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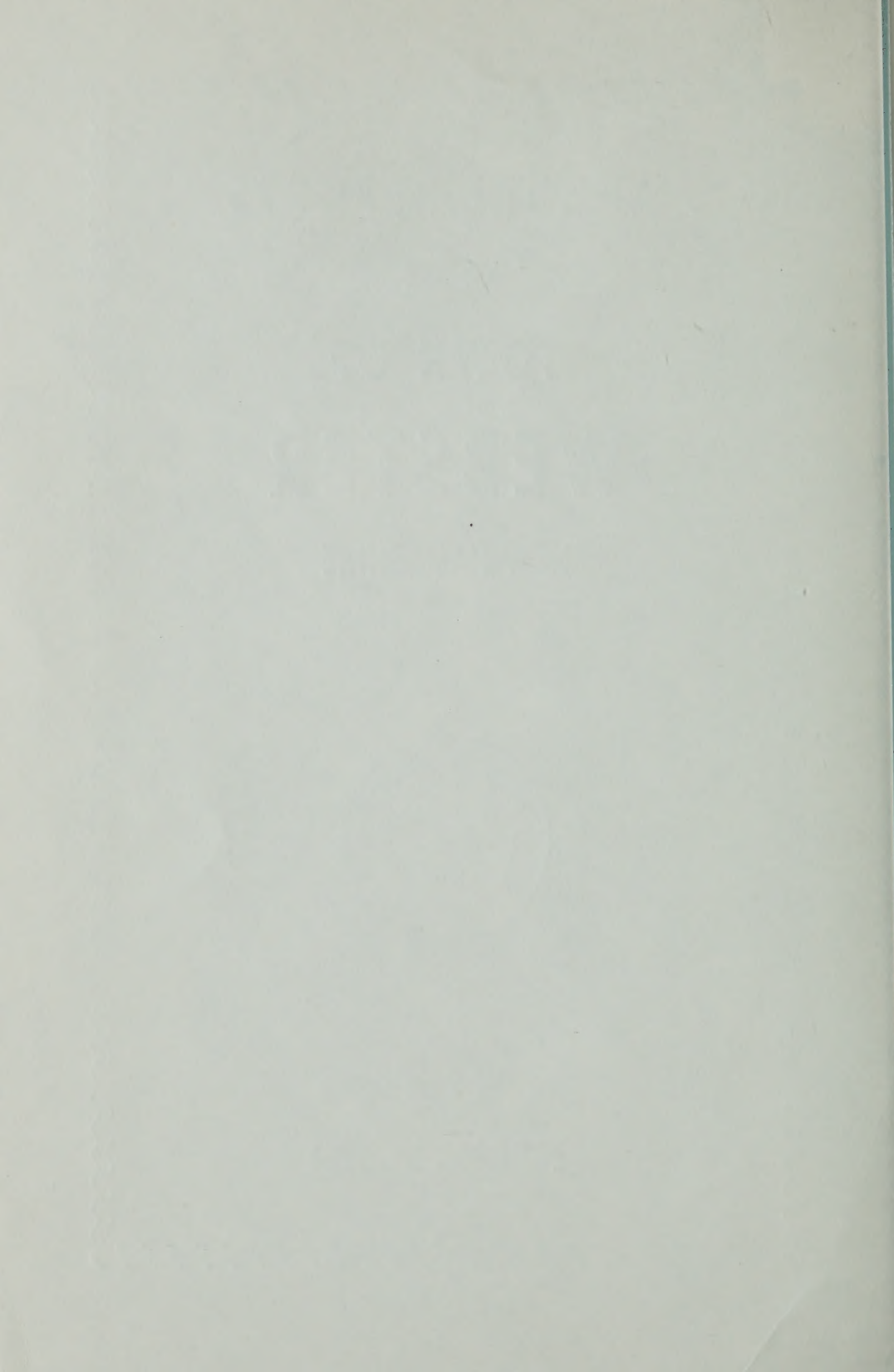

WARRANT FOR THE ANNUAL TOWN MEETING

THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

(L. S.)

