

TOWN WARRANT

THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

L. S.

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Grantham, in the County of Sullivan, qualified to vote in town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Grantham on Tuesday, the 11th day of March next, at nine o'clock in the forenoon to act upon the following subjects:

Art. 1. To choose by ballot and major vote one Town Clerk, one Town Treasurer, one Police Officer, one Overseer of the Poor, and two Auditors for the ensuing year; one Selectman, one Trustee of Trust Funds, one Trustee of the Public Library for the ensuing three years.

Art. 2. To choose one or more Highway agents and all other necessary town officers, agents and committees, and pass any vote relating thereto.

Art. 3. To raise and appropriate such sum of money as may be necessary to defray town charges.

Art. 4. To see what sum of money the town will raise for the support of the poor and Old Age Assistance.

Art. 5. To see if the town will vote to apply for Town Road Aid, and raise \$291.60 for same.

Art. 6. To raise and appropriate such sum of money as may be necessary to repair highways and bridges.

Art. 7. To raise and appropriate such sum of money as may be necessary for snow bill.

Art. 8. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum not exceeding one one-hundredth of

one per cent (1/100 of 1%) of the assessed valuation based on the assessment of 1958 for the purpose of publicizing and promoting the natural advantages and resources of the town, together with other towns in the Dartmouth-Lake Sunapee Region.

Art. 9. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the care of cemeteries.

Art. 10. To see if the town will vote to raise \$200 for control of the White Pine Blister Rust in cooperation with the State Forestry Department.

Art. 11. To see if the town will vote to petition the State Tax Commission to have an audit made by the Division of Municipal Accounting, and to make an appropriation to cover the expense of such audit.

Art. 12. To see what sum of money the town will raise and set aside for the purchase of a new truck, and to authorize the Selectmen to borrow what money is necessary to purchase said truck.

Art. 13. To see what sum of money the town will raise for the use of the fire department.

Art. 14. To see if the town will vote to instruct the Selectmen to sell any property acquired by tax title, if they should deem it advisable.

Art. 15. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money for maintenance of the town dump.

Art. 16. To see if the town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to buy land for a cemetery, and to borrow money for the same.

Art. 17. To see if the town will vote to instruct the Selectmen to hire money if necessary. Art. 18. To hear the reports of the officers, agents and committees heretofore chosen and pass any vote relating thereto.

Art. 19. To transact any other business that may come before said meeting.

REPORT OF THE FIRE CHIEF

Fire Department report for the year 1957 is as follows:

The home of Richard Allard was totally destroyed by fire last February. Loss was set at \$4,000.00 and \$2,700.00 was paid by insurance.

There were two chimney fires with no loss or damage and one gas stove explosion.

One house fire was investigated for possible arson.

Lightning struck the cottage at Gray Ledges which set off an electrical fire at the Farm House. The fire would have been very serious if the men who were haying there at the time had not called the Fire Department. Loss was set at \$2,000.00 which was paid by insurance.

One fireman was injured by a soda acid tank and received compensation from the State Fireman Fund.

The Department answered two Dump fires. One of the Dump fires was costly due to the fact that the portable pump threw a connecting rod and bearing and had to be rebuilt.

The Department has sixteen men which include 2 assistant chiefs, 2 captains and 2 lieutenants.

Members of the Willing Workers Club have been instructed in the use of the Fire Pump and Truck. I feel this will be helpful when the men are at work.

There will be a course in First Aid this year and anyone may take instructions along with the firemen.

We purchased 300 feet of new hose this year and repaired three soda acid tanks.

Due to the cost of repairs on the portable pump we were not able to buy the amount of hose we had planned on so I am again asking the town to raise \$500.00 again this year for the use of the Fire Department.

I wish to thank the men of the Department, Board of Selectmen and the people of the town for their support.

SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

To the School Board and Citizens of Grantham:

The good work by the three teachers, the cooperation of parents, and the interest and study by the pupils has made for good learning this year. Books, supplies, maps and globes have been purchased to improve the learning opportunities for the pupils.

The buildings are now equipped with modern facilities, which are beneficial to the children. The cost of the changes is listed elsewhere in the report.

The repairs last summer were accomplished within the special appropriation, and the item in the budget for repairs. The current amount of State Aid is \$11,443.96, and it should be the approximate State Aid for 1958-9. It appears that the local appropriation for schools for 1958-9 may be substantially less than the amount necessary for the current year.

I thank the School Board, Teachers, and other employees, and the citizens who have worked with the school staff to make possible a good year for the children.

NURSES' REPORTS

All children were seen through routine eye checks, hearing tests and weighing and measuring. I am very happy to report only three children have vision defects and they have been taken care of with glasses. There are no hearing problems, and everybody seems to be growing normally.

Most of the children in the schools and many preschool children have been protected from poliomyletis, diptheria, tetanus, and whooping cough with at least two shots and many have had the whole series of three inoculations. All North Grantham school pupils have had the three polio shots. The credit goes to the parents who, in spite of the distance and bad weather in some instances, brought the children into Lebanon for their polio and toxoid shots. Grantham should feel very happy and safe.

Since the improvements on the school grounds and in the schools, the children seem very happy and content. They are a very healthy group of children.

May I here express my thanks to Mr. Young, the School Board, and all the teachers and parents for all the help they so willingly contributed to make the school health program possible.
