WARRANT

To the Inhabitants of Dalton, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Dalton on Tuesday, the 8th day of March next at 12 o'clock noon to act upon the following subjects. The polls will be open at 12 o'clock and will close at 6 o'clock in the afternoon. The business meeting will open at 7:30 o'clock in the evening.

1. To choose all necessary Officers for the year.
2. To see if the Town will vote to give the Selectmen the right to issue temporary loans in anticipation of taxes.
3. To see if the Town will vote to accept the Budget for 1977 as prepared by the Selectmen and appropriate the amounts therein or to make any changes.
4. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Three hundred and thirty dollars (\$330.00) for the purpose of assisting Alpha House, so-called, a place where remedial activities are carried on relative to the health of the bodies and minds of the persons who go there for treatment.
5. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Board of Selectmen to withdraw the sum of \$18,000.00 from the Revenue Sharing Fund established under the provisions of the State and Local Assistance Act of 1972 to pay toward the new Bridge.
6. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Board of Selectmen to apply for, contract for and accept any State and/or Federal Aid and/or funds available at any time relating to disaster or emergencies within the Town, and to expend such funds for repair and relief.
7. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money not to exceed three thousand dollars (3,000.00) to drill an artesian well for the Town Hall.
8. To see if the Town will vote to give the Selectmen the right at the end of the year to take what money is left in the Firemen's Appropriation to put in a Capital Reserve Fund.
9. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen, until directed to the contrary at a subsequent Town Meeting, to apply, negotiate and do all the other things necessary to obtain such Federal, State, or other assistance as may be available for the design of, and construction of a sewage disposal system, and to authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of said assistance as outlined in N.H.R.S.A. 33: 7-b et seq., as amended, and pass any vote relating therein.

10. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of six thousand five hundred dollars (\$6,500.00), for the purpose of preparing plans and specifications on sewerage and sewerage treatment facilities which are requirements contained in the Federal Water Pollution Control Act, as amended (33 U.S.C. 1251 et seq.) and will qualify the Town for Federal Funds, such sum to be raised by the issuance of Serial Bonds or Notes not to exceed ten thousand dollars (\$10,000.00) under and in compliance with the provisions of the Municipal Finance Act (N.H.R.S.A. 33.1 et seq., as amended) and to authorize the Selectmen to issue and negotiate such bonds or notes and to determine the rate of interest thereon, and to take such other actions as may be necessary to effect the issuance, negotiation, sale and delivery of such bonds or notes as shall be in the best interests of the Town of Dalton and to allow the Selectmen to expend such monies as become available from the federal Government under the Financial Assistance Program of the Construction Grants section of the Federal Water Pollution Control Act, as amended (33 U.S.C. 1251 et seq.) and pass any vote relating thereto.

11. To transact any other business that may legally come before this meeting.

REPORT OF POLICE DEPARTMENT

It is becoming increasingly apparent that local citizens must develop an attitude of resistance to crime and understand basic preventative measures can and will reduce their vulnerabilities to criminal acts. Reciprocally, law enforcement must provide the basic guidance necessary to stimulate and sustain this resistance and make it habit forming. The objective is to prove crime could be reduced through citizen participation in meaningful community anti-crime programs with little or no additional funding.

These programs have been tried with favorable success in other communities and we have sent for additional information. There are crime resistance agents available to instruct and assist local law enforcement in making citizen crime resistance a reality.

The radar unit purchased in 1975 got very limited use. This we hope to change as the selectmen have advised of complaints from nearly every road in town. While the majority of citizens try to obey the rules and regulations, there are always some who have a blatant disregard for any laws.

Dogs continue and probably will continue to be a problem. Every year we have a certain few who have to be hounded to comply with the licensing laws.

The following is a comparison of the years 1975 and 1976.

As can be readily be seen, there was a drastic increase/decrease in some areas. Motor vehicle rules and regulations were not strictly enforced which may have been the cause of the sharp rise in the number of accidents. Rapid changes in road conditions were the cause of some accidents. People expect to have black top roads instantly which can not be done. Common sense and good judgment still need to be exercised while operating any machine.

