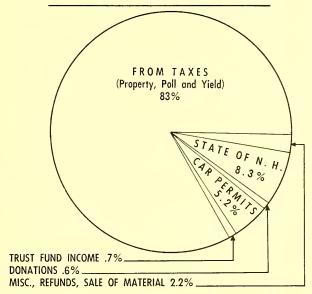

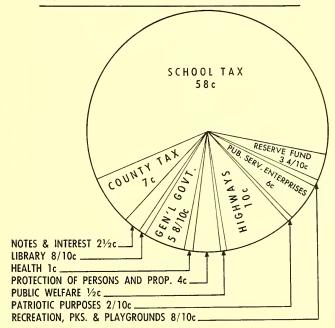

REPORT OF FOREST FIRE WARDEN & DISTRICT CHIEF

New Hampshire is the fastest growing state in the northeast in terms of population increase. It is also an industrialized state and this growth is likely to continue, all of which means more families and homes. Our growing summer population is scattered throughout the state with a phenomenal increase in vacation homes.

Many new homes and practically all cottages are being located in woodlands and abandoned fields and forests crowd into the back yards of our village streets. In a state where the forests cover 86% of the land surface, it is necessary that everyone be aware all through the season, which comes with the disappearance of the snow until the snow comes again, of the need to be careful with outdoor fires and fire sources.

The following action will help:

- 1. To teach our children the danger of lighted matches.
- 2. To never discard lighted smoking material from a car or while walking through fields or woods.
- 3. To safely dispose of rubbish preferably at the town dump. If you must burn
 - a. You need a written permit from the town fire warden for *all* debris burning except when the ground is covered with snow. Cooking fires in outdoor fireplaces or in charcoal brasiers in your own back yard is permitted on notification of the warden.

- b. The warden is forbidden by regulation to allow burning of household rubbish on grass by householders between 9:00 A.M. and 5:00 P.M.
- c. Have equipment on hand to control the fire before you light the match.
- 4. Promptly report any fire out of control to your fire warden or fire department.

Help to keep our town out of the fire occurrence column and save our tax dollars for useful purposes.

To the Inhabitants of the School District in the Town of Franconia, qualified to vote in District affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Franconia Elementary School on the third day of March, 1969, at 5 o'clock in the afternoon (Polls to be open from 5:00 P.M. to 10:00 P.M. Business meeting for consideration of the articles of the warrant will be called to order at 8:00 P.M.) to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To choose all necessary officers for the School District for the ensuing year.
- 2. To hear the reports of Agents, Auditors, Committees, or officers heretofore chosen, and pass any vote relating thereto.
- 3. To choose Agents, Auditors and Committees in relation to any subject embraced in this Warrant.
- To see if the District will vote to accept the 4. provisions of Public Law 89.10, designed to improve educational opportunities with particular reference to children of low-income families, and to appropriate such funds as may be made available to the District under said federal act for such particular projects as may be determined by the School Board, Further, to see if the District will authorize the School Board to make application for such funds and to expend the same for such projects as it may designate; and further authorize the School Board to take any cooperative action with other school districts as it may deem necessary or advisable for the aforesaid purposes.
- 5. To see if the District will vote to create a cooperative school planning committee consisting of three qualified voters, of whom one at least shall be a member of the school board, and to

- elect members thereof or determine that they shall be appointed by the moderator.
- 6. To see if the District will vote to purchase from Horace York, a parcel of land adjoining the Franconia Elementary School. Description of said parcel of land is recorded with the Clerk of the School District. Purchase price of two thousand dollars (\$2,000.00), payable in five (5) yearly installments of four hundred dollars (\$400.00) each. The first yearly payment to be made during the school year of 1969-1970.
- To see if the District will vote to sell and convey to Robert Whitney, Jr., and Evelyn R. Whitney for the consideration of not less than Three Thousand Dollars (\$3,000.00) the following described portion of land of the District situate in the Town of Franconia, namely, a certain parcel of land located between land now of said Whitneys and Interstate Route No. 93, bounded on the north by land of Rowins, on the east by Interstate Route No. 93, on the south by other land of the District, and on the west by land of said Whitneys; or, in the alternative, to see if the District will vote to sell and convey the aforesaid parcel of land to said Whitneys for the consideration of not less than Two Thousand Dollars (\$2,000.00) and the conveyance by said Whitneys to the District of a certain triangular parcel of land situate in said Franconia bounded on the north by land of the District, on the southeast by land of York, and on the southwest by other land of said Whitneys.
- 8. To see what sum of money the District will vote to raise and appropriate for the support of schools, for the payment of salaries for school district officials and agents and for the payment of the statutory obligations of the District.

