- 7. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the fire department.

- 8. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Town poor.
- 9. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$8.98 for the White Mountain Regional Association.
- 10. To see what the Town will do in regard to extending the light line at Chappel Hill.
- 11. To see if the Town will vote to appropriate the sum of \$710.00, of their balance in the Treasury, to pay the interest and payment on the light line note.
- 12. To transact any other business that may legally come before the meeting.
