



TOWN WARRANT

To the inhabitants of the Town of Langdon in the County of Sullivan in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Langdon on Tuesday the fourteenth day of March, next at ten o'clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- ARTICLE I. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the ensuing year.
- ART. II. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray Town Charges for the ensuing year and make appropriation for same.
- ART. III. To see what sum of money the Town will raise and appropriate for the support of Highways and Bridges.
- ART. IV. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$143.57 for Class 5 Highway Assistance or T. R. A. so-called. The State will contribute \$574.28.
- ART. V. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$30.00 for the celebration of Memorial Day.
- ART. VI. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$25.00 for the purchase of fire equipment.
- ART, VII. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum not to exceed one one-hundredth of one percent (1–100 of 1%)of the assessed valuation based on the assessment of 1943 for the purpose of publicizing and promoting natural advantages and resources of the town, together with other towns of the Dartmouth-Lake Sunapee Region.
- ART. VIII. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$200.00 for the purpose of continuing the control of White Pine Blister Rust and apply for State and Federal Aid to be used with same.

- ART. IX. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the purchase of snow fence.
- ART. X. To see if the Town will vote to accept from the Estate of Mrs. Minnie Pierce the sum of \$100.00 to be known as the Orville Pierce Fund.
- ART. XI. To bring ballots for the election of Delegates to the National Political Conventions.
- ART. XII. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money to be laid aside for Post War Construction of Highways under a Public Works program.
- ART. XIII. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.
- ART. XIV. To transact any other business that may come before said meeting.

ART. XV. To allow accounts.

SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

To the School Board of Langdon:

I herewith submit my annual report for the fourteenth year as your Superintendent of Schools.

This year when it seemed almost impossible to find teachers for rural schools, we were fortunate to hold the services of Mrs. Carl Buswell as teacher of the lower grades and to hire Mrs. Grace Haddad for the upper grades. The instruction is good, the pupils are doing well in their work and there is excellent congeniality among parents, pupils and teachers. Many steps have been made this year to build a good school, but some of the children have not schooled themselves to be quiet while waiting their turn to recite. They are good children, not saucy or bullying, but they have that natural urge, sometimes found among older people, to "play the ball all of the time" or to monopolize conversation.

It would be a help if parents would visit the schools, counsel with the teachers, and encourage their children to have a greater interest in school and in their own future. It might be good to have a parent-teacher club.

The teacher situation is really serious. While wages have been raised they do not meet the increases in taxes, board, etc. There are teachers who will take a school with a single grade of not over twenty pupils, if near the railroad station and bus line, and if they can have excellent board with a heated room in a home near the school where there are no children. This has given the idea that there are teachers without positions, but teachers who really love to teach children, who feel that they are doing their part in these troubled years are hard to find.

It is generally thought that the State pays the expenses of the elementary schools over and above five miles on the equalization valuation of the District. That was the intention of the law, but during the last few years it does not work out just that way. The State pays none of the costs to educate high school pupils. She will not pay for any elementary cost that she has not approved, and the legislature has made the appropriations so small that the approvals have been cut on things really needed in any good school of this day. The State allows only \$5 per school for lights, in many places much less for transportation than the costs, and has no funds to pay for any emergency expenditure by a district such as the transportation of pupils from a new family or opening of a new school in the middle of the school year.

It would be a great help to equalize the cost of education if a law was passed providing up to \$1,500 to each district in the state to maintain a high school or to educate their pupils in the high schools of other districts.

I wish to thank the teachers, members of the School Board, children, and citizens for their patience during this year.

REPORT OF SCHOOL NURSE January, 1943—January, 1944

As school nurse of Langdon, I submit the following report for the year ending January 31, 1944.

In January the Western Electric Audiometer, loaned by the State Board of Education, was used to check pupils' hearing scientifically. April 29 the annual school dental clinic was held. Twenty-six pupils were treated by Dr. Irving Crandall of Claremont. More than ten pupils were not admitted to the clinic because of lack of time. With nearly a hundred percent of the Langdon children wishing to attend the annual dental clinic, it is clear that two days are needed to do this corrective dentistry.

The results of the school dental clinic held annually may be stated briefly as better health, better attendance, better school work, an aroused interest by the child and the parent in the value of preventive and corrective dentistry.