REPORT OF SCHOOL NURSE

The school health program was carried out on the pupils of Franconia, Easton and Sugar Hill combined districts. Complete physicals were done on all the pupils in Kindergarten, and grades one through six, whose parents requested them. These were done by Dr. Ralph Parker, the school physician. A complete urinalysis and a hemoglobin were done on each child having a physical. Notices of any defects found were sent home to the child's parents.

Heights, weights, audio and visual exams were done on all pupils in grades one through six. Notices concerning any questionable difficulties were sent to the parents. All notices sent were acknowledged and children needing glasses obtained them through their family optometrist.

Registration day was held the first week in June, for children entering Kindergarten. Nineteen children were weighed and measured by the school nurse, and medical histories were recorded at this time.

During the school year, through the assistance of Dr. Parker and the State Health Department, there was an Immunization Clinic held for children in need of booster shots. These were administered to pupils whose parents requested them. Also T.B. Tine tests were done on all the first graders, with parent's permission.

There are many services available to the schools in our area. I will gladly provide any assistance concerning these facilities to anyone who has any questions about them.

The cooperation of all persons connected with the school is greatly appreciated, and the cooperation and interest of the parents in this area is very encouraging and helpful.

REPORT OF THE PRINCIPAL

I hereby submit my first annual report as principal of the Combined Districts of Easton, Franconia, and Sugar Hill.

The elementary school for the Combined Districts opened September 5, 1968. Kindergarten and grades one and two were located at Sugar Hill in the Carolina Crapo Memorial School, and grades three through six were located at Franconia in the Franconia Elementary School Building. The total enrollment was 109 pupils, two more than last year.

Since September 5, 1968, four children have been withdrawn and four have been enrolled; thus, the membership at this date is the same as at the opening of school. The pupils are currently distributed such that there are twenty in kindergarten, eleven in grade one, eight in grade two, and seventy in the upgraded program at Franconia.

The instructional staff is composed of nine teachers. including the principal and the music teacher. Mrs. Sally May provides the kindergarten experiences so necessary in encouraging readiness for first grade. Miss Susan MacKenzie teaches grade one and two with Mrs. Nancy Ward teaching grade two during the afternoon, thus allowing more individual attention than would be possible were one teacher to have two grades for the full day. Variations of team teaching and departmentalization are practiced at Franconia. Mrs. Pauline Cole and Mrs. Evelyn Howe teach, primarily, the language arts and social studies, Mrs. Eliza Conde and Mr. John Riff teach modern math. science and physical education, Mr. Donald White gives instruction in reading, and Mrs. Marion Callender provides musical experiences each Wednesday for all children beyond kindergarten.

A school sponsored ski program is currently in operation. Instruction is provided each Thursday for

all interested children attending the elementary grades.

During the second semester Mr. Bruce Bean is scheduled to provide opportunity for instrumental music instruction.

Pupil progress is being reported two times a year for kindergarten and four times for all other pupils. Reporting for kindergarten takes the form of parent-teacher conferences, reports for first grade pupils are in the form of letters to parents, and reports for all other elementary pupils are a combination of teacher comments and a level-of-performance check list for each subject.

Vital services other than those of an instructional nature are care of pupil health, supervised by Nurse Elinor Murray; custodial services, provided by Mr. Richard Sullivan at Franconia and Mr. Gary Young at Sugar Hill; secretarial services, provided by Mrs. Beryle Tavino; and the hot lunch program, directed by Mrs. Merline Martin and assisted by Mrs. Loretta Brown.

Approximately 86 to 89 pupils are currently taking hot lunch; this is an increase in participation over last year by about 24 per cent.

It appears that the combined districts approach and the nongraded program at Franconia is workable, beneficial, and worthy of continuance.

I wish to express sincere appreciation for consideration and assistance rendered by parents and friends of the school, children, school board, superintendent, faculty, and all those who make the school and its operation possible.

REPORT OF SUPERINTENDENT

To the School Boards and citizens of Easton, Franconia and Sugar Hill:

As Superintendent of Schools of your districts it is indeed a pleasure to submit my fourth annual report.

During this school year 1968-1969, the School Boards and your administrators have operated our two buildings and three school districts as a single unit. For want of a better descriptive title, this experiment in education has been referred to as The Combined School District. Although many have suggested the name Profile School District when the re-organization is legalized.

This program of operating the Franconia and Carolina Crapo Elementary Schools under the Combined School Boards of Easton, Franconia, and Sugar Hill (3 from each town), a single Superintendent of Schools and under Mr. Donald White, the Supervising Principal of both buildings, has worked extremely well. I am certain that each of our communities has felt a greater closeness to the schools because in a sense they are ours and we have had all this year a control that did not exist under the tuitioning arrangement.

It was the unanimous decision of both your School Boards and administration to continue this same arrangement for the school year 1969-1970.

