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NH DIVIDED ABOUT TRUMP PRESIDENCY

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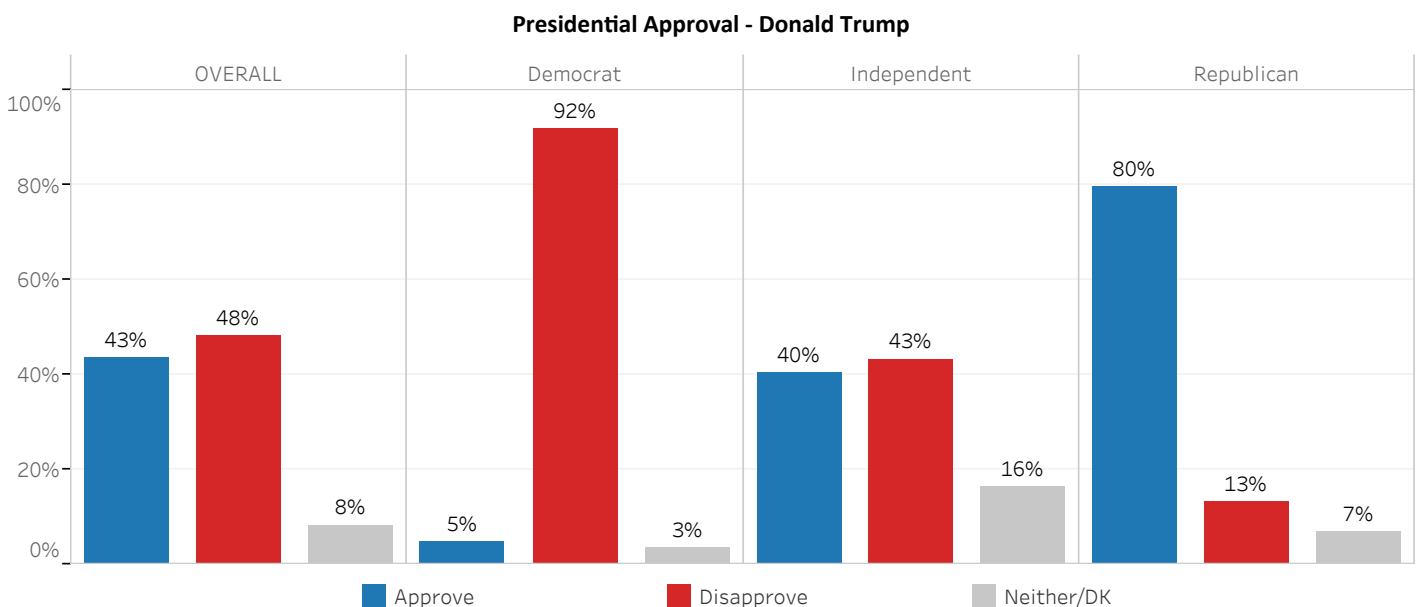
DURHAM, NH – New Hampshire residents are divided in their opinion of President Donald Trump during the early stages of his presidency, in stark contrast to the relatively high approval rating Barack Obama had at this time in his presidency. Granite Staters are also divided on President Trump's immigration order.

These findings are based on the latest **Granite State Poll***, conducted by the University of New Hampshire Survey Center. Five hundred and five (505) randomly selected New Hampshire adults were interviewed by landline and cellular telephone between January 31 and February 8, 2017. The margin of sampling error for the survey is +/- 4.4 percent.

Presidential Approval

In the first Granite State Poll conducted since President Trump's inauguration, less than half of New Hampshire adults approve of his performance so far as President. Currently, 43% of New Hampshire adults say they approve of the job Trump is doing as president, 48% disapprove, and 8% are neutral.

