THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the Town of New Hampton in the County of Belknap in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs.

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town House in said New Hampton on Tuesday, the eighth day of March next, at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriation of the same.
3. To choose a delegate to the Constitutional Convention.
4. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for the repair of highways and bridges and make appropriation for the same.
5. To see if the Town will vote to accept State aid to be expended on the Winona road and to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,377.00 for same, the State contributing \$2,377.00. Or, if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$721.49 for Class V roads, the State to contribute \$2,883.99.
6. To see how much money the Town will raise for Memorial Day and make appropriation for the same.
7. To see how much money the Town will raise for Old Home Day and make appropriation for the same.

8. To see what action the Town will vote to take in regard to purchasing a new road machine and raise and appropriate money for the same.

9. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate \$300.00 for the support of Laconia Hospital to be used to pay for the care of needy residents of the town.

10. To see if the Town will vote to raise \$400.00 for control of Pine Blister Rust and make appropriation for the same, with provision that only local labor be employed.

11. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to administer or dispose of any real estate acquired by the town through Tax Collector's Deeds.

12. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to hire money in anticipation of taxes.

13. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of \$450.00 to lay a new floor on the steel bridge connecting the lower end of Town with Bristol, and make appropriation for the same.

14. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of \$100.00 for old cemeteries and appropriate money for the same.

15. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to make a ten year contract with the Public Service Co. of New Hampshire for street lighting near the Bristol Bridge.

16. By request: To see what action the Town will vote to take in regard to making permanent improvements on the highway leading from New Hampton Village to the residence of Charles Newhall, and raise and appropriate money for the same.

17. By request of Lakes Region Association: To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate \$158.00 for the Lakes Region Association.

18. To transact any other business that may legally come before this meeting.

REPORT OF SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

To the School Board and Citizens of New Hampton:

I shall refrain in this, my first report, from commenting extensively on the schools as I find them, as my service in connection with them has been but one term. It would be unfair, I think, to all concerned, to form judgments too hastily.

I do wish to say that I am pleased with the general appearance of the inside of the school buildings; all seem to be neatly kept and in good condition generally. This shows that the teachers are good housekeepers and guarding the health of the children.

The pupils seem interested in their work and the discipline is apparently satisfactory. Both are indications of good teaching and bespeak progress. I am certain that good work is being done in all the schools, but feel that better work could be done with more equipment to do with. Text books seem quite adequate, but supplementary reading material in History, Geography, Science, Literature, and along general informational lines, is deplorably lacking. Present day methods of teaching demand more supplementary material than basic text books. A certain definite sum appropriated each year for five years would help meet this need without much additional burden and afford means for a broader and more valuable teaching.

The great event of the year, so far as New Hampton schools are concerned, is, of course, the completion of the new schoolhouse in the village. Teacher and pupils and, I presume, parents of children attending this school were equally delighted when, on the morning of January 3, 1938, this building was opened for school use. The wisdom of building this new schoolhouse in the village

on a lot affording spacious play grounds is to be highly commended, as supervised sports and organized games are becoming more and more recognized as important parts of an educational system. The play grounds are there, and next must come play ground apparatus.

The per capita cost of education in New Hampton, exclusive of tuition paid, is high:—\$107.71. There are only 35 towns paying more; 201 paying less. This is probably unavoidable with so many schools, widely scattered, and half of them with fewer than ten pupils.

I would call your attention to the statistical table. Note particularly the per cent of attendance, the average daily absence, and number of tardinesses in each school. Parents, more than teachers, can help better these records by having children attend school regularly and getting them there on time.

I desire to express my appreciation of the kindly and courteous manner shown me as your superintendent by School Board and citizens since coming here. I trust I may merit the confidence and good will of you all as we work together for the best good of the children of New Hampton. That best good can come only by the cooperation of parents, school officials and citizens.

THE NEW SCHOOL BUILDING

After several years consideration, a new modern school building has been erected on a location which provides adequate play ground facilities for the children.

The land, consisting of several acres, was purchased of Frederick Smith, for the sum of \$800.00.

A contract for \$5,459.42 for the new building was let to the firm of Muzzy and Hopkins of Laconia, they being the lowest bidders. Plans and specifications were drawn by Norman C. Randlett, architect, of Laconia.

The new school building, which is 42 feet long by 23 feet, 2 inches wide, was practically completed and ready for occupancy after the Christmas vacation. All equipment, furniture and lighting fixtures were removed from the old building to the new. A modern sanitary drinking fountain replaces the old water pail and flush toilets are provided for both boys and girls. A basement under the entire building provides ample fuel storage and a place for the children to play on stormy days.

The sum of \$4,000 was borrowed from the Meredith Trust Co., payable by serial notes at 4% interest.

Complete accounts of expenditures will appear in the 1937-38 report.

One boy has been removed from home and has been treated since June 1937 at the fresh air school con-

nected with the Pembroke Sanatorium. A steady gain is being made. This boy will return to his home much improved in general health.

About half of the children requiring dental work done were treated in June and May at special rates at the dentist's office.

The remainder of those needing care were taken care of in May and June 1937.

Below follows the report of this work done by Dr. R. E. Sargent of Bristol.

Thanks are due the Red Cross for a generous contribution. A study of the above report will show that substantial reductions were granted to make possible a total forty-five fillings and twenty-seven cleanings for the above sum. It was the first visit many of the children had ever made to the dentist. School attendance

is more regular when there are no absences due to tooth ache.

The health of the children is improved. The fine spirit shown at the Fiske School is to be commended when the children earned enough to pay for necessary work to be done for all. Much thanks is due those who gave so generously of their time to make the entertainment a success. Transportation to the clinic was provided by the nurse in most instances.

It is hoped this beginning may be followed up each year by at least one examination by a qualified dentist.

I wish to thank all who made this record possible.
