TOWN MEETING WARRANT

The State of New Hampshire

To the inhabitants of the Town of Lyman, in the County of Grafton, and the State of New Hampshire, qualified to vote in town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Lyman Town Hall in said town, on Tuesday, the 13th day of March, 1962, polls to open at ten o'clock in the forenoon and will not be closed before five o'clock in the afternoon, to act upon the following subjects.

- Article 1. To choose all necessary town officers for the ensuing year.
- **Article 2.** To raise and appropriate such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year.
- **Article 3.** To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of two thousand two hundred fifty dollars (\$2,250.00) for the repair of town highways for the ensuing year.
- Article 5. To see if the town will vote to accept Town Road Aid, and raise and appropriate the sum of five hundred seventy-nine dollars and sixteen cents (\$579.16) for the same.
- **Article 6.** To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of two thousand dollars (\$2,000.00) for the general expense of the highway department.
- Article 7. To see if the town will vote as compensation for the tax collector, 1% of the taxes collected, and raise and appropriate the necessary money for the same.
- Article 8. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate one hundred dollars (\$100.00) for the Blister Rust Control.
- Article 9. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of twenty-five dollars (\$25.00) for the Lisbon District Nursing Association.

- Article 10. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of ten dollars (\$10.00) for the observance of Memorial Day.
- Article 11. To see if the town will vote to authorize the selectmen to borrow such sums of money as they may deem necessary in anticipation of taxes.
- Article 12. To see what sums of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the town officers' salaries and town officers' expenses.
- Article 13. To see if the town will vote to grant a discount of 2% on all taxes paid on or before such time as the selectmen may designate.
- Article 14. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate two hundred fifty dollars (\$250.00) on account of property fires.
- Article 15. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of fifty-five dollars and thirty-five cents (\$55.35)) for the White Mountain Region Association.
- Article 16. To see if the town wishes to continue obtaining the services of the state auditors for the yearly audit of the town books.
- Article 17. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the necessary money to defray the town's share of the cost of the Federal Social Security benefits extended to the town employeees.
- Article 18. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate two hundred dollars (\$200.00) for the upkeep of the cemeteries in the town, as required by law.
- Article 19. To see if the town will raise and appropriate five hundred dollars (\$500.00) for the maintenance of its town bridges.

Article 20. To see if the town will vote to purchase any new equipment; and if so, to raise and appropriate the necessary money for the same; and if necessary, to authorize the selectmen to issue notes, or serial notes, on credit of the town, on such terms and at such rate of interest as may be necessary.

Article 21. To see if the town will authorize the selectmen to sell and dispose of any real estate acquired by the town by tax deeds.

Article 22. To hear the reports of agents, auditors, committees and officers heretofore chosen, and pass votes relative thereto.

Article 23. To transact any other business that may legally come before the meeting.

Summary of Findings and Recommendations

February 21, 1962

Board of Selectmen Lyman, New Hampshire Gentlemen:

Submitted herewith is the report of the annual examination and audit of the accounts of the Town of Lyman for the fiscal year ended December 31, 1961, which was made by this Division as requested. Exhibits as hereafter listed are included as part of the report.

SCOPE OF AUDIT

Included in the examination and audit were the accounts and records of the Board of Selectmen, Treasurer, Tax Collector, Town Clerk and Trustees of Trust Funds.

FINANCIAL STATEMENTS Comparative Balance Sheets December 31, 1960 — December 31, 1961 (Exhibit A-1)

Comparative Balance Sheets as of December 31, 1960 and December 31, 1961, are presented in Exhibit A-1. As indicated therein, the Surplus increased from \$1,565.74 to \$4,168.26 during 1961.

Analysis of Change in Financial Condition (Exhibit A-2)

An analysis of the change in financial condition of the Town during the year is made in Exhibit A-2, with the factors which caused the change indicated therein. These were as follows:

Comparative Statement of Appropriations and Expenditures-Estimated and Actual Revenues:

(Exhibits A-3 & A-4)

Comparative statements of appropriations and expenditures, estimated and actual revenues for the fiscal year ended December 31, 1961, are presented in Exhibits A-3 and A-4. As indicated by the budget summary Exhibit A-4 a net unexpended balance of appropriations of \$1,797.54, plus a revenue surplus of \$932.97, resulted in a net budget surplus of \$2,730.51.

Summary of Receipts and Expenditures (Exhibit B-1)

A summary of receipts and expenditures for the fiscal year ended December 31, 1961, made up in accordance with the uniform classification of accounts, is included in Exhibit B-1. Proof of the Treasurer's balance as of December 31, 1961 is indicated in Exhibit B-2.

AUDIT PROCEDURE

The accounts and records of all town officials charged with the custody, receipt and disbursement of public funds were examined and audited. Vouchers and cancelled checks were compared with supporting invoices and payrolls as well as entries in the books of record. Receipts were checked by source insofar as possible and totals of receipts and expenditures verified. Book balances were verified by comparison with reconciled bank balances made from statements obtained from depository banks. Verification of uncollected taxes was made by mailing notices to delinquent taxpayers as indicated by the Collector's records. The amounts of uncollected and unredeemed taxes as indicated in this report are therefore subject to any changes which may be necessitated by the return of verification notices.