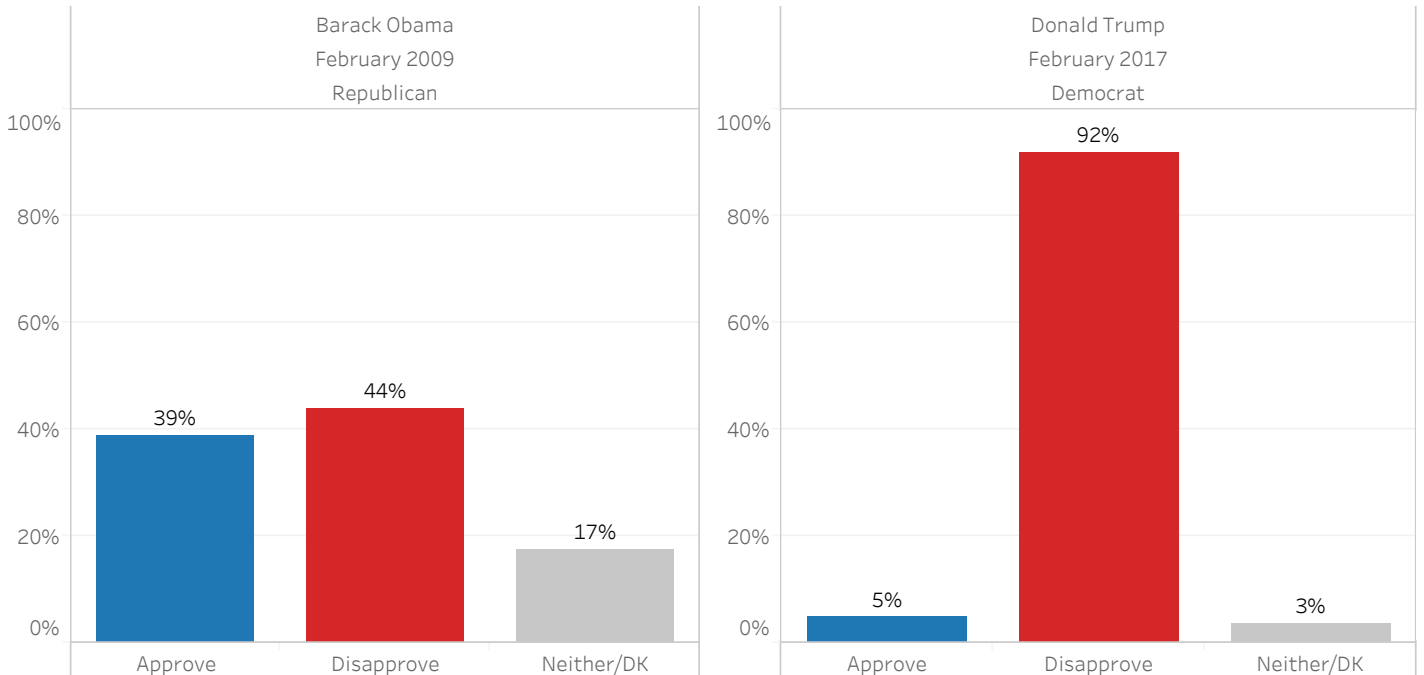
Approval of President Trump is closely tied to partisanship. Four in five Republicans (80%) approve of Trump's performance, but only 40% of Independents and 5% of Democrats approve. Those who frequently listen to conservative radio (90% approve), those who attend religious services at least once a week (67%), and North Country residents (57%) are most likely to approve of Trump's performance, while those who did not vote in the 2016 presidential election (78% disapprove), those who have completed postgraduate work (63%), women (59%), and Central/Lakes Region residents (58%) are most likely to disapprove.

The connection between partisanship and approval of the President's job performance is significantly higher for Trump than at the outset of President Obama's first term in 2009. Republicans at the time were closely divided in their opinion of Obama's performance as President (44% disapproved, 39% approved). By contrast, Trump faces much stronger disapproval among Democrats (92%) at the same point in his presidency.

