts and expenditures for the fiscal years ended December 31, 1972 and December 31, 1973, made up in accordance with the uniform classification of accounts, are included in Exhibits 8 and 31. Proof of the Treasurer's balance as of December 31, 1972 and December 31, 1973 are indicated in Exhibits 9 and 32.

Water Department:

General Fund:

Classified Statement of Receipts and Expenditures: (Exhibits 13 and 36)

A classified statement of Water Department receipts and expenditures for the fiscal years ending December 31, 1972 and December 31, 1973 are included in Exhibits 13 and 36. Proof of the Treasurer's Balances as of December 31, 1972 and December 31, 1973 are indicated in Exhibits 14 and 37.

AUDIT PROCEDURE

The accounts and records of all town officials charged with the custody, receipt and disbursement of public funds were examined and audited in accordance with generally accepted auditing standards and accordingly included such tests of the accounting records and such other auditing procedures

as were considered necessary in the circumstances.

Verification of uncollected and unredeemed taxes were made by mailing notices to delinquent taxpayers as indicated by the Tax Collector's records. Consequently, the amounts of uncollected and unredeemed taxes as indicated in this report are subject to any changes which may be necessitated by the return of verification notices.

GENERAL COMMENTS

Overdraft of Appropriations and Application of the Municipal Budget Law:

There was an overdraft of town budgetary appropriations of \$13,965.57 in the fiscal year ended December 31, 1972. Similarly, a net appropriation overdraft of \$7,638.48 occurred in the fiscal year ended December 31, 1973.

Inasmuch as the Town of Seabrook has adopted the provisions of the Municipal Budget Law (Chapter 32, Revised Statutes Annotated), the Board of Selectmen, with the written approval of a majority of the Budget Committee, should have made application to the Tax Commission in 1972 and to the Commissioner of Revenue Administration in 1973 for a certificate of emergency authorizing expenditures in excess of budgetary appropriations in those years. This, however, was not done. Therefore, expenditures in excess of budgetary appropriations voted by the Town in 1972 and 1973 were not properly authorized and resulted in a violation of Section 10, of the aforesaid Municipal Budget Law.

Unredeemed Taxes:

As of December 31, 1973 unredeemed taxes on account of the levies of 1970 and prior years amounted to \$44,767.72, as shown in the following tabulation:

This amount represents approximately forty-eight percent of the total unredeemed taxes outstanding at December 31, 1973, as shown by the Tax Collector's records.

The statutory redemption period has expired in all of these cases. The Tax Collector, therefore, should have delivered tax deeds to the Town for

all delinquent real estate involved. This, however, was not done prior to December 31, 1973. Consequently, these unredeemed taxes are carried on the Town records as part of the total assets of the general fund and in our opinion, overstate the amount of the Town's current surplus.

To correct this condition the sum of \$44,767.72 has been inserted as a provision for estimated uncollectable tax liens on the Balance Sheet as of December 31, 1973 (Exhibit 24). This reduces the estimated recoverable tax liens held by the Town at that date to \$49,855.27. We believe that the latter amount reflects more realistically the net assets and current surplus of the Town at the close of the fiscal year 1973.

The Tax Collector has been instructed to execute tax deeds to the Town at once on all properties on which tax liens are in default of redemption, in accordance with the requirements of R.S.A. 80:38.

Town Treasurer:

The surety bond of the Treasurer should be equal to that of the Tax Collector, therefore, it should be increased from \$25,000.00 to \$29,000.00.

The town Treasurer is not closing the books on a timely basis as required by law.

The money held in the Treasurer's account during the fiscal year ended December 31, 1973 was unusually high and should have been used to reduce the outstanding tax anticipation note position or invested for income.

Clerk of Court:


The Seabrook Municipal Court has been discontinued as of November 16, 1973 and all records through that date have been audited and monies turned over to the Town as required by law. The balance shown in Exhibit 42 at December 31, 1973 has been turned over to the Town in January 1974.