While there was an increase in the number of burglaries, several of these occurred at the same places. Even though the majority of hours worked

was spent in patrolling and property checking, I believe part of this increase was due to the number of CB radios being used. Everybody seems to be getting into the act. With these handy gadgets, they are able to communicate with their partners in keeping track of us. They simply follow us around and do their thing. I know of a few instances where properties were checked during the day and then broken into the same day. Either these parties were very lucky not to be seen or they were simply bold and outright brazen. This is one area we definitely need the help of all concerned.

The previously listed comparison was only a partial listing of the items worked on during the year. We assisted in the recovery of 2 stolen cars, 5 trips with patients to hospitals, 12 assists to other towns/agencies, attended 6 fires, 13 dog complaints, several juvenile petitions, 193 misc. calls, etc. This could go on and on but we only want you to be aware of some of the items we get called for. We are not trying to tell you not to call, but when you do call try to be reasonable and we will try to be the same towards the caller.

As in past years, we have worked with several of the surrounding towns, other law enforcement agencies and will continue to cooperate with them as in the past. Our thanks to those agencies and the town selectmen for their cooperation and their understanding during 1976.

1976 was a very busy year at the Whitefield Regional Airport, with many worthwhile projects being accomplished; for example, all the cracks and holes in the runway and apron were routed and filled, as per F.A.A. specifications for our class of airport certification.

A regular air service was run this past summer from June 13th, 1976 to September 13th, 1976. These flights were from Whitefield to Boston and return.

An airport Master Plan is currently being drawn up, such Master Plan being a prerequisite of the Department of Transportation when processing applications for available airport funding.

It has been a pleasure working with our airport manager, Mr. Roland Ferland, the Selectmen of Whitefield, and the Commissioners of Dalton, Jefferson, Lancaster, Littleton, Northumberland and Whitefield.

NORTH COUNTRY COUNCIL, INC.

The Council provided information on the Local Public Works Act.

On a regional level, North Country Council, Inc. completed the Overall Economic Development Program, a blueprint for increasing the region's economic potential. The Council assisted several communities in making progress with the development of their Industrial Parks, projects which will benefit residents of adjacent communities. With the passage of the Local Public Works Act of 1976, the Council provided some form of technical assistance to 25 potential grant applicants. A wood utilization project is investigating how forest products, the region's most important natural resource, can be used more advantageously to the region's benefit. Word was received in late 1976 that the Federal Highway Administration approved the Public Transportation Demonstration project.

On a community planning level, in addition to local technical services, the Council prepared a report entitled "Model Subdivision Regulations" as a guide for local planning boards. A series of four lectures on planning board activities was sponsored in the spring; the Council co-sponsored a series of five municipal law lectures in September and October. Both were well attended. "Guidelines for Municipal Tax Mapping" provides communities with information on what to look for when preparing a tax map.

"Planning News," the Council's quarterly newsletter, disseminates useful information on community planning, economic development, state legislation, court decisions, and general activities to interested persons in town. A town resident can be placed on the mailing list by contacting the town's NCC representative or the Council office in Franconia, N. H., at 823-8108.

In helping communities with their planning, the Council attends approximately 200 night meetings a year.

In 1977, the Council will continue to provide community planning services to member municipalities. The Council will complete work on a Land Use Program and Housing Program in 1977. Efforts to help communities with economic development will continue. The Council's Economic Development Committee will be investigating the probable impact of the lessening of energy supplies for the North Country and how the Council can assist through the community and regional planning process.

The Council sincerely appreciates and thanks the town for its support and participation. The support and participation of the town has enabled the Council to provide an impressive package of local and regional services.

REPORT OF DISTRICT FIRE CHIEF AND TOWN FOREST FIRE WARDEN

Since its beginning in 1893, the State Forestry Department has recognized the fact that forest fire prevention and suppression is a joint state and town or city responsibility. Local authorities recommend names of persons to the State Forester, who appoints one person as town or city fire warden and several other persons as town or city deputy fire wardens to a three year term.

The local forest fire warden controls the kindling of all outside fires, when the ground is not covered with snow, by issuing a written permit for kindling a fire. Permits are only issued at such times and in such places as the fire warden deems as safe.

The State Forest Fire Service trains the local forest fire organization in modern forest fire prevention and suppression tactics. The State also provides backup personnel and equipment for suppression and prevention activities.

The combination of State and local forces has resulted in one of the smallest acreage loss due to forest fires in the United States for the past 20 years.