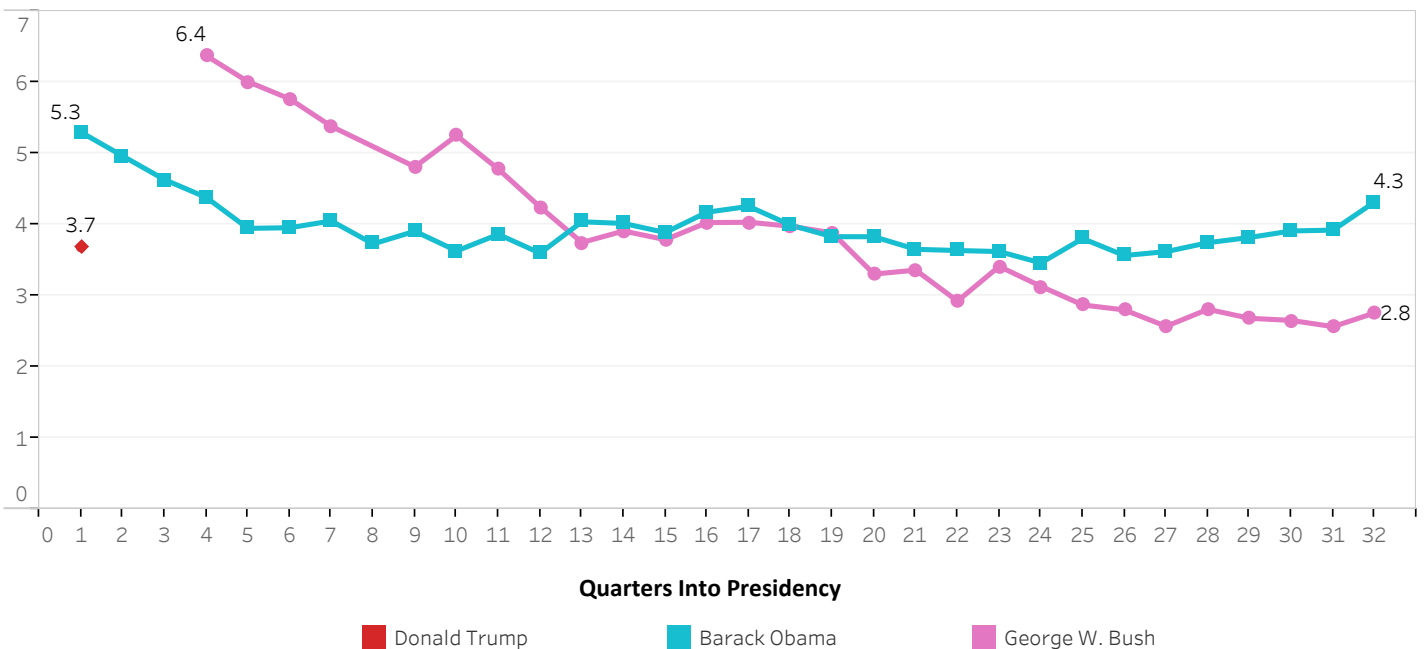
Presidential Approval Among Opposition Party At 1 Month - Barack Obama & Donald Trump



On a scale where "strongly approve" equals 7 and "strongly disapprove" equals 1, Trump begins his presidency with an approval score (3.7) well below that of his predecessor, Barack Obama (5.3). Both President Obama and President George W. Bush then experienced significant declines in approval within the first seven quarters of their presidencies.

(7=Strongly Approve, 1= Strongly Disapprove)