Conclusion:

The provisions of Chapter 71-a, Section 21, of the Revised Statutes Annotated require that the Auditors' summary of findings and recommendations (letter of transmittal) shall be published in the next annual report of the Town. Publication of the Exhibits contained in the audit report is optional, at the discretion of the Board of Selectmen.

We extend our thanks to the officials of the Town of Seabrook for their assistance during the course of the audit.

You are hereby notified to meet in the lower hall of the Seabrook Firemen's Association Building, Route 286, on Tuesday, March 4, 1975, at 9 o'clock in the forenoon and to cast ballots until at least 7 o'clock in the evening of the same day, and to meet in the upper hall of the Seabrook Firemen's Association Building, Route 286, on Wednesday, March 5, 1975 at 7:30 o'clock in the evening to act on the following Articles:

ARTICLE I: To elect by Non-partisan ballot; One Town Clerk for a term of three (3) years; One Selectman and one Assessor for a term of three (3) years; One Trustee of the Trust Funds for a term of three (3) years; One Treasurer for a term of three (3) years; a Road Agent; A Chief of Police; a Chief of the Fire Department and three (3) Constables, each for a term of one (1) year; Two (2) members of the Budget Committee for a term of three (3) years; a member of the Park Commission for a term of three (3) years; and any other officers for the ensuing year.

(On the Official Ballot)

ARTICLE II: To see if the Town will vote to amend the Zoning Ordinance for the Town by striking out the contents of paragraph C of Section IV and substituting therefor the following:

- C. Setback and Sideline: Structures with the following uses shall conform as specified below:

	Setback	Sideline
Primary uses of Zone 1	20'	8'
Primary uses of Zone 2	30'	15'
Primary uses of Zone 3	50'	25'

Setback shall be provided from the sideline of the right of way of any road and the sideline from the nearest lot line. Steps shall not be considered a part of the structure, but porches, piazzas and other similar elements shall be considered a part of the structure.

Small and twenty-two (22) other voters of the Town: To see if the Town will vote to appropriate Five Hundred (\$500.00) Dollars for the purpose of having the Selectmen codify and consolidate by subject matter all Town laws and ordinances, passed by the Town Meeting and the Board itself from 1925 to the present, into a bound, loose leaf volume. Hereafter, upon the passage of any new laws or ordinances, the Selectmen will be required to add them to this volume and also nullify those laws superseded in authority by any new ones. Furthermore, copies of this volume and all subsequent revisions will be made available to all department heads and Town officers. The results of this codification will be presented for approval to the next annual Town Meeting.

(Approved by the Budget Committee)

ARTICLE XXXIII: Upon the petition of Lydia M. Gould and fifty (50) other voters of the Town: To see what action the Town Meeting will take to raise and appropriate the sum of Ten Thousand (\$10,000.00) Dollars for the Brown Memorial Library. The moneys with the available funds of the Brown Memorial Library to be utilized for the purpose of expanding the Library's services to the public and the purchase of new books; for a parking lot in the rear of the Library to eliminate a motor vehicle parking hazard on Lafayette Road; to refurbish the Library insofar as funds will permit in preparation of the 200th Bicentennial of the United States of America and to make such other needed improvements that the Library may need.

(Approved by the Budget Committee)

ARTICLE XXXIV: Upon the petition of Eric N. Small and twenty-five (25) other voters of the Town: To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate Three Thousand Five Hundred (\$3,500.00) Dollars for the purchase of legal size fireproof filing cabinets for the records in current use by the Selectmen's office, Town Clerk, Tax Collector, Treasurer and Water Department.

(Not Approved by the Budget Committee)

ARTICLE XXXV: Upon the petition of Eric N. Small and twenty-two (22) other voters of the Town: To see if the Town will vote to require the Selectmen hereafter to conduct annually an inventory of all Town property and to keep each yearly record on file at the Selectmen's office for no less than ten (10) years.

ARTICLE XXXVI: Upon the petition of Stanley A. Hamel and thirty (30) other voters of the Town: Shall the name of New Zealand Road (Rt. 107) be changed to Yankee Greyhound Highway?

