

#### THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the inhabitants of the Town of Campton in the County of Grafton in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Campton on Tuesday, the tenth day of March next, at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.

2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriation of the same.

3. To see if the Town will vote to elect by ballot and major vote three Police Officers to serve for the ensuing year, one to serve as Chief, and two to serve as Police Officers in place of the Special Police Officers heretofore appointed.

4. To see if the Town will vote to qualify for State Aid for highways under the law passed at the January session, 1905, with amendments.

5. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate \$2,064.00 for the permanent improvement of highways for the ensuing year and where same shall be expended.

6. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate \$1,100.00 for Trunk Line Maintenance.

7. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate \$3,000.00 for State Aid Maintenance.

8. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the maintenance of its highways and bridges and make appropriation for the same.

9. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the selectmen to hire money to defray town charges.

10. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Campton Cemetery, also to clean up and fence other cemeteries in town.

11. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Memorial Day.

12. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the aid of the Emily Balch, Soldiers and Sailors Memorial Hospital.

13. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$400.00, the State adding \$100.00 for the purpose of controlling the White Pine Blister Rust.

14. To see if the Town will vote to accept reports of Agents and Officers heretofore chosen.

15. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

#### SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

Mrs. Chairman and Members of the School Board:

I hereby submit for your consideration my twelfth annual report of the Campton schools.

The schools opened September 2, 1930, with the following teachers: viz., Mrs. Beryle D. Currier, Village; Leona P. White, Lower Village; Josiah B. Kelley, Center; Eleanor B. Rock, Beebe River Grammar; Doris L. Smith, Beebe River Primary; Mrs. Jane K. Rittenburg, Livermore Falls; Eunice A. Baker, Blair; Beth Bolton, Bog; Viola M. Pray, Branch; and Sylvia E. Gilman, West Road.

All school buildings, except the West Road, were painted inside. Another chemical toilet was installed at Livermore Falls and the other repaired to meet the State Board's approval. A change has been made in the toilet arrangement and a wood shed built at the Lower Village. There has been a change in the type of toilet at Beebe River. Some grading has been done at Livermore Falls but more is needed. Some change should be made at the Branch in order to get more and better lighting and a larger place for the fuel. The lighting arrangement at Beebe Primary is bad and the room is very small for the size of the school.

I presume that the special committee that was appointed last March will have some definite recommendations to make to the district in regard to the needs of our school buildings. Commissioner James N. Pringle visited all the school buildings in use in town last spring. In the conference with the selectmen and school board, he made several suggestions. Many of these have been carried out in the repairs made during the year.

There is but one transportation route this year, namely, Beech Hill to Campton Bog school. There are thirty-eight resident pupils, this year, who are attending high school for whom tuition is paid. This year the rate of tuition is considerably less than it has been in previous years.

Five pupils are attending our schools from other towns for whom we receive tuition. There is one other who has attended part of the school year.

The school census taken in September, reported 100 boys and 98 girls or a total of 198 children in town between the ages of five and sixteen. This is 20 less than reported one year ago.

The school registers, last June, showed the following twenty-four pupils with a perfect record for the year and who received a roll of perfect attendance at the grammar school graduation: viz., Village— Charlotte Dole, Moody Dole, Agatha O'Brien and Wellman Washburn; Lower Village—Rupert Brown, Roger Brown, Sidney Cheney, Louise Cheney, Mary O'Brien, Wallace O'Brien, Lester Sargeant and Corina Shepard; Center Campton—Virginia Hutt and Rachel Green; Beebe River Grammar—Frank Comproni, Theo Lurvey and Glen Lurvey; Livermore Falls—Clifton Moulton, Dorothy Moulton and Mildred Moulton; Branch—Beatrice Durgin; Bog—Ruth F. Mitchell, Lilla M. Mitchell and Louise Pulsifer; and West Road—Robert Avery.

The five schools with the highest per cent of attendance are: Lower Village 98.05; Village 97.15; West Road 96.7; Livermore Falls 95.9; and Center 95.01. The average for the district is 95.79. This is .69 better than the previous year. The average length of the schools for the district was 360.8 sessions.

The teachers recorded 16 visits by the school board members, 241 by the superintendent and 395 by citizens and others.

The school board has had seven meetings during the year.

Last June thirteen pupils completed the work of the eighth grade and ten of them entered high school in the fall. The examination of the school children, as a part of the medical inspection, was done by Dr. H. A. Cheney. He found 64 who had bad teeth; 44 with enlarged tonsils; 4 with defective vision; 3 with heart trouble; 4 with enlarged glands and 9 not vaccinated. I hope the notices that have been sent to the parents may be considered seriously and that the defects, as far as possible, may be corrected.

The State Board of Health held Toxin-Antitoxin clinics in the various schools in the months of October and November. I have no data as to the number who received the "shots". This is a long step forward in the health program.

From tests of various kinds that have been given, record of attendance, etc., it is evident that the schools are having a healthy growth. I wish to thank all those who have contributed in any way to make these improvements possible. We all wish to have the largest possible return on our investment.