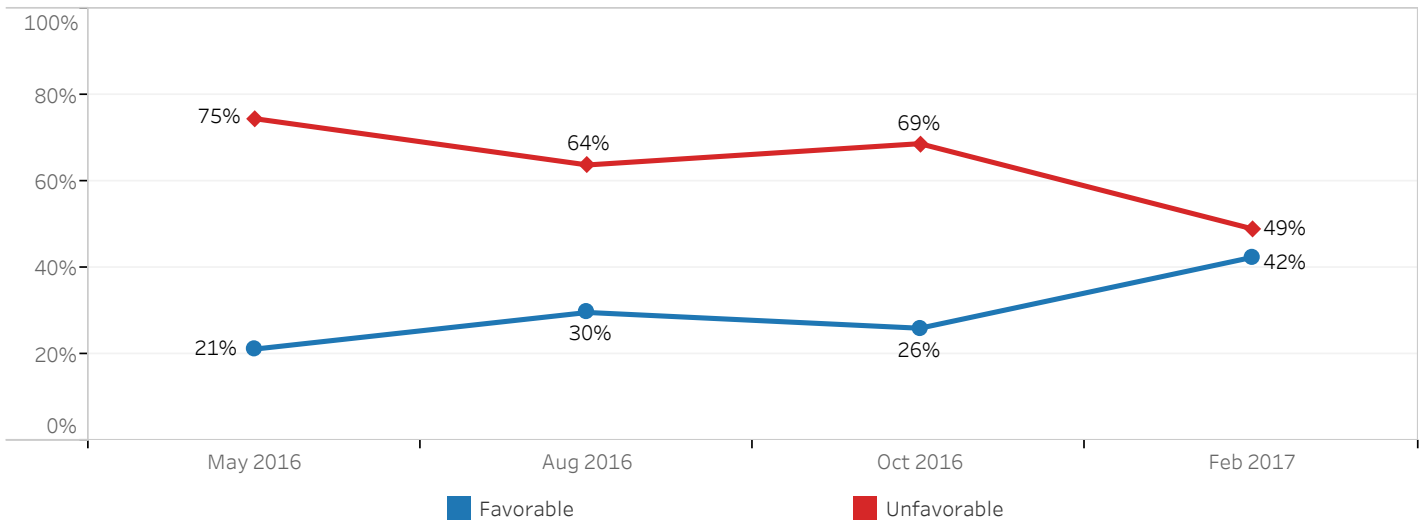
Favorability Ratings - President Donald Trump

While Trump remains unpopular among New Hampshire adults, his favorability rating has risen considerably since the 2016 campaign. Trump is currently viewed favorably by 42% of Granite Staters, 49% have an unfavorable opinion of him, and 6% are neutral. Trump's net favorability rating, the percentage having a favorable opinion minus the percentage having an unfavorable opinion, is -7%, which is significantly higher than in October (-43%).

Nearly four in five Republicans (79%) and 37% of Independents have a favorable opinion of Trump, both significantly higher than these groups reported in October 2016 when only 58% of Republicans and 20% of Independents had a favorable view of him. The percentage of Democrats who say they view Trump favorably (4%) remains unchanged.

Those who frequently listen to conservative radio (82% favorable), North Country residents (66%), those with a high school degree or less (55%), and men (52%) are most likely to have a favorable opinion of Trump, while those who did not vote in 2016 (74% unfavorable), Central/Lakes Region residents (64%), those who never attend religious services (63%), and women (61%) are least likely to have an unfavorable opinion of Trump.