(On the Official Ballot)

ARTICLE XXXVII: Upon the petition of Eric N. Small and twenty-three (23) other voters of the Town: To see if the Town will vote to approve a committee of three (3) resident voters to be appointed by the Moderator to study available sites and/or existing buildings for a Town Offices building and to submit its findings to the next annual Town Meeting.

ARTICLE XXXVIII: Upon the petition of Oliver L. Carter and thirteen (13) other voters of the Town: Inasmuch as the Town does not provide suitable fireproof storage, as required by RSA 41:59, to see if the Town will vote to appropriate Two Thousand Five Hundred (\$2,500.00) Dollars to microfilm the following Town records dating from 1768 to 1970: Town Clerk's, including Town Meeting minutes and vital statistics, tax, valuation, mortgages, receipts and payments, state warrant tax books, resident tax and invoice books, property warrant books and any other records requiring such preservation, as listed in the "Handbook for New Hampshire Selectmen and Local Officers".

(Approved by the Budget Committee)

ARTICLE XXXIX: Upon the petition of Raymond C. Sturgis and nine (9) other voters of the Town: Shall the Trustees of Trust Funds be instructed to set aside One Thousand (\$1,000.00) Dollars from the Memorial Tablet Fund established by Article X of the 1920 Town Warrant as a permanent fund with the balance and any subsequent interest to be paid annually to the Town for the Park Commission to use for the upkeep of memorials in Town?

ARTICLE XL: Upon the petition of Thomas A. Riley and twenty-two (22) other voters of the Town: That the Town of Seabrook will adopt the provisions of RSA 55:9-a and RSA 55:9-b. This is under RSA 55:9-c of the New Hampshire Primary and Election Laws dated January 1, 1974. 55:9-a Application to Town Clerk Any person who is a legal resident of any town in this State whose name does not appear on the checklist of said town, may apply to the Town Clerk for the purpose of having his name added thereto. Subject to the conditions set forth.

ARTICLE XLI: Upon the petition of D. Melvin Burrowes and sixteen (16) other voters of the Town: To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the amount of One Hundred (\$100.00) Dollars to be donated to the Hampton Area Crisis Home Program to help youths in family crisis.

(Approved by the Budget Committee)

ARTICLE XLII: Upon the petition of Evelyn M. Daneau and thirty-seven (37) other voters of the Town: To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Six Thousand (\$6,000.00) Dollars for the purpose of supplying town water to Cross Beach; over the roadway that was decreed to said Town of Seabrook by the Superior Court of Rockingham County. This to be for the health, welfare, and protection of the residents therein.

(Not Approved by the Budget Committee)

ARTICLE XLIII: Upon the petition of Eric N. Small and thirty-nine (39) other voters of the Town: To see if the Town will vote, in compliance with the provisions of RSA 572:20-21, to prohibit the further sale of lots in that part of the Elmwood Cemetery, deeded to the Town in 1938 by the Amesbury Monthly Meeting of Friends and called "The Quaker Cemetery", to prohibit any burial on vacant lots in, except on those lots where the original Quaker Meetinghouse stood (lots 1-21), to permit the Town's American Revolution Bicentennial Committee to authorize a probe of vacant lots in, to reclaim those vacant lots which contain unmarked Quaker graves and/or stones, to remove, disinter and unearth those Quaker graves situated on, between or beside used lots in, to relocate and rebury such graves and/or markers on those vacant lots in, to re deed to the owners of vacant lots surrounded by no less than three used lots after the above named probe and removal has been conducted in the aforementioned section of Elmwood Cemetery and, to honor and comply with the above named deed, to raise and appropriate Five Hundred (\$500.00) Dollars for the restoration of those grave markers damaged by either the elements or vandals.

During fiscal year July 1, 1973 through June 30, 1974, 1431 calls were made in Seabrook. Of these calls 447 were made free of charge or at a reduced fee. It is agency policy to scale fees or provide service on a no charge basis to those patients unable to pay. In addition to skilled nursing care, the services to our Physical Therapist were utilized by several Seabrook residents.

