

THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Bow, in the County of Merrimack in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town House in said Bow on Tuesday, the tenth day of March, next, at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
- 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.
- 3. To see what sum of money the Town will raise and appropriate for highways and bridges.
- 4. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate \$2,000 for street lights.
- 5. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate \$200 for Blister Rust control.
- 6. To see how much money the Town will raise and appropriate for Old Home Day.
- 7. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate \$619.63 for maintenance of Baker Free Library.
- 8. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate \$100 for cemeteries.
- 9. To see if the Town, will vote to raise and appropriate \$563.91 for Class V roads, the State to give \$2,255.66, making a total of \$2,819.57 for town roads or
- 10. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate \$2,221.50 for State Aid Construction, the State to give \$2.221.00.
- 11. To see if the town will vote to give the Selectmen authority to sell or lease or rent property deeded by the Collector to the Town.
- 12. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.

- 13. To see if the Town will vote to raise a sum of money to tar the Grand View road from Chandler Ordway's to the Turnpike.
- 14. To see what action the Town will take toward the use of the Australian Ballot System at future Town Meetings.
- 15. To see what action the Town will take toward organizing a fire department, and raise and appropriate money for equipment for the same.
- 16. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate \$500 or more to be used on highways for removing rocks which interfere with snow plow.
- 17. To see what action the Town will take toward having one man take full charge of all snow removal and this man to be appointed by and take all orders from the selectmen and may be discharged at any time by the Selectmen for inadequate service.
- 18. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate \$1,000 as an emergency fund to be applied to any use, which, in the judgment of the Selectmen shall seem best.
- 19. To see if the Town will vote to adopt the provisions of the Municipal Budget Act.
- 20. To see what action the Town will take towards establishing a recreation park as described by a petition for the same.
- 21. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

REPORT OF THE SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

To the Citizens of Bow:

There has been one change in the list of teachers this year. Miss Dorothy Egan of Manchester, a Normal School graduate, is teaching at South Bow. Only three children are from the town, but there have been three tuition pupils from Dunbarton this year.

There is about the usual number enrolled in High Schools. In Concord there have been 34 different pupils. In Manchester there has been one. The tuition charge in each of these schools is \$100 per pupil for the year. A few pupils have dropped out.

The school enrollment of 147, has changed but little from the preceding year. Last year the per cent of attendance for Bow Mills Grammar was 95.5% — for the White school was 95.4% — for South Bow 95%. These are excellent records. One or two schools fell considerably below the state average of 95.4%. It sometimes happens, however, that many absences are caused by one or two careless families — so a low per cent of attendance does not reflect the attitude of the school as a whole; but of a few indifferent people. That has been true here.

This year a beginning has been made with instruction in music. Miss Elaine Ellis of Henniker, who is music supervisor in the schools of a number of nearby towns, was engaged to give two days a month, directing and planning the work. The response on the part of the teachers and pupils has been splendid. Music when properly taught is a source of much pleasure and profit and gives values which carries beyond school days.
