TOWN WARRANT STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Derry, qualified to vote in Town affairs:

You are hereby instructed to meet at the Veterans' Memorial Building in said Town on the second Tuesday of March next, at ten o'clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To elect one Selectman for three years, Town Clerk, Treasurer, Collector of Taxes, Library Trustees, Trustees of the Trust Funds, Auditors, and all other necessary Town officials for the year ensuing.

2. To vote to raise and appropriate such sums of money as may be necessary for the maintenance of the poor, for laying out and repairing highways, for building and repairing bridges, for the suppression of moths, for the police department and municipal court, for hydrant service and electric lights, for salaries of town officials, for the Board of Health, for the expense of the Town halls, for the support of libraries, for state and county taxes, for the observance of Memorial Day, for aid to the Derry Visiting Nurse Association, for playground purposes, for co-operating with the state and federal governments in control of the white pine blister and for all other necessary charges arising in said Town, and pass any vote relating thereto.

3. To see if the Town will accept state aid for construction of the Class 2 road known as Island Pond Road and raise and appropriate, or set aside for said purpose, the sum of \$2756.25; or will accept state aid for construction of Class 5 roads and raise and appropriate, or set aside for said purpose, the sum of \$996.64, and pass any vote relating thereto. 4. To see if the Town will direct the Collector of Taxes to allow a discount to all persons paying their taxes within such period as the Town shall limit, to fix the rate of such discount, and pass any vote relating thereto.

5. To see if the Town will vote to authorize its Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of the taxes for the year 1937 on the negotiable notes of the Town, said loans to be repaid from 1937 taxes collected, and pass any vote relating thereto.

6. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$5,000.00 or any other sum of money, for the purpose of advertising and giving publicity to the natural industrial advantages of the Town of Derry, and pass any vote relating thereto.

7. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$500.00 for free public band concerts in the Town during the summer of 1937, and pass any vote relating thereto.

8. To see if the Town will vote to constitute itself one single highway district for the repair, construction and maintenance of all town roads and highway within the town in accordance with Chapter 80 of the Public Laws as provided in Section 8, 9, 11, 12, 13, 14, 15 and 16 thereof, and pass any vote relating thereto.

9. To see if the Town will authorize its Collector of Taxes to appoint a Deputy Collector, and pass any vote relating thereto.

10. To take the sense of the voters on the following question, viz: Is it expedient to revise the constitution?

11. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1675.00 for the purpose of paying this sum to Mrs. May T. Johnson which is the amount agreed upon between her and the Selectmen in full settlement for injuries sustained by her on a defective culvert on Norton Street, and pass any vote relating thereto.

12. (By petition) To see if the Town will vote to remove garbage and rubbish weekly from the business section and more populated section of the Town, and pass any vote relating thereto.

13. (By petition) To see if the Town will vote to provide for the children of Derry one swimming place, one skating place and three streets to be set aside for the purpose of coasting, and pass any vote relating thereto.

14. To see if the Town will vote to rescind its action taken at the annual meeting in March 1936, whereby it voted to adopt the Municipal Budget Act, and pass any vote relating thereto.

15. To hear the reports of Agents, Auditors and committees, heretofore chosen, and pass any vote relating thereto.

16. To appoint any necessary committee on any article embraced in this warrant.

#### DERRY PUBLIC LIBRARY

To the Trustes of the Derry Public Library: The 32nd annual report is herewith presented:—

As we have just completed ten years in our new library building perhaps a glance backward will be interesting. Ten years ago we had 8,249 books, today we have 10.590. Not a large growth perhaps but the drain on account of worn out books is large because of our large circulation. The circulation at that time was 43,802, the past year it was 54,427. This is 9,467 less than last year and 15,649 less than our largest year's circulation in 1933. As we did not take undue credit for our large circulation neither do we believe that the decrease is a reflection on the service the library is rendering to the community but rather a natural condition resulting from more work being available to the citizens of Derry and they therefore having less leisure time. The increase and also the decrease has been largely in the fiction class. The past year the percentage of nonfiction read has increased.

The report of the New Hampshire Library Commission states that the per dapita circulation in the state is 6.7%. Our own per capita circulation is over 10%which is considerably above the average. There are two other libraries in our town, at Pinkerton Academy and at East Derry, the combined circulation of which would bring the per capita circulation of Derry higher yet.

There are less books in circulation and consequently more books are on our shelves making some of them over crowded. New shelving will be necessary in the near future. We have during the year added numerous hobby books on various subjects, also a number of sport books. These have been welcomed by many and continue to be in demand. We feel the constant need of new readable books and never have enough to supply the demand. While our students demand much service and specialized books, we feel that other interests should also be considered and as far as possible supplied. Complying with this need we have purchased books from the lists of the educational program of state, church and club and have also made and distributed lists of our own on local subjects of interest.

The library rooms again were opened to the Flower Show of the Derry Woman's Club and the Derry Garden Club.

During the summer your librarian was restricted from her duties by illness and for over two months Miss Edith Hall, the assistant efficiently carried on. In view of this there was no Vacation Reading Club and your librarian was unable to teach in the New Hampshire Library Summer School as planned. She did however represent the library at the state meeting held in New London in September. Book Week was observed as usual in November.

