# WARRANT

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## STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Stewartstown, in the County of Coos in said State qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the town house in said town of Stewartstown on Tuesday, the 14th day of March next, at ten o'clock in the forenoon to act upon the following subjects:

1. To see if the town will vote to accept State Aid.
2. To see if the town will vote to accept the budget, as approved by the Budget Committee and raise money for the same. If not, to see what sum of money the town will vote to raise to defray town charges for the ensuing year as follows:
  - (a) Town Officers' Salaries.
  - (b) Town Officers' Expenses.
  - (c) Election and Registration.
  - (d) Town hall, office and other buildings.
  - (e) Damage and Legal Expenses.
  - (f) Health Department.
  - (g) Town Dump Expense.
  - (h) Vital Statistics.
  - (i) General Expense of Highway Department.
  - (j) Civil Defense.
  - (k) Interest on Temporary Loans.
  - (l) County Tax.
3. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for support of poor.
4. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for support of libraries.
5. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for care of cemeteries.
6. To see if the town will vote to raise two thousand seven hundred dollars (\$2,700,00) for street lighting.

7. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the following departments:
  - (a) Police Department.
  - (b) Fire Department.
  - (c) Sewer Department.
  
8. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise in addition to that required by law for the town maintenance.
  
9. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for winter roads.
  
10. To see if the town will vote to raise seven hundred (\$700.00) for the North Country Community Services.

- (d) Two Road Agents.
- (e) One or more Auditors.
- (f) Overseer of Public Welfare.
- (g) Collector of Diamond Pond Rent.
- (h) One or more Sextons.
- (i) Trustee of Trust Funds.
- (j) One library trustee for three years ensuing.
- (k) Two members of the Budget Committee for three years ensuing.
- (l) One member of the Budget Committee for one year.

18. To transact any other business that may be legally brought before this meeting.

# Report Of The Superintendent

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To the School Board and the Citizens of the  
School District of Stewartstown

## FOREWORD

The public schools are organized to perpetuate and improve the American way of life. To do this, schools must teach children to assume their civic and social responsibilities and help them to develop high moral and cultural standards.

Children must be equipped to meet many new challenges which will confront them in a world that is forever changing.

Good teaching has always been personal teaching. But the fact is that society now recognizes that an education is more than the acquisition that it once was. Helping children to grow in moral, cultural, civic, and social stature requires that the school focus its attention on the individual child. The school must understand the processes and rates of each child's learning, as well as the ways in which his environment affects him.

The public school system is the foundation of our democracy. It is also the product of our democracy - something which parents, business leaders, statesmen, and even teachers sometimes forget. In praising or condemning today's education, they forget that good public schools foster a democratic society, and that a democratic society produces good public schools. The nation's schools constitute the one magnificent synthesizer of all the American people. The church, fraternal orders with their many separate branches, and even the Democratic and Republican parties are exclusive clubs in comparison with the schools. Schools mean equal opportunities for all, regardless of race, religion, or social background. Schools provide all children with opportunities for self-realization. It is no accident that where public schools are impoverished, where teachers are poorly prepared, and where

educational standards are low, corruption, low health standards, and extremes of poverty will be found.

Schools necessarily reflect their communities. There is a limit beyond which they cannot move in advance of the intellectual, social and moral standards of their public. If the strongest pressures in the town are toward athletics and entertainment, stadiums and auditoriums will supersede classrooms on the building agenda. Financially, the limits of the public schools are as precisely defined as is a tax statement.

Teachers are a cross section of the community. The school, its children, its parents, and its teachers ARE the community. One cannot point to a school as one would to a pipe factory, saying, "In there our education is being done by 40 teachers and 1,000 children". Children are the raw material of the schools. They are no better material and no worse than their hereditaries, their homes, and their communities have made them.

The school in a community is at least as much a thing of the adults as it is of the children of that community. Where one finds the best run public schools doing the most effective job for children, one finds behind them a school-conscious, informed, and actively cooperative public. Supervisory Union No. 7 has had such a public to a high degree. Maintaining and strengthening this liaison between the public and its classrooms is a responsibility of teachers, administrators, and, in fact, all school personnel.

Many people ask, "What should the schools teach?" Would that there were a simple answer to this question that would satisfy everyone. But there is none - no more than there was in the days of Aristotle. About 2,300 years ago Aristotle, one of the wisest men who ever lived, wrote. "From the present mode of education we cannot determine with any degree of certainty whether to instruct the child in what will be useful to him in life, or what tends to virtue, or what is excellent for him to know. All these things have their separate defenders." Aristotle's question about what to teach has never been fully answered by anyone.

The schools in Supervisory Union No. 7 try to teach

well all the three areas mentioned by Aristotle. They teach the basic skills - the 3 R's - for these are necessary and useful. They try to develop character, for only through good character can we survive. They try to pass on to pupils much of the world's accumulated knowledge.

Schools, then are organized to help boys and girls to be competent, well-trained, law-abiding citizens.

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## SCHOOL HEALTH

The objectives of a school health program are to perform the necessary functions to maintain and promote good health of the pupils in our schools. This contributes to the overall success and happiness of the students and enables them to perform better academically.

Services performed include: pre-school clinics every spring for in-coming first graders; checking height and weight of each student at the beginning of each year; testing vision and hearing of all pupils yearly; physical examinations for all students in grades 4, 8, 11, and athletics; immunizations as necessary; annual skin tests for T. B. in grades 1, 4, 8, 12, and personnel; and continuous supervision of general health.

Beginning last year, a dental health clinic was initiated, whereby children in the elementary grades of low income families are able to take advantage of dental care for filling of permanent teeth and/or extractions for relief of pain. This clinic is held one morning a week and five children are cared for each time. Since several schools are involved, the clinics are rotated among them.

Generally speaking, the overall program of school health in this area is adequate, but as in all things,

there are areas for improvement. It is hoped that by everyone working together these can be realized to the mutual benefit of our students and community as a whole.

### MAINTENANCE REPAIRS

At the West Stewartstown Building extensive renovations were made in the music room. Included in the work done was the replacement of large outside windows on the south side of the room with smaller ones, lowering of the ceiling and the installation of more modern lighting.

In addition to the major renovations, the interior of the building was painted with fireproof paint, the outside of the building painted, the repairing and painting of the side porches, and painting of the basement floors.

General repair on grounds and buildings was done at the Hollow School Building endeavoring to keep the school property in a good state of maintenance.

### NOTES ON THE BUDGET

As will be noted in the financial section of this report the School Boards' Budget and that recommended by the Budget Committee is \$103,588.00, a substantial increase over the 1966-67 budget of \$94,153.00. Next years estimated income of \$29,000.00 leaves \$74,588.00 to be raised by taxes by the town. Provision for an additional teacher and higher tuition, and transportation costs, for the most part, explain the increase in the budget.

### CONCLUSION

Sincere appreciation is expressed to the members of school board, parents, teachers, and citizens for their assistance and cooperation.