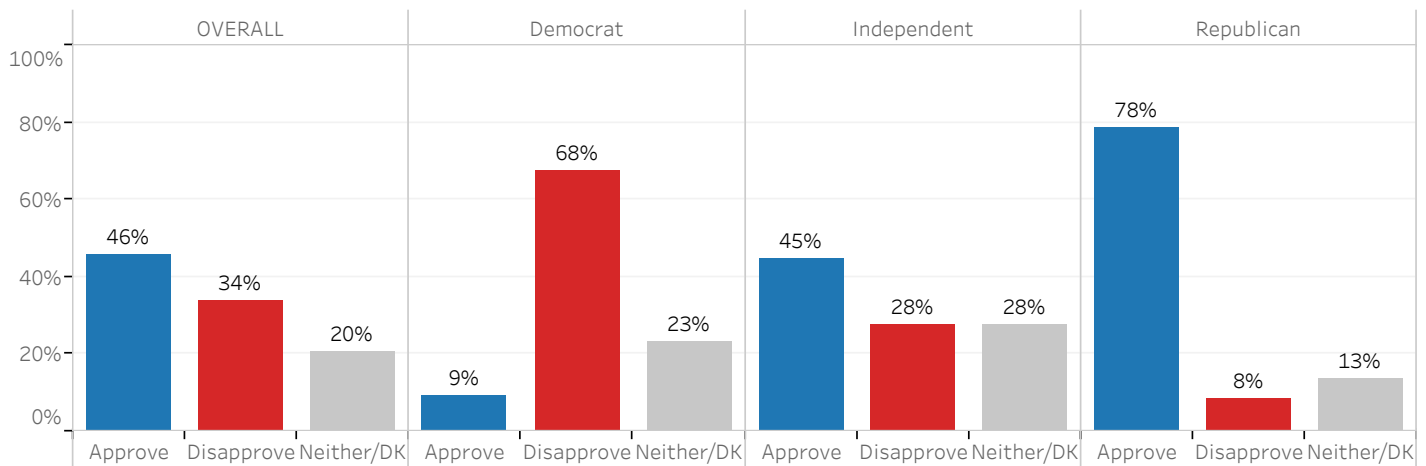
Favorability - Donald Trump



Economic Approval Rating

As Trump begins his presidency, a plurality of Granite Staters approve of his handling of the economy. Currently, 46% approve of how Trump is handling the economy, 34% disapprove, and 20% are neutral or unsure. Republicans (78%) are far more likely than Independents (45%) or Democrats (9%) to say they approve of Trump's economic performance so far.