Current Surplus:

Inasmuch as there were no outstanding notes or bonds on December 31, 1961, the surplus of \$4,168.26, as here-tofore referred to, represented the current surplus of the Town on that date.

Conclusion:

The provisions of Chapter 184 of the Laws of 1955, require that this report or the summary of findings and recommendations (letter of transmittal) shall be published in the next annual report of the Town.

We extend our thanks to the officials of the Town of Lyman for their assistance during the course of the audit.

AN APPEAL

FROM YOUR FOREST FIRE WARDEN

In these days of constantly rising taxes and wages, any unnecessary expense is an added burden on everyone's pocketbook - yours and mine. Forest fires cost money and damage our valuable woodlands. Lightning sets some forest fires, but we have no control of lightning. Children cause many fires. Ninety-eight percent of our forest fires result from human carelessness - our carelessness. This, we - you - and I can do something about.

When we require you to obtain a permit for out-ofdoors burning or forbid you to burn on days of high danger or set up regulations - hours, etc., governing the use of the town dump we are simply protecting yours and the town's interests.

The ever present threat of forest fires is the concern of all of us; the responsibility for preventing them is ours and the costs of extinguishing are ours. We can do something about this problem, by being aware of and alert to the danger and by cooperating with your warden.

Do the things that are required of you -

- 1. Follow the warden's directions.
- 2. Secure the required burning permit.
- 3. Keep your fires under control.
- 4. Completely extinguish your fires before leaving them.
- 5. See that your children are properly cautioned.

Everyone will benefit by it.

REPORT OF SUPERINTENDENT

To the School Board and Citizens of the Lyman School District:

I herewith submit my nineteenth annual report as Superintendent of Schools.

The total enrollment in your school last year was 33. The average membership was 29.5 and the percent of attendance was 94.79.

There were 12 elementary and 7 high school pupils attending in Lisbon and under the Foster Child Law Lyman paid tuition for one pupil enrolled at Orford High School. There were 4 children residing in Lyman, attending Lisbon Public School, for which no tuition was charged as they were the liability of Lisbon Special School District under the Foster Child Law. Lyman received tuition for two elementary pupils from Lebanon School District. One of these pupils attended school in Lisbon and the tuition received was a reimbursement of tuition paid to Lisbon Special School District.

The present enrollment is as follows: 31 pupils in Grades 1-4 at Lyman, 17 pupils in Grades 5 through 8 at Lisbon and 15 pupils in the high school. We are glad to see so many Lyman children graduating from high school. They are Carl Boudreau, Dorothy Tattersall and Sheila Tattersall.

When school opened in the fall there were more pupils than we could accommodate in one room. We retained as many as possible at Lyman school. The 5th Grade was sent to Lisbon.

Mrs. Clara Birch completes her fourteenth successful teaching year at Lyman school and reaches retirement age this year. We hope that by special permission Mrs. Birch can continue as teacher next year. We have asked the State Board of Education for an extension of her service and await their decision. I wish to take this opportunity, on behalf of the District, to thank Mrs. Birch for her cooperation and many thoughtful acts and kindnesses to Lyman children.

Clifton Dexter was the low bidder for transportation. He works out the route with one large bus. Mr. Dexter has been very accommodating and transportation seems to be going well.

A new oil burner was installed at Lyman school by Harry Andross. At a recent inspection of the building the fire marshal stated that this was one of the best oil burner installations he had seen.

Several factors are responsible for Lyman's added school costs. (1) Lyman now pays tuition for all foster children living in the district. (2) There are more children living in Lyman. (3) Lyman has lost its State Aid. (4) Tuition costs have increased.

At your last school meeting these increases were not anticipated. A deficiency article is included in the warrant to take care of the increased costs for this year. Our costs run as follows:

This is a large budget for Lyman, but pupil cost is well below the average for other New Hampshire schools.

By all means contact your School Board members when questions arise about school affairs. Your Board members are only too happy to be of assistance to you. They urge you to attend the annual March meeting so that you may help with school problems.

My personal thanks are extended to the School Board. I trust that each of you finds that service to the school children of Lyman is a rewarding experience.

SUPERVISORY UNION NO. 34 REPORT OF SUPERINTENDENT'S SALARY

Section 5, Chapter 243, Laws of 1953 of the State of New Hampshire, requires that school district annual reports show the total amount paid to the superintendent.

One-half of the supervisory union expenses is prorated among the several school districts of the union on the basis of adjusted valuation. One-half is prorated on the basis of average daily membership in the schools for the previous school year ending June 30. The Superintendent of Supervisory Union #34, during 1960-1961, received a salary of \$8,250.00 which was made up as follows: \$4,250.00 paid by the State Department of Education from the per capita tax and \$4,000.00 prorated among the several school districts. Allowance of \$1,100.00 for travel within the Union was also prorated as stated above.