To the inhabitants of the Town of Webster, in the County of Merrimack, in said State, qualified to vote in town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at Grange Hall in said Webster on Tuesday, the 13th day of March, next at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To see if the Town will vote to increase the pay of Town Officers and fix the amounts of same.
2. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
3. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.
4. To raise and appropriate such sums of money as may be necessary for the maintenance of highways and bridges.
 - a. Summer Maintenance.
 - b. Winter Maintenance.
 - c. Tar Roads.
 - d. General Expense of Highway Dept.
 - e. Street Lighting
5. To raise and appropriate the sum of \$528.09 for Class V road construction.
6. To raise and appropriate such sums of money as may be necessary for public welfare.
 - a. Town Poor.
 - b. Old Age Assistance.

7. To raise and appropriate such sums of money as may be necessary for the support of the Town Library.

8. To raise and appropriate such sums of money as may be necessary for patriotic purposes.

a. Old Home Day.

b. Memorial Day.....

9. To raise and appropriate such sums of money as may be necessary for the support and maintenance of the Hy-Mar Fire Department, including forest fires.

10. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the care of cemeteries.

11. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$400 for use in connection with the state program for the eradication of White Pine Blister Rust.

12. To see if the town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$90.00 toward the operating deficit of the Concord Hospital, this amount being based on the number of patients admitted from Webster.

13. To authorize and empower the Board of Selectmen to borrow for the town, by issuance of notes, a sum not exceeding \$25,000 in anticipation of taxes for the year 1962, said notes payable from said taxes within one year from date of issuance, and to authorize the Board of Selectmen to determine the rate of interest on

14. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$100.00 for the maintenancs of the playground.

15. To see if the town will vote to raise \$25.00 to be expended in cooperation with the New Hampshire Forestry and Recreation Commission for the opening and maintaining of trails, old trails, and old roads for forest fire protection. The New Hampshire Forestry and Recreation Commission to provide a matching sum

not in excess of \$25.00 for this purpose.

16. To consider the resolution as presented by Herman J. Wibel at the March 1961 Town Meeting, and adopted by the Town and listen to the report of the committee.

17. To authorize and empower the Board of Selectmen to make all necessary contracts and agreements, on behalf of the Town, with the Daniel Webster Grange for the purchase of the Grange Hall and the land upon which it stands for the sum of One Dollar for the use of a community building.

18. To see if the town will vote to use whatever amount is necessary of the Town Hall Sale Fund, on deposit in Savings Banks, to purchase and remodel the Daniel Webster Grange Hall.

19. To see if the Town will vote to use the money on deposit in Savings Banks from the Town Hall Sale Fund and to raise and appropriate whatever more is necessary to build a new Town Hall.

20. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money to purchase land on which to build a new Town Hall.

21. To transact any other business that may legally come before the meeting.

REPORT OF FIRE CHIEF

As retiring chief of the Hy-Mar Fire Company I take this opportunity to express my pleasure and satisfaction with the excelent condition in which I leave the Company, and my gratitude to those responsible for it.

When the addition to the fire house was built, firemen and townspeople donated over \$1,700.00 in lumber, labor, trucking, and mill work. The Company now has two high pressure pumpers, a tank truck, and two auxiliary pumps. One Barton 500-gallon-per-minute pump, carrying 1,700 gallons, provides the equivalent of 17,000 gallons at low pressure. (Our No. 1 engine was the first to cross Lake Erie on a boat from Detroit to Buffalo.)

A few years ago we set up a mutual aid program in cooperation with five other towns. Press a button at Courser Hill and, if needed, these towns with trained men and equipment will come to assist us.