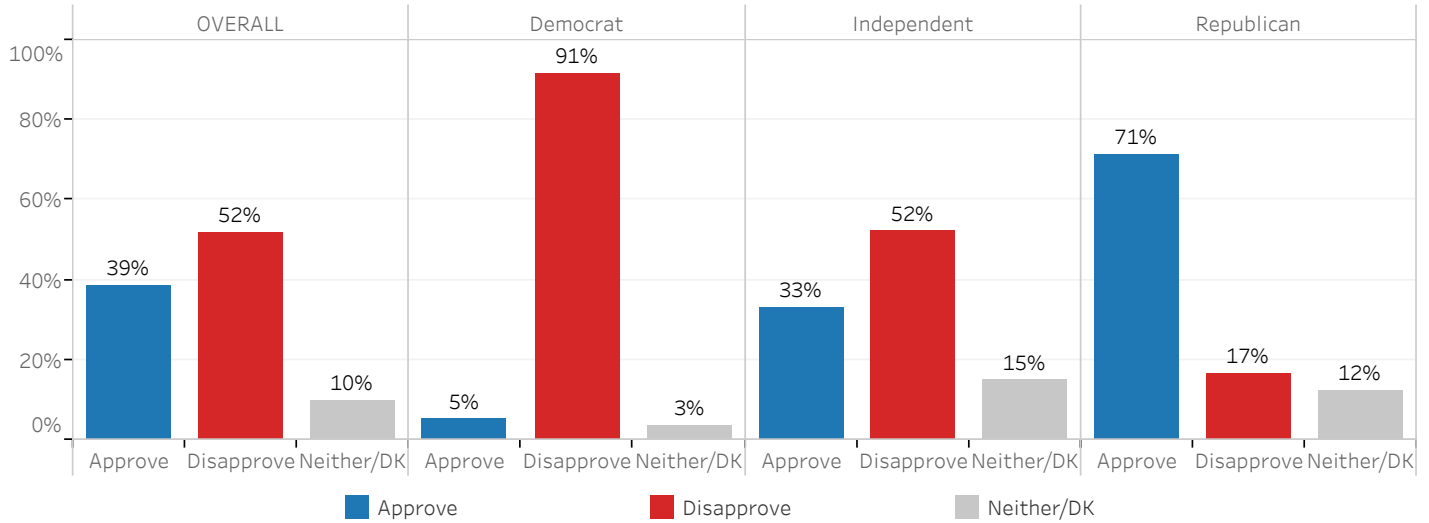
Trump Approval - Handling the Economy



Foreign Affairs

Approval of Trump's handling of foreign affairs is considerably lower than approval for his handling of economic affairs and is linked even more closely with partisanship. Currently, 39% of New Hampshire adults approve of how Trump is handling foreign affairs, 52% disapprove, and 10% are neutral. Seventy-one percent of Republicans approve of Trump's performance in foreign affairs, but only 33% of Independents and 5% of Democrats do so.

Trump Approval - Foreign Affairs

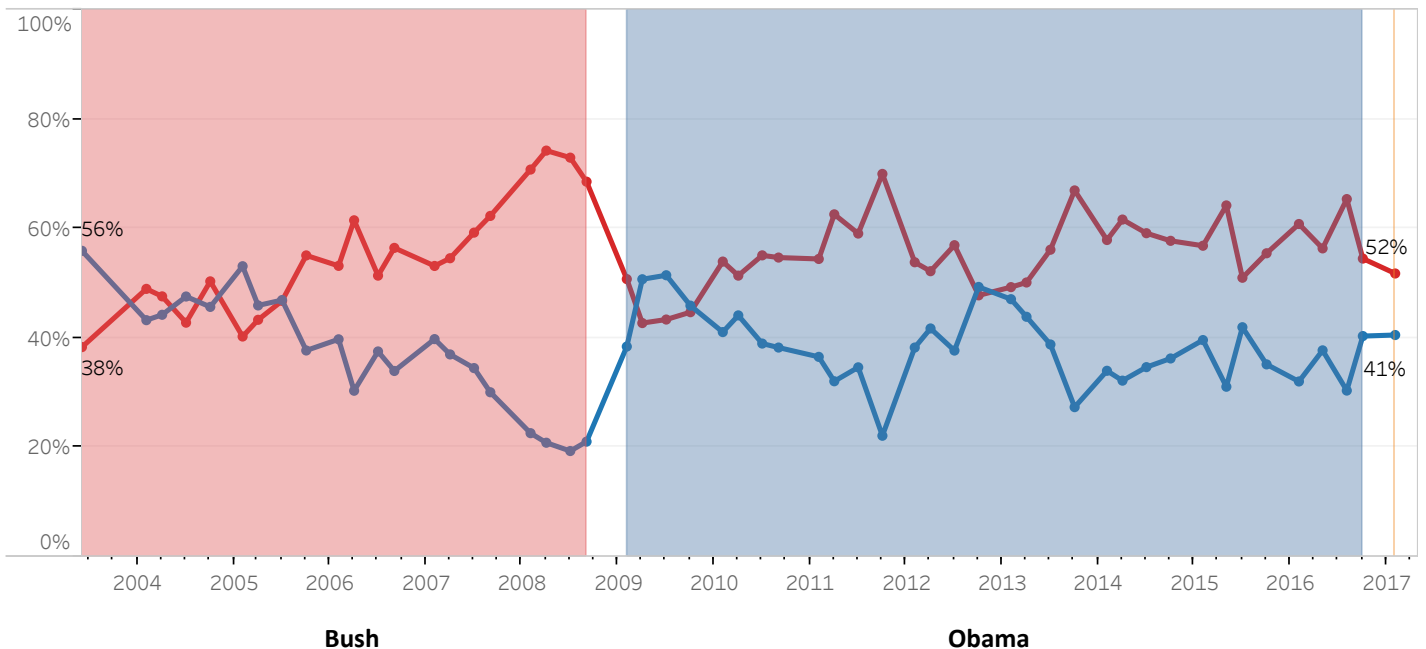


Right Track – Wrong Track

Overall, New Hampshire residents continue to be slightly pessimistic about the direction the country is heading. Forty-one percent (41%) of New Hampshire adults think things in this country are generally going in the right direction, 52% think things are seriously off on the wrong track, and 8% don't know or are unsure.

