WARRANT FOR THE ANNUAL TOWN MEETING

THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

(L. S.)

To the inhabitants of the Town of Webster, in the County of Merrimack, in said State, qualified to vote in town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at Grange Hall in said Webster on Tuesday, the 14th day of March, next at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.
3. To raise and appropriate such sums of money as may be necessary for the maintenance of highways and bridges.
 - a. Summer Maintenance
 - b. Winter Maintenance
 - c. Tar Roads
 - d. General Expense of Highway Department
 - e. Street Lighting
4. To raise and appropriate the sum of \$530.73 for Class V road construction.
5. To raise and appropriate such sums of money as may be necessary for public welfare.
 - a. Town Poor
 - b. Old Age Assistance
6. To raise and appropriate such sums of money as may be necessary for the support of the town library.

7. To raise and appropriate such sums of money as may be necessary for patriotic purposes.

a. Old Home Day

b. Memorial Day

8. To raise and appropriate such sums of money as may be necessary for the support and maintenance of the Hy-Mar Fire Department, including forest fires.

9. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the care of cemeteries.

10. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$400 for use in the connection with the state program for the eradication of White Pine Blister Rust.

11. To see if the town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$128.00 toward the operating deficit of the Concord Hospital, this amount being based on the number of patients admitted from Webster.

12. To authorize and empower the Board of Selectmen to borrow for the town, by the issuance of notes, a sum not exceeding \$20,000 in anticipation of taxes for the year 1961, said notes payable from said taxes within one year from the date of issuance, and to authorize the Board of Selectmen to determine the rate of interest on such notes and to provide for the sale thereof.

13. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$100 for the maintenance of the playground.

14. To see if the town will vote to raise \$25 to be expended in cooperation with the New Hampshire Forestry and Recreation Commission for the opening and maintaining of trails and old trails and old roads for forest fire protection. The New Hampshire Forestry and Recreation Commission to provide a matching sum not in excess of \$25 for this purpose.

15. To authorize and empower the Board of Selectmen to make all necessary contracts and agreements, on behalf of the town, with the Daniel Webster Grange for the purchase of the Grange Hall and the land upon which it stands, for the sum of One Dollar, for the use of a community building.

16. To see if the town will vote to use whatever amount is necessary of the Town Hall Sale Fund, on deposit in Savings Banks, to purchase and remodel the Daniel Webster Grange Hall.

17. To elect a committee to draw up plans to remodel the building mentioned in Article Number 16.

18. To transact any other business that may legally come before the meeting.

THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the School District in the town of Webster, qualified to vote in district affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Grange Hall in said district on the 14th day of March 1961, at 1:00 o'clock in the afternoon to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose a Moderator for the coming year.
2. To choose a Clerk for the ensuing year.
3. To choose a Member of the School Board for the ensuing year.
4. To choose a Member of the School Board for the ensuing three years.
5. To choose a Treasurer for the ensuing year.
6. To determine and appoint the salaries of the School Board and Truant Officer, and fix the compensations of any other officers or agents of the district.
7. To hear the reports of Agents, Auditors, Committees, or officers chosen, and pass any vote relating thereto.
8. To choose Agents, Auditors and Committees in relation to any subject embraced in this warrant.
9. To see what sum of money the district will raise and appropriate for the support of schools, for the salaries of school district officials and agents, and for the payment of statutory obligations of the district and to authorize the application against said appropriation of such sums as are estimated to be received from

the state foundation aid fund together with other income: the school board to certify to the selectmen the balance between the estimated revenue and the appropriations, which balance is to be raised by taxes by the town.

10. To see if Webster School District will vote to authorize the construction of an addition to the Webster Central School.

11. To see if the Webster School District will vote to appropriate \$35,000 or such sum as the district may determine, for the construction and equipment of an addition to the Webster Central School.

12. To see if the Webster School District will vote to authorize the School Board to issue serial notes or bonds in the amount of \$35,000 or such sum as the district may determine, for the construction and equipment of an addition to the Webster Central School, and to authorize the School Board to determine the time and place of payment and the rate of interest on such notes or bonds, to provide for the sale thereto and to do any and all such acts as they may deem necessary to the issuance, in accordance with the provisions of the Municipal Finance Act — N.H. Revised Statutes Annotated, Chapter 33 and any amendments thereto.

13. To see if the Webster School District will vote to elect a building committee.

14. To see if the Webster School District will vote to authorize the school board, acting on the advice of the building committee, to enter into all contracts necessary for the construction and equipment of the addition to the Webster Central School.

