TOWN WARRANT

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Stoddard in the County of Cheshire in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at Town Hall in said Stoddard on Tuesday, the thirteenth day of March, next at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.
3. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for Highways and Bridges for the ensuing year.
4. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for snow removal for the ensuing year.
5. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for the General Expenses of the Highway Department for the ensuing year.
6. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for Old Home Day.
7. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate or set aside the sum of one hundred, sixty-seven dollars and ninety-eight cents (\$167.98) for T. R. A. so-called.
8. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of Taxes.
9. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the expenses of the Fire Department for the ensuing year.

10. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$39.00 (1/100th of 1% of the valuation) to the Monadnock Region Association of Southern New Hampshire for issuance and distribution of printed matter, Newspaper and magazine advertising, calling attention to the resources and natural advantages of the Town, in co-operation with the other 37 towns of the Monadnock Region.

11. To see if the Town will vote to accept the provisions of the Municipal Budget Act.

12. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for Street Lights.

13. To see if the Town will vote to petition the State Tax Commission to have an audit made by the Municipal Accounting Division and to make appropriations to cover the expenses of such audit.

14. To see if the Town will vote to take any action for the control of white pine blister rust, and raise the necessary money for the same.

15. To see if the Town will vote to support United States membership in a general system of international co-operation, such as that proposed at the Dumbarton Oaks Conference, having police power to maintain the peace of the world.

16. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

REPORT OF SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

To the School Board and Citizens of Stoddard:

I hereby submit my third annual report as Superintendent of Schools.

SCHOOL ORGANIZATION

School Board: Kenneth McClure, Chairman; Mrs. Lucy Hill, Mrs. Ruth Mansell.

Superintendent of Schools: Howard F. Mason, Hillsboro, N. H.

Teacher: Mrs. Mary Lane.

School Nurse: Margaret E. Harris, Keene, N. H.

Attendance Officer: Kenneth McClure.

PUPIL DATA

One girl, Irene Lanow, was graduated from the eighth grade of the Stoddard schools in June 1944.

During the school year 1943-44, Ellen Mansell and Edward Grantier, maintained perfect attendance for the school year.

The Center School opened with an enrollment of 20 distributed somewhat uniformly over the eight grades. Later four pupils entered from the Munsonville section so that the present enrollment is 24.

GENERAL REPORT

Last summer I was quite disturbed when Mrs. Whitcomb telegraphed me stating that she had accepted a position teaching the first grade at Pittsfield, N. H. Knowing the extreme shortage of teachers and their lack of desire to teach in rural schools I almost despaired of being able to open the Stoddard school. Fortunately for us all Mrs. Lane accepted the call and agreed to teach the school. I can honestly say that the school is now operating in the best manner that it has at any time since I have had an opportunity to observe it. The pupils are indus-

trious, reasonably well behaved and apparently interested in their work.

The 4 Stoddard pupils who were attending the Munsonville School were transferred to the Center School in November when it seemed that the Munsonville School would be unable to obtain a regular teacher. Mrs. McClure transports these 4 pupils and Elbert Knicely who has not as yet completely recovered from his serious accident of last year. Mrs. Prime continues to transport 8 children from the road leading to Marlow. No other transportation is required.

During the summer the old chimney was replaced by a new one and the stove was placed in a more convenient position. The inside of the school room was painted. Although the board wished to do more repair work than this it was found to be impossible because the manpower just was not available. In fact we were lucky to get as much done as we did.

It has been a pleasure to work with the School Board, P.-T. A., Teacher, and others who have worked so willingly to maintain a school in Stoddard.

ANOTHER ENEMY TO CONQUER

Here is a home front fight that everyone can get into. Last year in this State 558 brush and forest fires burned over 4,648 acres of land, of which 2,788 acres were valuable timber and young growth. With available manpower the lowest of any year since the war started, you can help to keep this loss down by preventing these fires from starting.

Keep in mind these simple rules:

1. Always get a permit from your forest fire warden before starting any fires in the open. Burning under certain conditions is permitted.
2. Never burn unless you have enough help to control your fire—a permit does not excuse you of negligence in case it gets away.
3. Always report any uncontrolled fire promptly to your forest fire warden. Minutes lost are acres lost.
4. Be especially careful with cigarettes, matches and pipes. Smokers caused most of our fires.
5. Never leave a fire unless it is dead out. You can't feel safe while there is a spark left.
