

A motion was made and carried at the March meeting, 1959, that authorized the retiring Moderator "to erect street and highway signs, choose his own assistants and be given full authority in the use of names based upon his findings and research." In compliance with this mandate, I am pleased to present the following report:

The report consists of a map and a glossary of the selected names. The individual descriptions include the name, the location with reference to the map, the date of authorization, and the reasons for the selection. The map designations refer to the intersection of the horizontal (E-W) and the vertical (N-S) axes at which the ends of the road are located. For example the Raymond road extends from 6F to 5L as indicated.

Many sources were used in the research; these included the History of Chester, by Benjamin Chase, text and map; the U. S. G. S. quadrangles for this region, and suggestions by many citizens to whom thanks are due.

GLOSSARY OF ROADS

ALLEN AVENUE: 5B; Cross street from Candia Road to Wellington Road.

BUNKER HILL ROAD: 11J-7G; 1755, from Chester Road (11J) to top of hill (8J), 1764, from (8J) to Chester Road (7G). The road and hill were named at a celebration commemorating the 50th anniversary of the Battle of Bunker Hill.

CALEF ROAD: 11H-10I; 1747; named for one of the earliest settlers at the Longmeadow.

CANDIA ROAD: 6B-2G; parts of this road were authorized at different times between 1801 and 1838. This is a part of highway 101.

CAT PATH: 8D-8C; 1792. This is an extension of the Spofford road to the Deerneck Bridge.

CHESTER ROAD: 11K-5B; 1738, from Chester line to Beaver pond; 1743 to the Village, the date of authorization for the shore road to Route 101 is not available. This is part of highway 101. The southern section was the first road established in the town.

CHESTER TURNPIKE: 8K-2G; 1805. This was a private toll road that became a public highway in 1838.

COLMAN ROAD: 6J-7I; 1801, from the Bunker Hill Road to the Eaton Road; 1805, from there to the Tollgate Corner. Named with reference to the family that lived on the road for over 100 years.

COTTAGE AVENUE: 5C; Dead-end street near intersection of the Rail Road and Chester Road.

CROMBIE ROAD: 3E; from Hooksett Road to Oswego Bridge. Named for early settlers.

DEARBORN ROAD: 8J-3J; 1755, from Bunker Hill Road to Dearborn Mill site; 1762, from mill site to Candia line. The section from Milestone Corner (Brien's) to the town line was formerly known as the Murry Road. The location of this road as were many others in town was determined by the availability of water power.

DERNECK LANE: 10O; This is a private road leading from the Londonderry Turnpike to the cottages on the lake shore.

DEPOT ROAD: 4E-2F; 1750 from Hooksetts Road to the mill site; 1763 extended to near the Candia Road. The name refers to the departed railroad depot.

EATON ROAD: 6I-5F; 1801, from Colman Road toward "Kent Place". The remainder was authorized in 1819.

GARDNER ROAD: 9J-9K; 1803. This was part of a longer road that led from the Clark Place in Chester to the Bunker Hill Road.

GOSPEL PATH: 7J-5L; 1840. It was built to connect North Chester with the Dearborn saw mill. The name refers to its use in going to church.

GRIFFIN ROAD: 5F-4F; 1773. This road leads from the School House to the Depot over Campbell's Bridge. Named for the family who lived there for over 150 years.

HOOKE ROAD: 3H; 1805. This road was built to connect the Turnpike with the Murry Mill. It was named for the first family to settle in that area.

HOOKSETT ROAD: 6F-1A; 1726. The primary location of the road is obscure, but it together with the Chester Road from the Village southward was the earliest road laid out in Auburn. The following quotation from Chase's history in which the author cites the original warrant states that certain men "were chosen a committee to go out and clear a sufficient cartway to Penny Cook, the nighest and best way they can from Haverhill" also "to search out a way from the place where Chester Meeting house stands to Penny Cook and mark the same."

HUNTING ROAD: 10G-9H; 1749. This road originally was a part of the present Spofford Road.