15. To see if the district will vote to authorize the school board to make applications for and to receive in the name of the district such advances, grants-in-aid

or other funds for educational purposes as may now or hereafter be forth coming from the United States Government and/or State Agencies.

For the first time in my fourteen years as superintendent of the Webster Schools, we have three teachers in our school. We returned Mrs. Mabel M. Anderson as Principal and teacher of the first and second grades, and Mrs. Ethel H. Colby as teacher of grades six, seven and eight. We were most fortunate to be able to get Mrs. Rebecca D. Makin as teacher of grades three, four and five. These three teachers work well together, and have improved our program considerably. The fifth grade is much better being with the younger children, and having the first and second grades separate enables the teacher to give them much more individual attention.

This is the best arrangement of classes that we could have under the conditions. Grades one and two work well together. My only criticism is that the room being used is too small to permit much activity by the children. Mothers, I am sure will understand this particular problem, if they remember having the children home on a rainy day. The first hour or two it's not so bad, but then if they don't have a chance to use up some of the nervous energy, they will drive adults to distraction.

The planning committee has been very active since the last meeting. Under the leadership of Sidney Taylor the committee has come up with a very workable program for expansion of the school. Although some people may want to settle for one room, I am convinced that, on the basis of our census figures, two rooms would be better than one. The figures indicate we will have close to a hundred pupils by 1965. Also I have a feeling that the expansion from Concord which has been affecting Hopkinton so much is going to have its affect on Webster. It is a good town to raise children in and many people are looking for just such a community. There are some disadvantages of

living in a small community, but I feel that they are more than offset by the advantages.

I enjoy visiting Webster and although I don't see too much of the parents, I enjoy the children very much. They are grand children and they deserve the best.

WEBSTER SCHOOL BUILDING STUDY COMMITTEE REPORT

In carrying out the wishes of a majority of the voters at the 1960 School District Meeting, this Committee has formed several conclusions in its efforts to "present the facts" at the 1961 School District Meeting. These come from many meetings with interested town's people, local and state education officials, architects, financial men and others.

Briefly, the courses of action open to the town are:

1. To do nothing. This will contribute the use of the cafeteria as a necessary classroom and the serving of hot lunches outside the school building. The latter practice presents serious questions of child safety.

2. To transport all the children over the 6th. grade to some other town. Had this been the policy during the past year, the cost of transportation and tuition would have been \$6000 more than the present costs. Also the town might be faced with an emergency building program should this privilege be withdrawn for any reason in the future.

3. To authorize the building of one classroom to be ready for use in the fall of 1961. This will cost about \$21,000 and will include heating, toilet facilities, an enlarged cafeteria and kitchen, together with a provision for a double classroom-assembly room by the opening of a separating partition between the existing south-east classroom and the new classroom.

4. To authorize the building of one classroom as outlined in #3 with the provision that the second room be added at a later date. Enrollment is expected to be at least 96 pupils by the fall of 1965 when this fourth room will be needed. This program is estimated to

cost about \$5,000 more than #5. The increase results primarily from the two stage construction operation.

5. To authorize the building of two classrooms: one to be ready for occupancy by the fall of 1961 and the second to be readied by the fall of 1965 when the 96 anticipated enrollment will be reached. The cost of the added room, plus the features noted in #3 is estimated at \$34,000.

Assuming that the town will adopt one of the three construction plans, and that the rate of principal repayment of construction loans will be the same as at present (\$3,000 yearly), then the interest charges for #3 will be \$2,950 over the 7 year period: \$5,100 for #4 for the two stage program if the second stage is not started until 1967: and \$7,260 for #5 during the 11 year period. We point out that if principal payments are larger than \$3,000 yearly, the interest total will be proportionately less.

The proposed changes in the existing school building are shown on the drawings prepared by Mr. John R. Holbrook. The State Board of Education has approved these preliminary plans and, as a result the town can expect a 30% yearly principal reimbursement if the voters decide to act favorably on one of the suggestions: No. 3, No. 4 or No. 5.

Members of the School Committee are prepared to answer in greater detail any questions that may arise concerning this report.

We appreciate the time and effort given without cost to the town by those who have assisted us in obtaining the information in this report.

Based on our study of the facts, this Committee suggests that both classrooms be authorized by the voters as well as larger principal payments as the most eco-

nomical solution to the prevailing and future crowded school conditions.