Currently 195 children from Seabrook are being followed at our Well Child Clinic. They receive physical exams, immunization, counseling, blood tests, developmental screening, urine tests and vision and hearing tests. We also had a Dental Clinic for those children who are in our Well Child Clinic which included cleaning, topical fluoride treatment and dental health teaching.

In addition to the above mentioned programs, monthly visits are made to those persons who are included in the State TB programs to observe for any adverse reactions to their prescribed medications and to assist them in making appointments for adequate follow-up care.

We are also involved with the Aftercare program in conjunction with the Seacoast Regional Counseling Center. Patients who have been discharged from New Hampshire Hospital are followed, appointments are made for them to be seen at the counseling center for medication reviews and additional assessment and much emotional support is given to both the patient and family.

Referrals are made to appropriate agencies when the need arises. Some of the resources we frequently use are the Family Planning Clinic, Crippled Children's Clinic, Pediatric Cardiac Clinic, Child and Family Services, Welfare, Legal Aid, etc.

HIGHWAY SAFETY COMMITTEE

REPORT FOR 1974

1. The Smithtown Rotary was finally completed as to directional signs, north and south, yield signs to slow up merging traffic, and the elimination of unsafe cross traffic at Folly Mill Road .
2. The 55 M.P.H. State Limit sign at the entrance to New Hampshire on route 1, was eliminated because of the confusion it created with the 35 M.P.H. regulatory speed on this road.
3. The "RADAR CONTROL" program got under way officially with the placing of the State "SPEED CONTROLLED BY RADAR" signs by Bill Felch's boys. Placing of these signs, legalizing the use of the Radar equipment, brought the State Police into the program of controlling speeds by electronic scanning.
4. The Safety Committee worked with the officers of the new Seabrook Bank in an attempt to ease the unsafe conditions existing at the Post Office--Railroad Avenue--Lafayette Road conflict. The architect, with assistance and ideas from the committee, have in effect, created the basis for a nice appearing and relatively safer intersection. The single entrance/exit to both the post office and the bank, together with traffic light control at the Railroad Avenue--Lafayette Road intersection will once and for all solve 4 or 5 major "neighborhood complaints".
5. Once again the Safety Committee provided refresher course for Police Officers using the new American Red Cross Ambulance Course. With the assistance of Lt. William Sullivan of the Hampton Fire Department several officers were brought up to date in the use of "Cardiopulmonary Resuscitation", better known as "CPR", or attack on heart attack victims.
6. During "Summer '74" the traffic lights at Washington Street--286 "froze" with the green lights in the east-west direction, and red on Washing Street direction, and usually this occurred during the week-end heavy traffic periods. The Committee requested State Traffic Division to re-do and modernize these controls. The lights having failed at least 16 times during the worst of traffic loads created an "emergency" and the State was able to change the entire system immediately.
7. All road painted signals and guides were renewed, and several new ones added at our request.
8. STOP, YIELD and CAUTION-CHILDREN signs as well as NO PARKING were placed as State Regulations indicated. Roads that have suddenly become quite active have received the CHILDREN signs especially.

9. Project 107, both at the track entrance and the Route 95 exit and entrance ramps, the problem of lighting is still with us. Officers on Traffic duty at these ramps have asked for better illumination to safeguard their traffic control positions. Flood-lights have been tried as well as other forms of illumination. However, these requests are being followed up, new methods will be tried, but at the moment the requests are not entirely consistent with good engineering practice.
10. It should be mentioned that the Safety Committee had been successful in obtaining a grant of \$2,500.00 to be used as a Traffic Control cruiser funding base, like amount to be raised by the Town. The Town pays full price for its cruisers. This Federal Type Standard cruiser would have saved 50%. It was unfortunate that we lost the use of this "handout".

Seabrook folks in great numbers have co-operated with our safety efforts, and to those who have called safety hazards to our attention, to those who have gone out of their way to commend improvements, and especially to those who have accepted our safety admonitions and made them their driving guides, our sincerest thanks.