LONDONDERRY TURNPIKE (BYP 28): 6B-15F; 1806. It was authorized as a private toll road. In 1838 it became a public highway, a victim of the invention of the steam locomotive.

LOVERS LANE: 9H-7H; 1792. This is a connecting link between the Bunker Hill Road and Chester Road. The reasons for the name need no comment.

NEAL AVENUE AND NEAL STREET: 5B; Cross streets from Candia Road to Wellington Road.

NUTT ROAD: 13H-12F; 1840. Named in honor of John and William Nutt who were the first settlers in the area

PINGREY HILL ROAD: 15J-13H; 1740 - 1747, named for early settlers.

PRESCOTT LANE: 3F-2F, from Candia Road to Depot Road. Named for early families in the vicinity.

RATTLESNAKE HILL ROAD: 11H-12C; 1748. The location was changed from time to time until 1792 when it was established in its present position.

RAYMOND ROAD: 6F-5L; In 1846 the section from the Village to the Milestone Corner (Brien's) was authorized; the remainder in 1867. The western part has been known as the Meadow Road, the eastern part as the Birch Road.

READING STREET: 5B; Cross street between Candia Road and Wellington Road.

SENDER ROAD: 15G-13H; 1760. Chase's History refers to it by this name.

SILVER HILL ROAD: 13H-12J; 1756 named for the nearby hill.

SPOFFORD ROAD: 9D-13H; 1747 from McKinley's Corner to No. 4 School corner. The western end was authorized in 1749. Named in honor of an early settler.

STEAM-MILL ROAD: 15F-14G; 1849. The name refers to the first mill in this region that was powered by steam. It was built by a stock company in 1847.

TOWER HILL ROAD: 3E-2E; 1822. The name is obvious.

WELLINGTON ROAD: 5B. This is a section of the Manchester highway. It was once known as the Bald Hill Road.

WILSON'S CROSSING ROAD: 9H-15F. Sections were authorized at different times, its purpose was to connect the southwest part of Auburn with Londonderry and the Rail Road.

PREVENTION IS EVERYBODY'S BUSINESS

The year 1959 was fortunate from a forest fire standpoint. New Hampshire had the best record in the nation. Fewer acres were burned, suppression costs were substantially reduced and damage to woodlands held to a minimum. The record resulted from a combination of favorable weather conditions, an alert warden service and a cooperating public.

Yet, despite all this, there still persists a disturbing note:

58%, or 6 out of every 10 fires in 1959 were caused by careless smokers

10%, or 1 out of every 9 fires was caused by children.

Careless, indifferent, thoughtless and independent minded individuals and failure of parents to properly supervise children and keep matches out of their reach, annually cause these unnecessary fires which cost large sums to extinguish and cause extensive damage. The elimination of these three causes of fires would radically change this picture. The rules are simple -

1. Before burning, secure a permit from your local forest fire warden - the law requires it.
2. Be sure to properly supervise your burning.

3. Make certain your fire is DEAD OUT before leaving it.
4. Don't throw lighted matches, cigars and cigarettes from moving vehicles - use your ashtray.
5. Don't burn at home - Use your town dump and save yourself much possible difficulty, both personal and financial.
6. Keep close mesh screen on incinerators when burning - the law requires it.

REPORT OF THE GRIFFIN FREE PUBLIC LIBRARY

Added to the Library for the year 1959 were 34 new books equally divided between Adult and Juvenile.

Additionally, the Library received as gifts 39 Juvenile Books.

A most gratifying increase in circulation continues its upward trend with an addition of 202 subscribers for the year resulting in total circulation of 3,204.

In 1957 the circulation was 1,299; in 1958 a substantial increase brought the total to 3,002 with 1959 reaching the new level of 3,204.

Much of the increase can be directly traced to the consolidation of the schools, bringing to the attention to many children the facilities of the Library and the Museum.

The Trustees extend their sincere appreciation to retiring Librarian Mrs. William (Ronnie) Cleveland for her painstaking work.

