STATE TAX COMMISSION

TOWN WARRANT

STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Stratford, qualified to vote in town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at Town Hall, in the village of North Stratford, on Tuesday, the thirteenth day of March, 1945 at 10 o'clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To elect a clerk for the ensuing year.
2. To elect two auditors for the ensuing year, or to see if the town will vote to petition the State Tax Commission to have an audit made by the division of municipal accounting, and to make appropriation to cover the expense of such an audit.
3. To elect a treasurer for the ensuing year.
4. To elect one selectman for three years, and all other town officers.
5. To see if the town will continue the services of the public nurse and raise money for same.
6. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for highways, bridges, and town maintenance.
7. To see what sum of monies the town will vote to raise for: Libraries, Memorial Day, Skating Rinks, Sewers, Street Lighting, Retirement of Bonds, Long Term Notes, Interest, Insurance, Personal Bonds, any other monies for the town.
8. To see if the town will vote to authorize the selectmen to pledge the credit of the town to raise funds in anticipation of taxes, when necessary for the payment of obligations.

9. To see if the town will vote to authorize the selectmen to administer or dispose of any real estate acquired by the town through tax collector's deeds, or any other property owned by the town.

10. To see if the town will vote to authorize its Selectmen to sell the so-called Cora Graham property now owned by the town, at public auction, or private sale, and to execute to the purchaser warranty deed thereof in behalf of the town.

11. To see if the town will vote to allow discount on any part of the taxes paid before a certain date.

12. To see if the town will vote to raise \$25.00 as a contribution for the White Mountains Region Association, for the purpose of advertising the town.

13. To hear reports of agents, officers and committees heretofore chosen, and pass any vote relative thereto.

REPORT OF SUPERINTENDENT

To the Members of the Stratford School Board:

I hereby submit for your consideration, my eleventh annual report of the stratford schools.

At the close of the school year in June, we lost five teachers: viz., Donald R. Harriman, headmaster, who had been with us for the past ten years; Hollis F. Sawyer, teacher of science and mathematics, who went into the army; Mary L. Nugent, teacher of grades seven and eight; Beverly A. Moffett, teacher of grade six; and Helen McNeil, our substitute commercial teacher, who did very good work for us though she had had no special teacher training. During the summer, the positions were filled as follows: Headmaster and teacher of science and mathematics, John W. Day; teacher of social sciences, Mary Main; commercial teacher, Doris M. Bourassa; teacher of grades seven and eight, Selma K. Smith; and Mary E. Bennett, teacher of grades five and six.

The instrumental music, as in the past, is under the efficient instructor, Mr. G. E. Wentworth. The vocal music and group singing is carried on in a satisfactory manner by the various regular teachers.

Miss Delia B. Hapgood, as in the past, is head of the health department. Her report shows quite a few with defective vision and only about one-third of the cases have been corrected. A great number of defective teeth were reported with only about a ten per cent correction. About twenty per cent of the diseased tonsils have been corrected. Miss Hapgood should have better cooperation from the parents for the good of the children. The uncorrected defects re-

ported have a tendency to militate against most efficient progress in school and health. All children have been vaccinated.

The general statistical report contains some items of general interest which I shall enumerate. The fifteen pupils who had a perfect attendance record are: Lewis Allen, Joan Ellis, Bethany Sawyer, Armand Tetreault, Dwaine Curtis, Jane Cass, Walter Gniady, Norma Johnson, Marilyn Marshall, Richard Ramsay, Shirley Ricci, Annie Treccarten, Dudley C. Johnson, Daisy Bergeron, and Madeline Clayton. There were registered in the schools 255 different pupils with a per cent of attendance of 93.56. One hundred and seventy-five tardy marks were recorded. There were 22 non-resident pupils in the elementary schools and 31 in the high school. Five school board meetings were held during the year. The school board members made four visits to the schools. The superintendent was credited with 564 visits and citizens with 197 visits.

The September school census showed 209 pupils in town between the ages of five and sixteen, but 22 of those, all between five and eight, were not in school. The total registration September 30th was 248, 36 of whom were over sixteen years of age.

The graduating class, June 1944, was composed of the following 14 pupils: Anita D. Bergeron, Marilyn G. Brown, Bernard D. Daley, Daniel D. Daley, Lawrence W. Graham, John Harvey Hapgood, Norma Johnson, Marilyn Marshall, Rilma G. Nason, Hazen Neal Ramsay, Earl W. Smith, Jean G. Taylor, Veronica M. Wakefield, and Barbara C. Walling. Owing to the travel restrictions, the class did not take the customary class trip. The travel conditions are no better this year.

Owing to conditions, due to the war, a few minor changes have been made in the school activities. It is hoped that the conditions may not be for long.

When viewed from all angles and all things are carefully considered, I think there is little reason to become pessimistic over the progress of our schools.

Another Enemy To Conquer!



Here is a home front fight that everyone can get into. Last year in this State 558 brush and forest fires burned over 4,648 acres of land, of which 2,788 acres were valuable timber and young growth. With available manpower the lowest of any year since the war started, you can help to keep this loss down by preventing these fires from starting.

Keep in mind these simple rules:

1. Always get a permit from your forest fire warden before starting any fires in the open. Burning under certain conditions is permitted.

2. Never burn unless you have enough help to control your fire—a permit does not excuse you of negligence in case it gets away.

3. Always report any uncontrolled fire promptly to your forest fire warden. Minutes lost are acres lost.

4. Be especially careful with cigarettes, matches and pipes. Smokers caused most of our fires.

5. Never leave a fire unless it is dead out. You can't feel safe while there is a spark left.
