- 3. To hear the reports of Agents, Auditors, Committees, or officers chosen and pass any vote relating thereto.
- 4. To see what sum of money the District will vote to raise and appropriate for the support of schools, for the payment of salaries for school district officials and agents and for the payment of the statutory obligations of the District.
- 5. To see if the voters of the Stewartstown School District will authorize the School Board to enter into a contract or contracts for the academic year 1968-69 with any or all of the school districts of Colebrook, N.H., Pittsburg, N.H. and or Canaan, Vermont, for the attendance of tuition high school pupils under the terms of standard New Hampshire Dept. of Education Form A-9, "Contract with Academy or High School."
- 6. In the event that the foregoing article is adopted, to determine by vote of the Stewartstown School District whether to continue the present system of allowing high school students to attend such high school in the area as they or their parents may choose, or whether, in view of widely varying tuition rates at such high schools, to authorize the

Report Of The Superintendent

To the School Board and the Citizens of the School District of Stewartstown

FOREWORD

The large school building of the modern city and the little red schoolhouse of the pioneer hamlet are part of our picture of life in the United States. As American as apple pie, the schoolhouse is a symbol of community cooperation for the welfare of children and youth.

What every community needs in its schoolhouse is a structure, and a setting for it, that will make it possible for the community to have the best educational program that today's wisdom can devise, and at the same time to keep the way open for the improved program that the future will develop. Today the immediate need for additional school building in Supervisory Union No. 7 cannot be overlooked. The problem is not so simple, however, as that of merely replacing or extending the school facilities now in use. The more that today's citizens reflect on the demands to be met by the school plant, the more they realize that new schools must be more spacious and must be provided with many more mechanical features than the typical building in use today. This added space and serviceability means added costs. Even without these improvements, costs of construction have risen to such levels that new buildings of the most conservative type are far more costly than any previous schoolhouse construction. And, although added costs must be met, school money remains as difficult as ever to secure.

In this series of dilemmas the school administrator and school boards must exercise their soundest judgement. New buildings must be built; some old buildings must be rehabilitated. The school boards and administrator should make their decisions on building policies with the help of the school staff, other citizens of the community, and such expert consultative services as are available. They will want to inform themselves on accepted principles and desirable practices in providing a total school plant that will meet present and future community needs.

Every citizen should see that the school buildings in his community meet the following criteria:

- Curriculum adequacy--do they provide the space and facilities for the educational program that your community needs for its children, youth, and adults?
- Safety and well-being-do they not only protect against danger but also provide a positive influence for improving the health and physical welfare of the pupils?
- Interfunctional coordination—are they so planned that the activity in each part of a building may be coordinated harmoniously with related activities and may be carried on effectively without disturbing other activities?
- Efficiency and ability--are they so planned that the handling of materials and the comings and goings of pupils, school staff, and the public are accomplished with a minimum of interference and a maximum of ease and satisfaction to all concerned?
- Beauty--are they pleasing in appearance, with simplicity, usefulness, and balance as ideals, rather than ornamentation or symmetry?
- Adaptability--are they so planned that they can be enlarged or rearranged internally to meet new educational demands with a minimum of additional cost?
- Economy--are they so planned that in original outlay and in future operation the utmost in educational utility can be secured for every dollar spent?

Each schoolhouse in the nation reflects the degree of concern of each citizen for the welfare of the children in his community.

MAINTENANCE REPAIRS

At the West Stewartstown Building the repairing and renovation of the roof by contractor Milton Adair was the major expense under this caption. Included in the work done was the repair of the front steps, interior painting, roofing and general repair to the side porches, and the painting of the basement floors.

General repair on grounds and buildings was done at the Hollow School Building endeavoring to keep the school property in a good state of maintenance.

NOTES ON THE BUDGET

As will be noted in the financial section of this report the School Boards' Budget and that recommended by the Budget Committee is \$109,766.00, a substantial increase over the 1967-68 budget of \$98,588.00. Next years estimated income of \$37,500.00 leaves \$72,266.00 to be raised by taxes by the town. The increasing tuition rate is the most important factor in the budget increase.

SCHOOL HEALTH

The objectives of a school health program are to perform the necessary functions to maintain and promote good health of the pupils in our schools. This contributes to the overall success and happiness of the students and enables them to perform better academically.

Services performed include: pre-school clinics every spring for in-coming first graders; checking height and weight of each student at the beginning of each year; testing vision and hearing of all pupils yearly; physical examinations for all students in grades 4, 8, 11, and athletics; immunizations as necessary; annual skin tests for T. B. in grades 1, 4, 8, 12, and personnel; and continuous supervision of general health.

As in the past two years, a dental health clinic was available to children in the elementary grades. A total of 45 youngsters from the whole union were treated at this clinic.

Generally speaking, the overall program of school health in this area is adequate, but as in all things, there are areas for improvement. It is hoped that by everyone working together these can be realized to the mutual benefit of our students and community as a whole.