To the inhabitants of the town of Auburn, in the County of Rockingham in the said State, qualified to vote in Town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Auburn on Tuesday, March 8th, next at ten of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

First: To bring in your ballots for:

Town Clerk for the ensuing year
One Selectman for three years
Tax Collector for the ensuing year
Town Treasurer for the ensuing year
Highway Agent for the ensuing year
One Library Trustee for three years
One Cemetery Trustee for three years
One Trust Fund Trustee for three years
Three Auditors for the ensuing year
Police Chief for the ensuing year

At seven o'clock in the evening, the meeting will be open for the following articles:

Second: To see if the Town will vote to incur debt for Temporary loans in the anticipation of taxes.

Third: To see if the Town will vote to accept such Trust Funds as may have come in during the year and Trust Funds as have not been previously accepted.

Fourth: To see if the Town will vote to use the income of the H. B. Burnham fund for schools or library.

Fifth: To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$100.00 to purchase advertising space in the 1960 Guide of the Merrimack Valley Region, or act in relation thereto.

Sixth: To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$500.00 for the Capital Reserve Fund to be used for the purchase of Highway Equipment.

Seventh: To see if the Town will vote to accept the following amendment to the Zoning Laws.

No junk yard or place for the storage of discarded machinery, vehicles, or other scrap materials shall be maintained in any district. Definition Junk means any old metals, old bottles, cotton or woolen mill yarns, old paper products, old rubber products, two or more unregistered motor vehicles which are unfit for use on highways, used parts and materials or motor vehicles, and other second hand articles the accumulation of which is detrimental or injurious to the neighborhood.

Eighth: To see if the Town will vote to accept the following amendment to the Zoning Laws.

The removal of sod, loam, clay, sand, gravel, or other natural inorganic material from any premises in any District is allowed in instances when such removal is (1) incidental to the lawful construction or alteration of a building or structure, or the lawful construction of a way (including driveway), on the portion of the premises where removal occurs: or (2) incidental to the construction or operation of public works by the town or the State at the location where the removal occurs. Otherwise, the removal of such materials or any of them from any premises in any District is prohibited except that such removal may be authorized by the Board of Adjustment by special permit in any instance where the Board determines that the removal will be advantageous to the premises in question or to the neighborhood or otherwise desirable and will be of such character and can be so accomplished that by proper re-grading, re-loaming, re-seeding, or other means which shall be required assure that the premises will be left in sightly condition and protected against erosion.

Ninth: To see if the Town will vote to accept the following amendment to the Zoning Laws.

The use of land for the accommodation of trailers and/or mobile home for payment is prohibited. However, any property owner or lessee may accommodate the trailer of a non-paying guest for a period not exceeding thirty days in any one year.

Tenth: To see if the Town will vote to accept the following amendment to the Zoning Laws.

A single trailer or single mobile home may be located in Town provided it meets all frontage, front yard, side and back yard, minimum land area, and state Board of Health regulations.

Eleventh: To see if the Town will vote to accept the following amendment to the Zoning Laws.

Signs: Property owners with business, profession, or service enterprises shall be allowed two advertising signs not to total over eight (8) square feet in area for each sign: also, two signs pertaining to the lease, sale, or use of a lot or building on which placed, shall not exceed a total area of five (5) square feet. A permit must be secured from the Board of Adjustment for signs other than those specified. This applies to all Districts.

Twelfth: To see if the Town will vote to accept the following amendment to the Zoning Laws.

The frontage of any lot area shall not be less than 100 feet. Frontage means the length of lot bordering on the public right of way. Any lot area where city water is available shall not be less than 10,000 square feet. Without city water, lots shall be 150' x 150'; however, the Board of Adjustment, upon being petitioned may allow slight exceptions to the required lot size. This ordinance takes precedence over any previous one. This is necessary for proper water supply and disposal of sewage.

