THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the inhabitants of the Town of Nelson in the County of Cheshire in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at Town Hall in said Nelson on Tuesday, the thirteenth day of March next, at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriation of the same.
3. To see what sum of money the town will raise for repairing highways and bridges, or take any action in relation thereto.
4. To see if the town will vote to accept State Aid for road construction.
5. To see what sum of money the town will raise for support of Library.
6. To see what sum of money the town will raise for Memorial day.
7. To see if the town will vote to raise money for Old Home day.
8. To elect an agent to enforce liquor laws.

9. To see if town will vote to give Selectmen right to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.

10. To see what sum of money town will pay on tractor note.

11. To see if the town will elect a superintendent of the Cemetery.

12. To see if the town will vote to oil the road leading from Dixon Corner to Wayland Tolman's or pass any vote in relation thereto.

13. To see whether Beer or other Alcoholic beverages shall be manufactured or sold locally as permitted under this act.

To the School Board and Citizens of Nelson:

I hereby submit my eleventh annual report as superintendent of schools.

If I were to express in a few words a philosophy of education with a psychological background, it would recognize (1) the human mind as the most unique, delicately poised and wonderful mechanism the world has ever known; (2) that its stimuli are obtained through the so-called "Windows of the Soul" often called our common senses; (3) that its products are the conceptions, ideations and thoughts resulting from the coalition and cooperation of mental activity, righteous feeling and power of discrimination between right and wrong.