As you know, the Franconia District has had a Citizens Study Committee working for nearly a year in the several areas of interest: curriculum, building facilities, finance, formation of a Cooperative District, etc. Each of us in the three districts is now requested via our warrants to legally form, according to New Hampshire Statutes, a Cooperative Study Committee, thus continuing the Franconia study and in turn make recommendations to our three towns. I sincerely hope

each district will approve by voting a committee of three people from each town.

During 1968-1969, we have 104 pupils enrolled in our two buildings; 8 from Easton, 51 from Franconia, and 45 from Sugar Hill. It should be noted here that the Sugar Hill School District was enlarged to include the whole township, thus the increased enrollment. There are from our three districts, 23 enrolled in Littleton Junior High School, and 34 enrolled in Littleton Senior High School. Attending Lisbon are 14 pupils from Sugar Hill District. We anticipate an enrollment next year of:

Our educational costs are increasing at a very rapid rate as are the educational costs throughout all of New Hampshire and the nation. Average per pupil State costs in New Hampshire were for 1967-68 \$440 — Elementary; \$549—Jr. High: and, \$637—Sr. High, exclusive of transportation and other certain fixed

charges. For 1968-69 it is anticipated that the State averages will be \$483—Elementary; \$562—Jr. High; and, \$695—Sr. High. 1969-70 will undoubtedly increase even more rapidly because of the teacher shortage and the increased costs of materials. In general, the inflationary costs we have all experienced personally do affect our educational programs.

Mr. Donald White and a very fine staff have during this year operated an educational program of note. The non-gradedness as well as the many other programs should definitely be continued. Your White Mts. Supervisory Union #35 will continue to serve our Combined District in every way possible as your District continues to develop the whole educational program.

In closing may I thank each of you, especially our School Board members, and our administrators and staff for the support you all continue to give to a better educational program.

INFORMATION SERVICES OF FRANCONIA, EASTON AND SUGAR HILL

The season's registration of over 7,000 cars means that more than 20,000 persons received individual assistance in reaching their friends or our business places and in learning about the area. Therefore, many thousands of dollars were left to help all in these towns —the money turns over through business establishments, employees, suppliers, families of all and, finally, through their taxes, back to the towns that support the service. Former records show cars registered as follows: 165—3,982; 1966—5,890; 1967—6,196; 1968—over 7,000. And the 1949 figure was 1,444! Registrations, made on cards by the visitors, are filed for study. They contain valuable data, including comments by the visitors. Other booths simply attempt to count cars and persons for the totals—impossible to do from our booth with its volume of traffic and limited visibility. The present building, built about 1946, is entirely inadequate for present-day needs.

The booth was open in 1968 from May 25 to October 19, with hours varying from 2 to 14 a day; July and August hours were from 11 a.m. to 8:30 p.m. Constant flow of traffic kept it open late, sometimes; at those times, 95% of requests were for lodgings, so we kept that money in this area, calling facilities in other towns when ours were filled. The longest day was October 5, with 210 cars registered in 14 hours. All were helped and all were most appreciative. Supervision of the booth was by the Franconia Selectmen, cooperating with a Chamber of Commerce committee.

Payment by the Town of Franconia, with Sugar Hill and Easton contributing since 1966, was for 1,000 hours at the minimum wage, for only the time the booth was open. The secretary was contacted at home, often, by phone and personal visits, for help before morning opening and after evening closing. Winter coverage of mail, phone and personal visits has been done on practically a 24-hour basis, at her home, from fall closing to summer opening, each year.

Many thousand pieces of literature have been given, individually, each year. The State distributor said this booth used more than any other, including State Rest Areas. The limited space for handling and haphazard method of delivery to us made it impossible to keep a count for future planning. An attempt was made and, for the few local places that furnished an adequate supply early, up to 2,000 copies were given out for each, with over 7,000 of our town folders.

Many requests came for the following facilities in these towns: dentist, drug store, liquor store, low-priced clothing store; shops open evenings, evening activities, a higher grade of movies, suitable for family viewing (much dissatisfaction with present offerings!), other family-type activities—church suppers, etc., were requested often! places of interest here; hiking trails easier than mountains, for small children and older persons; guided hikes and tours; golf and other games; and a lake!

This is the only booth in the area having a complete registration by the visitor, and the data collected throughout the year shows what local people and our visitors desire. Most of our visitors are like you and me; they want the sort of things that interest us. Most have children with them and, after they've seen the attractions of the mountains, they want family-type activities here. They like these towns and say, "Please keep things as they are, don't let your towns be ruined as some south and east of you have been."

Throughout the year, there are requests from local people and their guests for information and help of all sorts, including employment or employees, pets, etc., lost or found, road directions, area information, locating friends and relatives, et al.

We'll welcome questions regarding the Information Service and suggestions for its improvement.