Thirteenth: To see if the Town will accept the provisions of R.S.A. 41:32a that changes the terms of Office of Town Auditors so that all terms do not expire at the same time.

Fourteenth: To see if the Town will vote to close the Cat Path (so-called) from the Bunting Place (so called) to Deerneck Bridge.

Fifteenth: To see if the Town will vote to close the Cromby Road (so called) from the Hooksett Road to Route 101.

Sixteenth: To see if the Town will vote to close the Raymond Road, from the intersection at Eaton Road to the intersection at the Chester Turnpike.

Seventeenth: To see if the provisions of Chapter 287 of revised Statutes Annotated relative to playing games of beano in this Town. (Vote on Official Ballot)

Eighteenth: To hear the report of the Budget Committee and act thereon.

Nineteenth: To transact any other business that may legally come before the meeting.

Polls will open at 10:00 o'clock A. M. and close at 7:00 o'clock P. M.

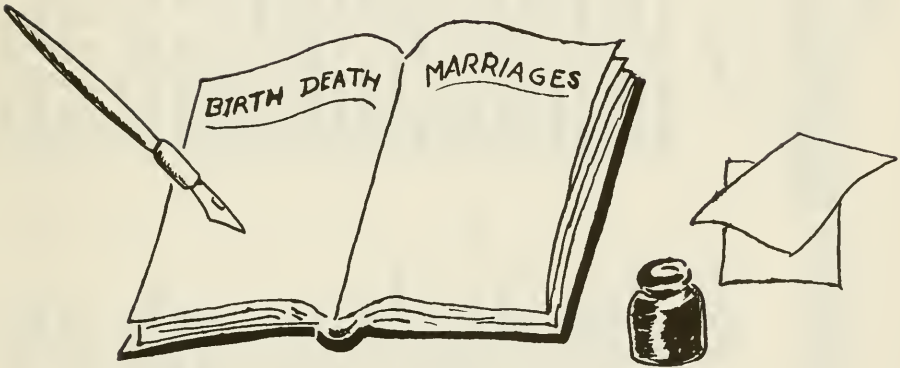

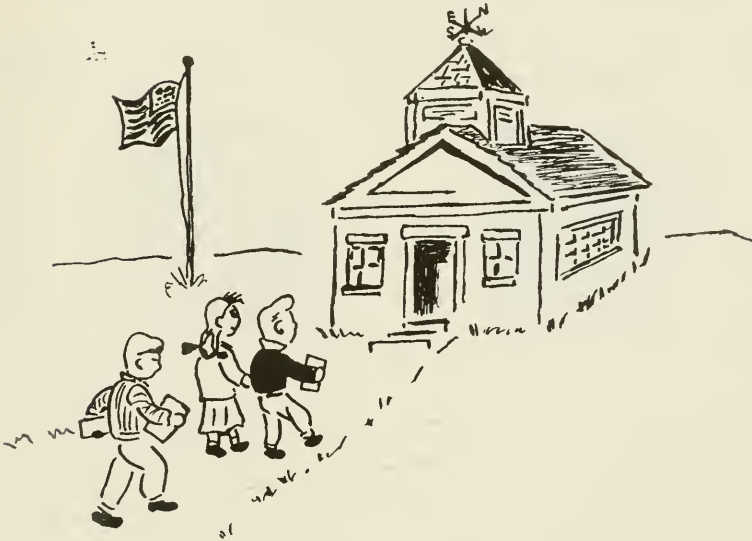

REPORT OF THE HELPING TEACHER

Curriculum development and classroom visits are two of the areas of the work for the helping teacher. Both areas are attempts to help the pupils obtain a better education and that is the general aim of the position. These are the only areas to be discussed in this report.

CURRICULUM -- Classroom observations and the study of standardized test results are made each year along with a study of the needs of the youngsters. The results show the areas of study in which we must strive for improvements. We determined that certain basic minimum standards should be met in each subject and issued copies of these standards to all teachers. These may be revised after working with them for a year. Curriculum bulletins, notes, or units were developed for English in grades 7 and 8, history and geography in grades 4, 5, and 8 and grade 6 nutrition. Filmstrips and films are available on loan, and monthly bulletins are issued to all teachers. Science guides were distributed to building principals in an effort to eliminate some duplications in science demonstrations and to help develop a stronger program in the basic units.