The Trump administration has changed how New Hampshire Democrats and Republicans feel about the direction of the country. In October 2016, 72% of Democrats felt the country was heading in the right direction but only 9% say so in February of 2017. By contrast, only 10% of Republicans in October 2016 felt the country was heading in the right direction but 68% say so in February of 2017.

US Heading in Right Direction or On Wrong Track



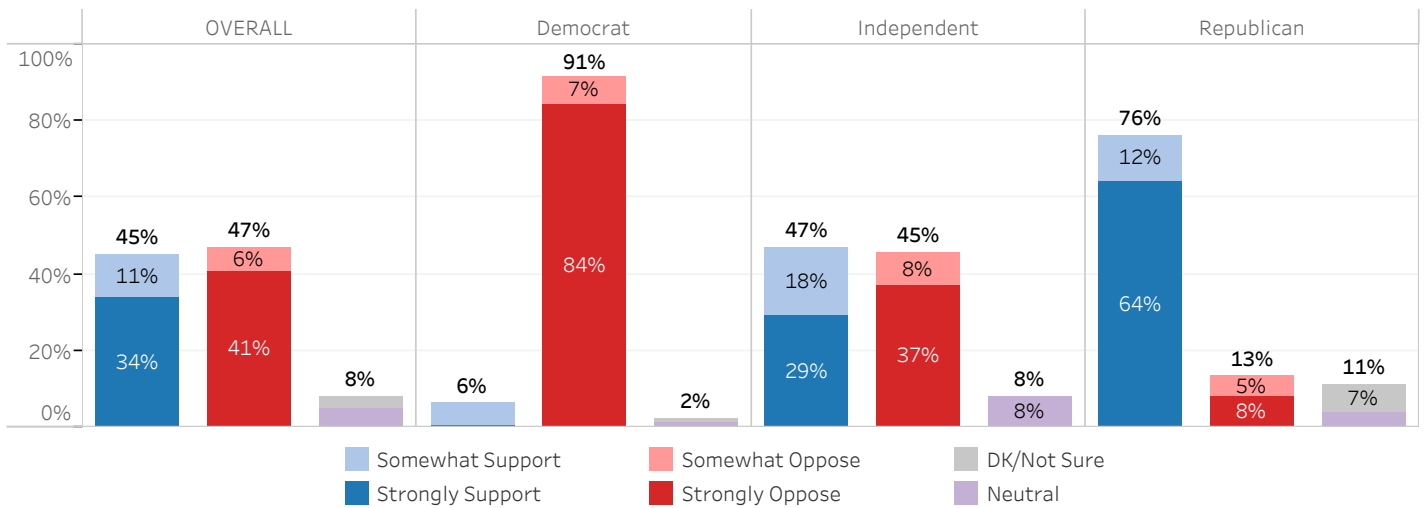
Immigration Restrictions

Respondents were asked their opinion on the temporary block on visas prohibiting residents of Syria, Iraq, Iran, Libya, Somalia, Sudan and Yemen from entering the United States until the federal government improves its ability to screen out potential terrorists from coming here. Half of respondents were asked about this topic without any additional context, while the other half were informed that President Trump had enacted this policy through an executive order and then asked for their opinion.

New Hampshire residents are sharply divided in their opinion of the temporary block on visas when not provided any additional context. Forty-five percent of respondents strongly (34%) or somewhat (11%) support such a measure, while 47% strongly (41%) or somewhat (6%) oppose it. Eight percent say they are neutral on the subject (5%) or don't know or are unsure (3%).

Like other issues, responses are closely linked to partisan affiliation. Ninety-one percent of Democrats oppose these immigration restrictions while 76% of Republicans support them. Independents are divided, with 47% supporting the restrictions and 45% opposing them.

