## TOWN WARRANT

### STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the inhabitants of the Town of Unity in the County of Sullivan in said State, qualified to vote in Town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Unity on the second Tuesday of March next—March 12, 1957—at ten o'clock in the forenoon to act upon the following subjects:

To choose all necessary officers, Agents, and Trustees, for the ensuing year under the Australian Ballot System.

1. To choose a Selectman for the ensuing three years.
2. To choose a Clerk for the ensuing one year.
3. To choose a Treasurer for the ensuing one year.
4. To choose an Overseer of Poor for the ensuing one year.
5. To choose a Tax Collector for the ensuing one year.
6. To choose an Auditor for the ensuing one year.
7. To choose a Highway Agent for the ensuing one year.
8. To choose a Library Trustee for the ensuing three years.
9. To choose a Trustee of Trust Funds for the ensuing three years.

Business meeting called to order at 2 o'clock.

1. To hear the report of the Selectmen and other town officials and pass any vote in relation thereto.
2. To choose all other necessary town officers.
3. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to pay Librarians Salary and Library Tax.
4. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for other Town charges.
5. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for Old Age Assistance and Town Poor Charges.
6. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to pay just debts of Town.
7. To see what sums of money the Town will vote to raise for maintenance of highways and bridges, snow removal, and determine price to be paid for labor and trucks.
8. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of \$400.00 for the control of Blister Rust.
9. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of \$622.35 for Town Road Aid. If this sum is raised the State will contribute \$4,148.98.

10. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of \$500.00 for the benefit of the Unity Vol. Fire Dep. Inc., the Fire dept. to have authority to spend any part of this money for Civilian Defense equipment for the Fire Dept.
11. To see if the Town will vote by ballot to authorize the Selectmen to dispose of property acquired by Tax Collector's Deeds.
12. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.
13. To see if the town will vote to put the tax collector on an annual salary of five hundred dollars instead of a percentage basis.
- 14 To see if the Town will vote to adopt a plan for extending to employees of the Town the benefits of Title II of the Federal Social Security Act (Old Age and Survivor's Insurance) as authorized by Chapter 234 of the Laws of 1951 and to raise and appropriate a suitable sum to defray the Town's share of the cost thereof.
15. If the foregoing article is adopted, to see if the town will authorize the Selectmen to execute on behalf of the Town the necessary agreement with the State of New Hampshire to carry into effect the plan to see if the Town will designate the Town Treasurer as the officer to be responsible for administration of this plan.
16. To see if the Town will vote to raise one-hundredth of one per cent of valuation for the benefit of the Dartmouth-Lake Sunapee Association.
17. To see what the Town will do regarding a heating system for the Town Hall and to raise a sum of money for said system.
18. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

## SCHOOL WARRANT

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### STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the inhabitants of the School District in the Town of Unity qualified to vote in district affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the New Unity School in said district on the seventh day of March, 1957, at eight o'clock in the evening, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose a Moderator for the ensuing year.
2. To choose a Clerk for the ensuing year.
3. To choose a Member of the School Board for the ensuing three years.
- 3a. To choose a member of the School Board for the ensuing two years.
4. To choose a Treasurer for the ensuing year.
5. To determine and appoint the salaries of the School Board and fix the compensation of any other officer or agent of the district.
6. To hear the reports of Agents, Auditors, Committees, or officers chosen, and pass any vote relating thereto.
7. To choose Agents, Auditors and Committees in relation to any subject embraced in this warrant.
8. To see what sum of money the district will raise and appropriate for the support of schools, for the salaries of district officials and agents, and for the payment of statutory obligations of the district and to authorize the application against said appropriation of such sums as are estimated to be received from the state equalization and building funds, together with other income; the school board to certify to the selectmen the balance between the estimated revenue and the appropriation, which balance is to be raised by taxes by the town.
9. To see if the district will authorize the school board, as agents of the school district to dispose of existing school building and lots to which the district has clear titles and apply the income towards the general fund.

10. To see if the district will authorize the school board to appropriate receipts from federal lunch reimbursements, tuition, gifts and any other receipts from miscellaneous sources, in addition to the original appropriation for 1957-58, the lunch program, general expenses, equipment and improvements.
11. To see if the district will authorize the school board to make application for and to receive, in the name of the district, such advances, grants-in-aid or other funds for educational purposes as may now or hereafter be forthcoming from the U.S. Government and/or State Agencies.
- 12 To transact any other business that may legally come before this meeting.

## SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

---

To the School Board and citizens of Unity, I herewith submit my fifth annual report as Superintendent of Schools.

All four teachers returned this year but, due to enrollments by grades, the teaching assignments have been changed. Mrs. Lois Cragin teaches grades one and two; Mrs. Winnifred Towne, grade three; Mrs. Elizabeth Nelson, grades four, five and six; and Mr. Donald Fletcher, grades seven and eight.

Mrs. Kenneth Smith continued as janitor and has maintained the cleanliness of the building in a most satisfactory manner.

Mrs. Irene Chase is the cook for the hot lunch program. The program has operated with no particular financial difficulty. This is partially due to an increased amount of surplus food from the federal government.

A small stage has been constructed in the all-purpose room and will prove useful for the various school activities as well as for those of the community organizations.

The continued efforts of the citizens in raising money to provide hard surface walks, and for surfacing a road into the school, have proved to be a big factor in keeping sand and mud off the floors. It also does much to unite the citizens in a community to solve a common problem, in my opinion.

The transportation systems being operated by Mr. Stone and Mr. Lund have been very reliable.

Miss Florence MacIver, school nurse, has had an especially busy year with the polio and other clinics in addition to the routine testing program. The supervisory union purchased an orthorater which has been used to identify eye defects more quickly and accurately.

The budget reflects increased costs of supplies and tuition charges. It will be necessary to provide increases to retain or provide for replacements of teachers in an extremely competitive field this year.

Miss MacIver and I, along with the teachers, wish to express our appreciation to the school board and citizens for your support and cooperation. It will assist us in trying to educate and maintain the health of your boys and girls.

## SCHOOL NURSE'S REPORT

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This past year has been a very busy one in our school health program. The Salk vaccine clinics continued during the summer and on into the fall and winter. Salk vaccine has been made available to all of our school as well as pre-school children through the many clinics which were held. Nearly all of the children have had two inoculations of the vaccine and will receive their third in the very near future. Response to the Salk vaccine program has been excellent.

The yearly inspections of the school children have been carried out. These inspections include the following:

1. Examinations for the detection of scalp ring worm.
2. Vision tests.
3. Height, weight and general observation.
4. Hearing tests.

Notices of defects observed were sent to parents for their consideration. Follow-up home visits were made by the school nurse. Response from the parents was very good. Assistance in the correction of defects, in some instances, was provided by local service organizations as well as by state agencies.

Among the local organizations providing financial assistance are the P.T.A. groups, the Lions Clubs and the Rotary Clubs.

The state agencies offering financial assistance include the Crippled Children's Services, the Sight Conservation Program, the Child Guidance Clinics and the State Public Welfare.

The assistance of these various agencies and organizations makes possible, in many cases, the future health and happiness of our children. Their assistance is greatly appreciated.

It has been a great pleasure and privilege to have spent another year in the school health program. I would like to say "Thank You" for your great interest and cooperation in the work.
