It has increased the attendance in some cases, as of course the more days a pupil attends school, the more is the mileage received by them, which may be an incentive to some. We wish it might be understood by both parents and pupils, that marking or defacing the school building or property is strictly against the law, and all committing such offence, are liable to heavy fines.