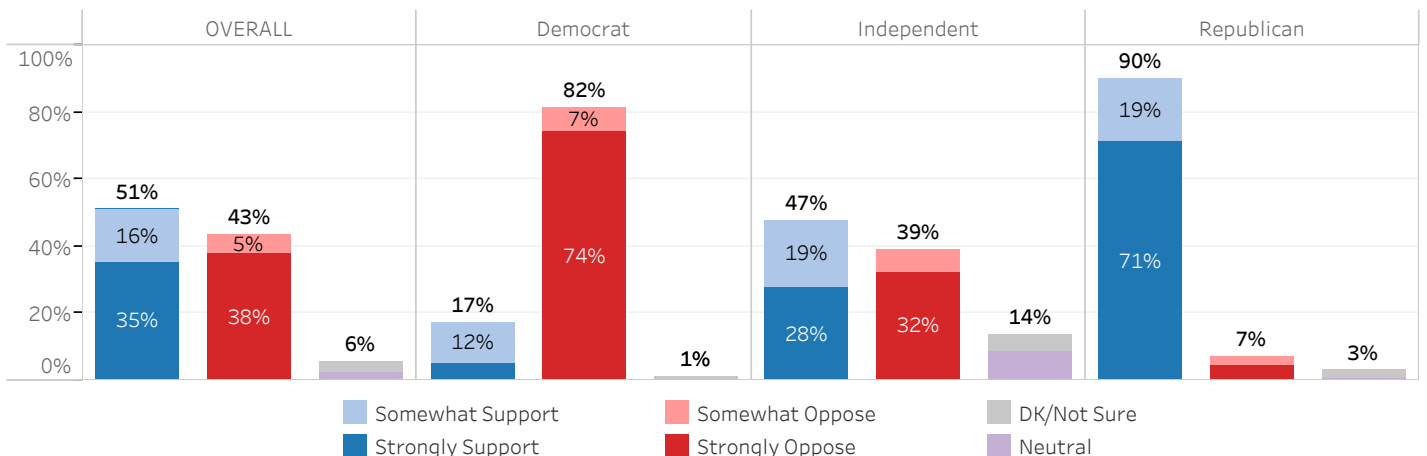
Opinion on Immigration Restrictions Without Trump Context



Support for these immigration restrictions is somewhat higher among respondents when they are provided with the additional context that the immigration restrictions were enacted by President Trump through an executive order. Fifty-one percent of respondents strongly (35%) or somewhat (16%) support this policy while 43% strongly (38%) or somewhat (5%) oppose it. Three percent are neutral while another 3% don't know or are unsure.

Among those who were told the immigration restrictions were enacted by President Trump, a slightly lower percentage of Democrats said they opposed them (82%) than among those who did not receive this information (91%), while a slightly larger proportion of Republicans (90%) supported the restrictions than among those who were asked without linking the issue to Trump (76%).

Granite State Poll Methodology

These findings are based on the latest Granite State Poll, conducted by the University of New Hampshire Survey Center. Five hundred and five (505) randomly selected New Hampshire adults were interviewed in English by landline and cellular telephone between January 31 and February 8, 2017. The margin of sampling error for the survey is +/- 4.4 percent. These MSE's have not been adjusted for design effect. The design effect for the survey is 1.2%.

The random sample used in the Granite State Poll was purchased from Marketing Systems Group (MSG), Horsham, PA. MSG screens each selected telephone number to eliminate non-working numbers, disconnected numbers, and business numbers to improve the efficiency of the sample, reducing the amount of time interviewers spend calling non-usable numbers.

The data have been weighted to adjust for numbers of adults and telephone lines within households. Additionally, data were weighted by respondent sex, age, education, and region of the state to targets from the most recent American Community Survey (ACS) conducted by the U.S. Census Bureau. In addition to potential sampling error, all surveys have other potential sources of non-sampling error including question order effects, question wording effects, and non-response. Due to rounding, percentages may not sum to 100%. The number of respondents in each demographic below may not equal the number reported in cross-tabulation tables as some respondents choose not to answer some questions.
