TOWN WARRANT
THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Hebron, in the County of Grafton in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Hebron Community Hall on Tuesday, the tenth of March next at five of the clock in the evening to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all Town Officers for the year ensuing.

 Polls open from five p. m. to nine p. m.
 Business meeting will open at seven p. m.

2. To see what sums of money the Town will raise and appropriate for the ensuing year for expenditures enumerated in the proposed budget appearing in the Town Report. Copy of the budget is attached to the posted Warrant.

3. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.

4. To see if the Town will vote to give two per cent cash discount on taxes if paid thirty days from date of tax bill.

5. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to sell property bought by the Town at Tax Sale.

6. To see what sum the Town will appropriate and raise for the repair of Road No. 72 — The Walter Braley Road so-called — and whether the selectmen are to be authorized to spread the cost over a number of years to be determined at the meeting with authority to borrow money if necessary.

The written bid submitted by the State Highway Dept. calls for the expenditure of \$3,760. — broken down as follows:

Above includes labor, trucks, equipment and materials.

To alleviate flood condition at easterly end of the bridge it is suggested that the channel above the bridge be straightened by opening a new channel across the bend of the river as it approaches the bridge. The channel downstream should be cleared and widened at least as far as the point where the river curves sharply to the left. The estimated cost is \$2,600.

7. To see if the Town will appropriate and raise \$100.00 for the Community Center in Bristol.

8. To transact any other business that may legally come before the meeting.

Other articles may be added before the Warrant is posted.
