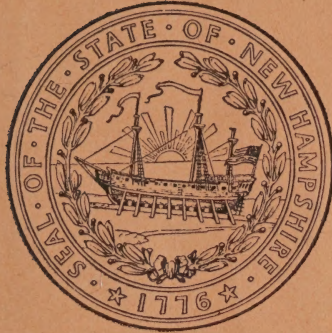

**TENTATIVE WARRANT**

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## STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the inhabitants of the town of Madison qualified to vote in town affairs;

You are hereby notified to meet at the town hall in said Madison, on Tuesday, the 9th. day of March next, at nine o'clock in the forenoon, to act up on the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary town officers for the year ensuing.
2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations for same,

As follows:

- Town Officers' salaries.
- Town Officers' expenses.
- Election expenses.
- Town Hall expenses.
- Forest fires.
- Fire Department.
- Health Department.
- Summer Highways and Bridges.
- Winter Highways.
- Street Lights.
- General expense Highway Dept.
- Libraries.
- Town Poor.
- Old Age Assistance.
- Patriotic Purposes.
- Soldiers' Aid.
- Parks and Playgrounds.
- Legal Expenses and Damage.
- Taxes bought by Town.
- Interest.
- New Equipment.
- Indebtedness.

3. To see what action the town will take in regard to discounts on taxes.

4. To see what sums of money the town will authorize the selectmen to hire in anticipation of taxes.

5. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate to build a new road and bridge at the foot of Silver Lake, and take any other action thereon.

6. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate, for bridges, to complete State Road at East Madison, and take any other action thereon.

7. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the Lake Region Association of N. H., in cooperation with other Towns in the Lake Region.

8. To see if the Town will approve the acquisition by the U. S. Government of approximately 113 acres of land situated in the town, forming an additional purchase unit of the White Mountain National Forest, and described as follows:

Starting at a point in the Albany-Madison town line 460 feet westerly of State Highway No. 16; Thence westerly parallel to and 400 feet from State Highway No. 16 to a point in the Madison-Albany town line, 400 feet from said Highway; Thence northerly and easterly along the Madison-Albany town line to the point of beginning; Containing 133 acres more or less.

9. (a). To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for cleaning and painting in-side of Town Hall.

(b). To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate to put water in the Town Hall.

10. To see if the Town will vote to continue to



care for charities by House Bill No. 296.

11. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for housing Highway Equipment, and take any other action thereon.

12. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$841.50 for State Aid Construction at East Madison, (State to contribute \$1,682.00).

13. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$518.31 for Town Road Assistance on class V Roads, (State to contribute \$2,073.25).

## SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

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I herewith submit my sixteenth annual report as superintendent of schools, it being the twenty-fourth in the series of such reports.

Madison schools are going well. The old saying, "Hitch your wagon to a star", has lately been changed to "Hitch your wagon to the next job in hand." Doing that job as well as you can is what brings competence, character and happiness. Schools are aiming to fashion character as well as intelligence, and earnest, untiring effort on the part of pupils is essential. Parents and teachers should cooperate to bring about the best results. Education today is looking at the side of service, asking how young people can become helpful in the community. The great world need at present is for a real, intelligent unselfishness among nations and individuals. In the country at large, it is said that half the parents of pupils now in high school had, themselves, no high school education. Thus parents are pushing their children up to greater accomplishment. Boys and girls should appreciate this and give their best efforts in school work.

I wish every child could have educational activities in the home to correlate with school work, such as writing friendly letters, keeping the family budget account, measuring the woodpile and keeping the family gasoline bill. Children do not have opportunities enough to apply the knowledge gained at school. It is pleasing to note that the high schools particularly have been carrying out projects in which school activities have sought to do community service, at the same time making application of scientific knowledge. Lawns have been graded, shrubs set out, electric wiring done in order to feature a new community observance of Christmas.

### Beautify the Grounds

It should be the definite aim of schools and communities to beautify the public grounds on lawns and roadsides. In a state so beautiful by nature, certainly the home and school surroundings should be noticeably beautiful.

### Repairs

The improvements to property during the past year consisted mainly in interior work at the high school and the installation of a sanitary toilet at the Corner School. Provision should be made for a sanitary at Nickerson School. We also need ventilating heaters and adjustable furniture.

### Health

The health work is under the care of the school nurse, Miss Eva M. Nelson, R. N. Miss Nelson brings to the work a wealth of experience and training. She served in the World War and has done much service in school nursing. The inspections have been made and special attention is being given to correction of dental defects. We do well to look after the physical welfare of the children. Miss Nelson's report is appended.

### Visual Education

The picture work has been carried on and pupils are profiting by seeing such pictures as "Overland to California," "The Arid Southwest," "Safety" "George Washington, His Life and Times." We learn more rapidly through the medium of the eye.

### Prize Speaking

The Silver Lake Woman's Club is still sponsoring Prize Speaking which was better this year than usual. Thanks is expressed to the coaches and judges who gave time to help the pupils in this excellent exercise.

Eleanor Whiting is in training as a nurse in Massachusetts General Hospital. It will be noted that 60% of the last graduating class are now in higher institutions and more will go later.