The same month the interior of the library rooms were redecorated; ceiling, walls, woodwork and floor all received needed attention and now present an attractive appearance.

We wish to extend our thanks to the newspapers for their continued service in publishing our lists and notices and especially to the Derry reporter of the Manchester Union who has given the library much unsolicited publicity.

#### REPORT OF THE LIBRARIAN

To the Trustees of Taylor Library: The 59th annual report is herewith presented:

The library has been open regularly, Tuesdays and Saturdays, afternoon and evening with the exception of three holidays, February 22; May 30, and July 4, which fell on Saturday, a total of 458 hours on 101 days.

We sponsored a vacation reading course for children during the summer and a Self Improvement reading course for rural women this winter. We acknowledge with thanks, the loan of a number of books for the latter course from Derry Public Library. We also thank friends who have given us books, magazines and newspapers.

We have continued our service to the rural schools. The school in district number six was closed in June but we still send books to district number seven on the Island Pond road. The teacher circulates the books among the children and others in the district who on account of the distance are unable to come to the library.

To help our school children in reference work, we have purchased the one-volume Columbia Encyclopedia; Rugg's Story of Civilization and Readers' Guide to Periodical literature. Our historical and genealogical shelves have received four volumes of The Compendium of American Genealogy also several family genealogies in print and manuscript.

The Librarian attended the meeting of State Library Association at New London, N. H. in September. Mrs. Julia M. Goldsmith has served as associate Librarian during the year.

# REPORT OF THE SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

To the Derry School Board:

Since my last report the two-grade room at Oak St. has been combined with a similar room at the Floyd so that now no teacher has more than one grade in a room. In addition to this the transportation routes have been extended so that pupils from rural districts Numbers 5 and 6 are having exactly the same privileges as are the pupils in town.

This has resulted in better grading, and better school facilities for all.

Substantial repairs have been made at Oak St., Floyd and West Side costing practically 1,000 dollars. The school plant, though old, is in first class condition and is in no way inferior, so far as educational results are concerned, to new buildings. Teacher salaries have been increased and to some extent equalized and plans laid for an assembly and school exhibit and library room in the Oak Street School.

Derry has school-room facilities for a substantial increase in school population; proof of this is seen in the two unoccupied rooms in the Floyd School and in seating capacity for at least 50 additional pupils for grades seven and eight at Oak St.

Scholastic Accomplishment. A fairly high quality of class-room accomplishment in our schools is indicated as pupils from other systems, in State and out, come into Derry Classes and, also, as Derry pupils go elsewhere, nevertheless, there is still plenty of opportunity for improvement: The most noticeable changes in these schools as higher standards have been insisted on, are a high percent of attention and the habit of business which prevails in most of the class-rooms:— A spirit of serious, youthful research such as did not prevail in the schools of my boyhood.

School supervisors and inspectors are well aware of the fact that as class-room requirements become more rigid the pupil's willingness to work becomes greater! Easily aquired promotions, based chiefly on the number of years spent in school, never did and never will develop scholarship or create a willingness to work, on the contrary such wholesale advancement tends to kill the ambition of the better scholars who see no inducement for hard work so long as almost everybody is sure of promotion anyway.

Records, Reports and Promotions. The plan of records, reports and promotions mentioned in last year's Annual report is giving a fairly definite basis not only for promotions but for remedial work of a practical kind; The teacher's daily Class Record, even with its known imperfections, by mathematical analysis gives a standard of measurement adjusted to each teacher's individual notion of marking; this, stated a bit more scientifically, means that each class in each subject establishes its own unit of measurement. It is on this standard that the work of pupils in each class is marked as being "satisfactory or unsatisfactory". These marks, U and S, are sent home at the end of the first guarter and of the second quarter of the year. Parents are urged to see the teacher at once so that by cooperating parent and teacher may improve the pupils' work at the point where it is most needed but the disappointing thing is that only a small percent of these warnings bring parents to the school to consult with the teacher. No

doubt many who do not accept this invitation do apply some sort of remedy but a better result might follow if parent and teacher worked in close cooperation.

The final promotion is based on the pupils' mark relative to the class average and the results of examinations, the whole being checked by "Standard Tests".

There are at least twelve significant factors combined in the one final result of "passing" or "not passing", at the end of the year.

There can be and no doubt are errors but the chances are at least 20 to 1 that the final result is reasonable.

In September 1935, a few pupils in seventh gradewere given a promotion directly into high school: The results were given in our 1935-36 Annual Report. These same pupils the first half of the present year had an average mark of 81 which is substantially the average of the entire sophomore class:

This past September 11 pupils were similarly advanced from grade 7 to grade 9.

This group during the first-half of the current year have attained an average rank in all subjects of 81.5 which is to be compared with a freshman class average of 80.8. These results so far as scholastic ability goes show that gifted and deligent pupils from the seventh grade are competent to master high school subjects.

There is nothing new or revolutionary about this: It is a fact well established a half century ago even though many educators of 1937 seem never to have heard of it.
