

TOWN WARRANT

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Stoddard in the County of Cheshire in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Town of Stoddard on Tuesday, the fourteenth day of March, next, at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
- 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.
- 3. To prepare and bring in your ballots for Delegates to the several National Conventions for the nomination of President.
- 4. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for Highways and Bridges for the ensuing year.
- 5. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for snow removal for ensuing year.
- 6. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for the General Expenses of the Highway Department for the ensuing year.
- 7. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate anything for the observance of Old Home Day.
- 8. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate or set aside the sum of eighty-three dollars and eighty-seven cents (\$83.87) for T. R. A., so called.
- 9. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.

- 10. To see if the Town will vote to accept the Trust Fund of Fred E. Nelson of \$1,000.00 for care of cemeteries.
- 11. To see if the Town will vote to accept the Trust Fund of Fred E. Nelson of \$1,000.00 for public Library.
- 12. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the expense of the Fire Department for the ensuing year.
- 13. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$40.00 (1/100th of 1% of the valuation) to the Monadnock Region Association of Southern New Hampshire for issuance and distribution of printed matter, newspaper and magazine advertising, calling attention to the resources and natural advantages of the Town, in cooperation with the other thirty-seven Towns of the Monadnock Region.
- 14. To see if the Town will vote to accept the Provisions of the Municipal Budget Act.
- 15. To see if the Town will vote to petition the State Tax Commission to have an audit made by the Municipal Accounting Division and to make appropriation to cover the expenses of such audit.
- 16. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

REPORT OF SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

To the School Board and Citizens of Stoddard:

I hereby submit my second annual report as Superintendent of Schools.

SCHOOL ORGANIZATION

School Board: Kenneth McClure, Chairman; Mrs. Charles Swain; Mrs. Charles Hill.

Superintendent of Schools: Howard F. Mason, Hillsboro, N. H.

Teacher: Mrs. Bessie Whitcomb, Hillsboro, N. H. School Nurse: Margaret E. Harris, Keene, N. H.

PUPIL DATA

. A very well trained group of pupils participated in the well planned graduating exercises last June at which Richard Mansell and Lawrence Holmes received their diplomas.

Due to illness and a severe winter no pupils were able to maintain perfect attendance for the full year although several did so for two or three terms.

When school opened this fall there were 20 pupils enrolled. Since then various changes have occurred so that the present enrollment is 18.

GENERAL REPORT

Conditions concerning teachers are even worse than they were when I made my previous report. The people of Stoddard should indeed feel fortunate that they are able to retain the services of Mrs. Whitcomb. The school has continued to improve under her direction and now is operating in a satisfactory manner.

Another source of great improvement this year is the janitor work. The Stoddard school is probably cleaner and warmer than any other Rural School in my Union. Mrs. Rutherford deserves great commendation for her servicees in this respect. Keeping the

school room clean and neat serves as an excellent example to the pupils.

Our supply of substitute teachers is nearly exhausted. Neither does it seem possible to find anyone to perform small tasks and repairs at the school. Only through the kindness of Mrs. Prime were we able to find a place for the teacher to board. If we are to continue to run schools in Stoddard people must be willing to pitch in and help.

The pupils are receiving an adequate and thorough know-ledge of the basic requirements of an elementary education. Most of them work enthusiastically on things that they are interested in which of course is not the same for each child. Most of them attend regularly and arrive on time at school. However there are a few parents who, through carelessness or selfishness, still keep pupils out of school for reasons other than illness. It is hoped that this will not continue. My heartfelt gratitude is extended to those parents who have endeavored to keep their children in school every day when school was in session.

I still enjoy working with the School Board who still show a sincere and active interest in maintaining a good school in Stoddard. I also want to thank the P.-T. A. for their continued efforts in helping the school.