Our Rescue Squad, two members of which are trained nurses, has resuscitators, stretchers, first aid kits, and other equipment. Instructions in rescue work have been given by the Concord Police, the Penacook Rescue Squad, and the Red Cross at Concord. Sixteen members have completed the first course and ten have taken the second. The Squad is under the leadership of Kenneth Hoar, whose willingness to serve and whose outstanding cooperation have gone far to make it a success.

Heroic deeds were performed by William Phelps at his fire; Robert Roby, at Clough Hill entered the burning building at the risk of his own life, and brought out a 160-pound woman under one arm and a hound dog under the other, both overcome by smoke. We have learned by trial and error, and you now have firemen who can do these jobs without thought of the risk involved.

Every 15 seconds a fire breaks out in the U.S. Every 46 minutes a life is claimed by fire — 11,300 a year. The arsonist, a potential murderer, may strike anywhere, anytime. Property loss in this country, according to 1959 statistics, amounted to \$1,047,073,000.00.

Get this little pamphlet, "60% are Preventable", from your insurance company. The facts you learn may save your home or your life. Common hazards we see every day, but fail to observe or do anything to overcome, may cause a fire. The only persons who can prevent loss by fire are property owners or occupants.

TRAIN YOUR FAMILY — what to do in case of fire, how to telephone! If you have, or see, a fire **DIAL MI 8-2188**. If the telephone is out, send a messenger. **BUT PUSH THAT BUTTON AT COURSER HILL**. If you need the Rescue Squad, **DIAL MI 8-2188**.

Credit for the present efficiency of your fire company is due to many people:

The State Fire Marshal's Office, which has always been willing and ready to help determine the cause of fires of unknown origin.

The adjoining towns that have helped us many times, especially Warner, whose arrival with water saved the Pearson barn, and Hopkinton, which had the Kimball fire under control when Webster arrived.

The Selectmen, officers and men of the Hy-Mar Company, and the ladies who have prepared lunches and coffee.

Last, but by no means least, the particular thanks of every resident of Webster is due Mr. C. E. Hyde, whose most generous gifts of engines and equipment has made it possible for us to build a fire department second to that of no other small town anywhere.

AN APPEAL FROM YOUR FOREST FIRE WARDEN

In these days of constantly rising taxes and wages, any unnecessary expense is an added burden on everyone's pocketbook — yours and mine. Forest fires cost money and damage our valuable woodlands. Lightning sets some forest fires, but we have no control of lightning. Children cause many fires. Ninety-eight percent of our forest fires result from human carelessness — our carelessness. This, we — you — and I can do something about.

When we require you to obtain a permit for out-of-doors burning or forbid you to burn on days of high fire danger or set up regulations — hours, etc., governing the use of the town dump we are simply protecting yours and the town's interests.

The ever present threat of forest fires is the concern of all of us; the responsibility for preventing them is ours and the costs of extinguishing are ours. We can do something about this problem, by being aware of and alert to the danger and by cooperating with your warden.

Do the things that are required of you —

1. Follow the warden's directions.
2. Secure the required burning permit.
3. Keep your fires under control.
4. Completely extinguish your fires before leaving them.
5. See that your children are properly cautioned.

Everyone will benefit by it.

REPORT OF WEBSTER SCHOOL BUILDING ADDITION COMMITTEE

The Voters at the Mar. 14, 1961 Webster School District approved Articles 10, 11, 12, 13 & 14 of the Warrant. These articles authorized this Committee to borrow \$35,000.00 and proceed with the addition of two classrooms to the present school building.

The program of increasing the size of the school building is outlined in item 5 of the Webster School Building Study Committee Report (page 63 of the 1960 Annual Report).

After a number of meetings with the Architect, bids for the borrowing of the authorized funds and for the construction of the addition were advertised. Three bids were received for the bonds and four for the construction.

The bond issue was awarded to the Mechanics National Bank of Concord and the construction contract awarded to Lull and Prescott of Elkins.

Construction commenced June 10, 1961. Classroom 4 was ready for opening of school September 5, 1961. Class room 3 was completed about 6 weeks later.
