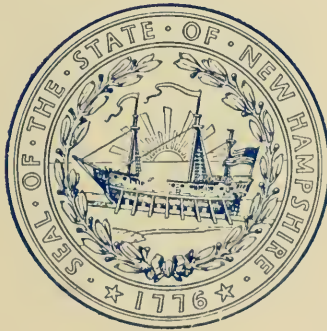

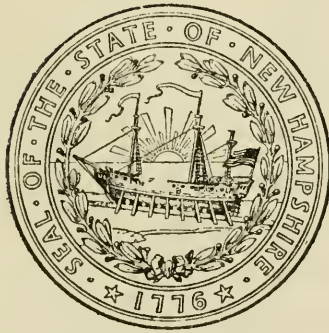

## TOWN WARRANT

### The State of New Hampshire

To the inhabitants of the Town of Alexandria, in the County of Grafton in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town House in said Alexandria on Tuesday, the Ninth day of March, next at twelve noon to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary town officers for the year ensuing. Polls will open at twelve noon and may not be closed before six P. M. (Business meeting at 7:30 P. M.)

2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.

3. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$955.29 for T.R.A. (the State to furnish the sum of \$6,368.63).

4 To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of \$2,000.00 to be added to the Capital Reserve Fund for the future purchase of road equipment.

5. To see what sum the Town will raise and appropriate for the Bristol Community Center.

6. To see what sum the Town will raise and appropriate for the Lakes Region Mental Health Center.

7. To see what sum the Town will raise and appropriate for the sealing and summer maintenance of highways and repairing bridges for the ensuing year.

8. To see what sum the Town will raise and appropriate for the maintenance of roads in winter.

9. To see if the Town will vote to ban, in Alexandria, the use of chemical defoliant 2, 4, D (Dichlorophenoxyacetic Acid) and 2, 4, 5, T (Trichlorophenoxyacetic Acid).

10. To see if the Town will vote to ban, in Alexandria, the application from the air of all chemical defoliant and herbicides.

11. To see if the Town will vote to require written permission from the selectmen to use chemical defoliant and herbicides for other than home use.

12. To see what sum the Town will raise and appropriate for the care of cemeteries.

13. To see what sum the Town will raise and appropriate for the Newfound Chamber of Commerce.



14. To see what sum the Town will raise for the Newfound Area Nursing Association.

15. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.

16. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$500.00 for the Alexandria Volunteer Fire Department.

17. To see what sum the Town will raise and appropriate for the construction of a town equipment building.

18. To transact any other business that may legally come before this meeting.

## REPORT OF FOREST FIRE WARDEN AND DISTRICT CHIEF

During this past year, the public has shown a great deal of cooperation in the prevention of fires. We wish to express our thanks for a job well done.

Your forest fire warden's job would be easier if everyone understood the State laws that govern the kindling of outdoor fires, a synopsis of these laws follow.

### Fire Permits

A fire permit is needed for all outdoor fires in or near woodland anytime the ground is not covered with snow. This includes household waste burning, even if in an incinerator, grass burning, garden trash as well as brush burning (*such burning is restricted by regulation to be prior to 9:00 A.M. and after 5:00 P.M.*)

An Air Pollution regulation forbids the burning of household waste in towns where such rubbish is collected by the town.

### Exceptions

Commercial or industrial burning is allowed under normal conditions with permission of the District Fire Chief and a permit from the Fire Warden.

Camp or cooking fires are allowed on your own property with permission of the Fire Warden. On another's property with written permission of the landowner and permission of the Fire Warden. The Warden can forbid such fires if in a hazardous area. Permits for cooking fires in the White

Mountain National Forest can be obtained from the Laconia Office or at the Ranger Stations. Permits are not required in public camp or picnic grounds where fireplaces have been built for this purpose.

## NEWFOUND AREA NURSING ASSOCIATION

January 1, 1970 through December 31, 1970

A full time visiting nurse service was started on July 1, 1969. The Newfound Area Nursing Association became Medicare certified on August 20, 1969. It is supported by contributions from the four-town area which it covers: Bristol, Bridgewater, New Hampton and Alexandria. The office is located in the Bristol Medical Center. Twenty-four hour coverage is available in the event of emergencies. When the Visiting Nurse is making calls, the telephone is covered by an answering service located in the Community Service Office from 9:00 A.M. to 4:00 P.M. This year NANA purchased a new black Jade Maverick to be used by the Visiting Nurse. It can be easily identified by NANA's own gold insignia painted on the side and the identification number plate NANA1. The nursing staff has increased with the addition of two part-time nurses. The total number of nursing visits for 1970 was 1585, with the break down as follows:

Skilled nursing care visits:	1303
Physiotherapy visits:	61
Health promotion - no charge visits:	218
Consultation visits:	3

These nursing visits covered all age groups with a varied number of problems as can be seen by the following: 17 visits were made to age group newborns to 1 yr.; 31 visits to children 1 to 4 yrs.; 37 visits to age group 5 - 17 yrs.; ten visits to age group 18 to 20 yrs.; 107 visits to age group 20 to 44 yrs.; 235 to age group 45 to 64, and 1148 visits to people 65 and over.

**Auditor's Opinion**

I have examined the balance sheet of the Newfound Area Nursing Association as of December 31, 1970 and the related statement of income for the year then ended. My examination was made in accordance with generally accepted auditing standards and accordingly included such tests of the accounting records and such other auditing procedures as I considered necessary in the circumstances.

Although I did not confirm the accounts receivable, I satisfied myself that the amount shown, \$2,666.00, represents amounts due from individuals, the State of New Hampshire, and Medicare for nursing services rendered.

Subject to the preceding comment, in my opinion the accompanying balance sheet and statement of income present fairly the financial position of the Newfound Area Nursing Association at December 31, 1970 and the results of its operations for the year then ended, in conformity with generally accepted accounting principles.