CLASSROOM VISITS -- As in previous years, most of the school day is spent in the various classrooms of the

supervisory union. All classrooms are visited, but those with teachers who are new to the system or in rooms with special problems and in grades in which special curriculum work is being attempted receive a greater number of visits. Visits to classrooms are made primarily to be of service to the teacher by helping her in her program, lesson plans, methods, curriculum problems, enrichment materials, special problems, demonstration lessons, and testing. Though they serve several purposes, the visits are made with the aim of the position in mind. Crowded classrooms and double grades are no longer the problem that they were before the addition was erected and it is now possible to give more attention to individual problems in the classroom.

ENROLLMENT

There is practically no change in elementary enrollment. There were some 14 more pupils enrolled but only one more enrolled as of January 15. The high school enrollment is increased by only five. This is contrary to our expectation and next year a larger increase can be expected. With high school tuition also increasing the effect on the budget will be a sizable increase.

PERSONNEL

There were no changes in personnel since last year. This is a tribute to the community (citizens, parents, and pupils), the board and the staff. The community, because it indicates that citizens, parents, and pupils are creating a working situation that is desirable; the school board because it provides the instructional mater-

ials that create a good educational climate; the staff since the close associations is a single building require that cooperation in work, and social activities be present so that the staff can work as a unit.

PHYSICAL PLANT

The school board is, in my opinion, to be commended for the improvements to the physical plant. The sewage disposal, as a result of district action, has been installed. The improvement has made the play area more pleasant and healthy. By carefully husbanding the monies available because high school enrollment dropped the board made the wise investment of "hot topping" the drive way. This improvement, long over due, makes the building and grounds a greater community asset. With the cooperation of the principal, teachers, and pupils, the grounds present a pleasing appearance, Pride in the building and grounds, evidenced by the activities in improving them, is an intangible product of the educational program that can and will mean a better community and state.

The board has included one more needed improvement in a warrant article. The present well (drinking water) is under the building. It has worked satisfactorily for several years (since 1950). The surface well dug at

the time is not a satisfactory source of drinking water. It seems advisable to have a better source of drinking water than the one currently used. The board has therefore presented it to district for whatever action the district may see fit to take.

INSTRUCTIONAL PROGRAM

The report of the helping teacher has indicated the areas in which he has been working to improve the educational program. The progress of individual pupils at the elementary and secondary level is a source of satisfaction to all connected with the educational program. This progress is usually correlated closely with the ability of the individual.

The Conant report on secondary education is having an impact on the educational system nationally. It is also going to result in an impact on elementary education. Dr. Conant is now engaged in a similar survey of junior high schools and plans to move into the elementary area on completion of his present study. With studies in all three areas completed, one of the more comprehensive studies of American education will be completed. It will be the first really objective look at education of a trained scientist. It certainly should provide a starting point for a critical evaluation of our own facilities, tangible and in-

tangible. This is desirable and could lead to improved educational offerings.

The educational program offered is a program that attempts to meet the needs of children in the late 20th century. The test results indicate that generally the pupils meet the established national norms.

FINANCE

The budget is increased approximately \$8,000 in the area of current operations. High school tuition and salaries account for nearly \$6,000 of this increase. Transportation accounts for \$700 additional. These three items then account for more than 80% of the increase. All three involve the service that is offered to children and are in two areas statutory. The tax levy is increased by approximately the same amount. A critical evaluation of our tax structure is a pressing need of our economy. Real estate can not continue to carry such a large proportion of the tax burden.

The community has worked to provide a fine educational environment. All concerned with the educational opportunities for children have given of their time and effort to achieve this result. It is a pleasant responsibility to work for children's welfare in this atmosphere.
