To the inhabitants of the Town of Milan, in the County of Coos, in said State, qualified to vote in town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at I. O. O. F. hall at Milan in said town, on Tuesday the 8th day of March, next at 9 of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary town officers for the ensuing year.
2. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for town officers salaries.
3. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for town officers expenses.
4. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for the repairs of highways and bridges for the ensuing year.
5. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for breaking winter roads 1932 and 1933.
6. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for Trunk Line Maintenance.
7. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for State Aid Maintenance.
8. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for Memorial Day and appropriate the same to the grand Army.
9. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the Public Library.
10. To choose by ballot two Trustees for Cemetery Trust Fund. One for two years and one for three years.
11. To choose one trustee for Public Library for three years.
12. To see what the town will vote for cemeteries.
13. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for town poor.
14. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for State Aid Construction.
15. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise to apply on town debt.
16. To see if the town will vote to give the Selectmen the authority to hire money in anticipation of taxes.
17. To transact any other business as may legally come before the meeting and appropriate money for the same.

18. To see if the town will vote by ballot to choose a man to run the town tractor for one year and look after same.

19. To see if the town will vote to have public dance places licensed.

20. To see if the town will vote to establish a Police Court.

21. To see if the town will vote to extend the electric light line from Lee Wilson's to Henry G. Gosselin's farm in Milan, and appropriate money for the same.

School Superintendent's Report

Milan, N. H., February 1, 1932.

To the School Board of Milan:

I hereby submit the annual report of the superintendent of Schools: it being the twelfth in the series of such reports.

Teachers

The present school year opened with three changes in the teaching corps. In the Hodgdon Hill School, Miss Eleanor Frost a graduate of the Gorham Maine Normal School in the class of 1931, assumed the position made vacant by the withdrawal of the former teacher. Miss Edith Stuart, a graduate of the Plymouth Normal and a teacher of two years successful experience was assigned to the Hamlin School and Miss Hellen Wells, a graduate of the Plymouth Normal in the class of 1931 assumed the duties of teacher at Milan Hill.

Our teachers in town are now all Normal School graduates and several of them have from one to four years of teaching experience. It is my belief that your teachers have a genuine interest in the welfare of their pupils and are putting forth their best efforts in the interest of your Schools.

Attendance

The attendance for the last complete school year was 94.16%—practically the same as for the previous year. The Milan Hill School for the third successive year has the highest percentage of attendance—very close to a perfect mark—98%, while the Jewett School has the lowest mark for the year—91%. Considering the number of pupils, the attendance at the Milan Grammar School has been worthy of praise. A good percentage of attendance is an important factor in the making of a good school.

Tests

The Stanford Achievement tests have been given to all the upper grade pupils. These tests give certain standards which have been proved to be capable of attainment in the various grades and afford a fairly sure and convenient method of checking up the

work. A Standard graduation test was given the eighth grades near the close of the last school year, and it was very gratifying to note that almost without exception the eighth grades of your schools made a very high grade on this test.

Health

Mrs. Doris Swail, a registered nurse and a school nurse of some years experience, was employed this year to do the medical inspection. Mrs. Swail did a very thorough and conscientious piece of work in the time at her disposal and secured some corrections of defects. Several pupils were found to be badly in need of glasses and through her efforts these pupils were examined and fitted by a competent oculist. It would be well, if a nurse could be employed to devote somewhat more time to this very valuable work.

General

The painting of the two school buildings at Milan and West Milan has much improved the appearance of these buildings and the attractiveness of the town in general. A well kept and well painted school building and grounds is a worth while asset to any town and the policy of the School Board in giving such attention to some one or two buildings each year is, I believe wise and good economy. The Milan Village school has been, in part, provided with new seats. There are at present, 66 pupils in this building and about 30 remain through the noon hour. With this number of pupils, a more adequate water supply and better toilet facilities are desirable.

Financial

The Budget of the School Board presented in this report, has been carefully considered and cut down to what seems to be the essentials and is less than was asked for last year.
