### THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

(L. S.) To the Inhabitants of the Town of Hill in the County of Merrimack in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at The Town Hall in said Hill on Tuesday, the Twelfth day of March, next at Seven Thirty of the clock in the evening to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
- 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.
- 3. To authorize the Selectmen to borrow for the Town by the issue of notes, a sum not exceeding \$15,000.00 in anticipation of taxes for the year 1963, said notes to be expressly payable from taxes within one year from the date of their issuance, and to authorize the Selectmen to determine the rate of interest on such notes and to provide for the sale thereof.
- 4. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$500.00 for improvements and maintenance of the Town Dump.
- 5. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$500.00 for the Capital Reserve Fund to be used for Highway equipment.
- 6. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$100.00 for the Bristol Community Center.
- 7. To see if the Town will vote to use the sum of \$500.00 for the purchase of grates for the storm drains and for grading on Ferrin Street and to authorize the Selectmen to withdraw this sum from the accrued income of the Ferrin Fund to defray the cost of same.

8. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

### Preventing Forest Fires Is Our Responsibility

Costs of suppressing carelessly set outdoor fires in New Hampshire in 1962 cost the persons responsible \$5,545. In the same period, the cost to the cities and towns for control of such fires for which no responsibility could be placed cost another \$24,634. What utter waste of tax money and what shameful and needless loss of timber and aesthetic values in the 2,200 acres burned. Residences, farms, and other business places were threatened with possible total destruction.

Carelessly set man caused fires can be prevented if every citizen remembers his responsibility in regard to any source of fires in the open. We can help to keep our fire loss low by remembering these simple rules.

- 1. Dispose of burnable waste at the town dump.
- 2. If waste or brush is to be burned on the premises, obtain a permit from the forest fire warden. Seasonal permits may be issued for approved incinerators and sites.
- 3. Burn safely by picking a clean site, avoiding dry windy weather and preferably burning late in the day.
- 4. Have something to keep the fire under control pails of water, garden hose, sprinkling can, broom for grass fires or shovel will help.
  - 5. Be sure your fire is dead out before you leave it.
- 6. If the fire gets out of control or if you see a fire out of control, report promptly to your warden or fire department. Continue to fight it until help arrives.

There is potential danger when matches fall into the hands of children. It is never too early for parents to instill in the child's mind a respect for fire.

### THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the School district in the town of Hill qualified to vote in district affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said district on the fifth day of March 1963, at 8 o'clock in the afternoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To choose a Moderator for the coming year.
- 2. To choose a Clerk for the ensuing year.
- 3. To choose a Member of the School Board for the ensuing three years.
  - 4. To choose a Treasurer for the ensuing year.
- 5. To determine and appoint the salaries of the School Board and Truant Officer, and fix the compensation of any other officers or agent of the district.
- 6. To hear the reports of Agents, Auditors, Committees, or Officers chosen, and pass any vote relating thereto.
- 7. To choose Agents, Auditors and Committees in relation to any subject embraced in this warrant.
- 8. To see what sum of money the district will raise and appropriate for the support of schools, for the salaries of school district officials and agents, and for the payment of statutory obligations of the district, and to authorize the application against said appropriation of such sums as are estimated to be received from the state foundation aid fund together with other income; the school board to certify to the selectmen the balance between the estimated revenue and the appropriation, which balance is to be raised by taxes by the town.
- 9. To see if the District will vote to approve the recommendation of the Supervisory Union Board that the name of the position Teacher Consultant be changed to Assistant Superintendent and any such action as may be voted by the Supervisory Union Board is hereby approved.
- 10. To transact any other business which may legally come before the meeting.

# Annual Report of the Superintendent of Schools

To the Board of Education and Citizens of the Hill School District:

I herewith submit my fourth annual report as your Superintendent of Schools.

The retirement of Mrs. Ruth Rounds after many years of teaching in Hill was a real loss to the teaching profession and to the pupils of our town. Mrs. Robert Gilbreth stepped in and carried on for the remainder of the year.

At the close of the last school year Miss Cote resigned to accept a teaching position in Salem, New Hampshire.

Miss Patricia LaPlante, a graduate of Plymouth Teachers College with teaching experience in Chichester, New Hampshire, came to Hill at the start of this school year to teach grades one and two.

Mrs. Grace Colby, who has been teaching in Bristol, joined the Hill staff replacing Miss Cote as teacher in grades three and four.

Mr. Hazen, who took over the responsibilities of Mrs. Rounds upon her retirement, continues teaching grades five and six. Mrs. Hilda Greene continues as Music Teacher and Miss Moynihan as School Nurse.

The pleasant atmosphere so evident in school last year with the opening of the additional room continues in evidence this year. Visiting the school is a very pleasant experience. One notes teachers and pupils busy with the work to be done in a relaxed atmosphere. This is so different from two years ago when a harried teacher could not find time to help her children because of so many grades in one room.

We are continuing to emphasize reading with our children as we feel this subject to be basic to their success in all other subjects. Educational television is also being used. This adds to our school program in many ways that would be lost to us wthout this program.

The total appropriation for the next fiscal year is \$46,794.81. This amount of money is considered necessary to adequately serve the educational needs of the children of Hill.

At this time I would like to express my appreciation for the support given our education system by the Board of Education and Citizens of Hill.


