THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

Warrant for 1975 Annual Meeting of the Town of Rumney

To the inhabitants of the Town of Rumney in the County of Grafton and State of New Hampshire qualified to vote in town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Rumney on Tuesday the 4th day of March, next, at 10:00 o'clock in the forenoon, at which time the polls shall be opened for balloting on Article 1 and shall close not earlier than 6:00 o'clock in the afternoon, and you are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Rumney on Tuesday the 11th day of March, Next, at 7:30 o'clock in the afternoon for the second session of the town meeting at which time action will be taken upon the remaining articles in this warrant.

- Article 1: To choose all necessary town officers for the ensuing year.
- Article 2: To raise and appropriate such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and to make appropriation of the same.
- Article 3: To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the maintenance of its highways and bridges.
- Article 4: To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the Fire Department.
- Article 5: To see if the Town will vote to authorize withdrawal from the Revenue Sharing Fund established under the provisions of the State and Local Assistance Act of 1972 for use as a set-off against the following debt service incurred for "Priority expenditures" since January 1, 1971:

Purpose 1973 Fire House Note Amount \$10,000.00

Article 6: To see if the Town will vote to appropriate the sum of \$35,000.00 to purchase a new fire truck, \$10,000.00 of the sum so appropriated to be set off by a withdrawal in that amount from the Revenue Sharing Fund established under the provisions of the State

and Local Assistance Act of 1972, \$5,000.00 of the sum so appropriated to be raised by expending said sum which was raised and appropriated in 1974 for the purchase of a used fire truck and the balance of \$20,000.00 to be raised by borrowing on the credit of the Town through the issuance of a note or notes of the Town to be repaid over a period of two years pursuant to the municipal finance act.

Article 7: To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate to establish a capital reserve fund under Chapter 35 of the New Hampshire Revised Statutes Annotated to be used for the purchase of equipment for the Fire Department.

Article 8: To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate to make the Town's existing fire protection reservoirs fully operative.

Article 9: To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,000.00 for the purchase for the Fire Department of a portable pump, hose and nozzles and attachments.

Article 10: To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$510.45 in order to secure from the state the sum of \$3,403.03 for town road aid.

Article 11: To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$950.00 for the Pemi-Baker Home Health Agency, Inc.

Article 12: To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for ambulance service.

Article 13: To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$150.00 for the New Hampshire Humane Society.

Article 14: to see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,000.00 to be added to the Highway Equipment Capital Reserve Fund.

Article 15: To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the use of the Planning Board.

Article 16: To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$100.00 for the Conservation Committee.

Article 17: To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$500.00 to be applied toward the preparation of a town tax map.

Article 18: To see what sum of money the Town will vote to appropriate for lease of an enlarged town dump site, for the purchase of dump equipment and other capital expenditures necessary to comply with federal and/or state prohibitions against open burning, and to credit against the sum so appropriated whatever balance, if any, remains in the Revenue Sharing Fund established under the provisions of the State and Local Assistance Act of 1972 with the remainder of the sum so appropriated to be raised by borrowing on the credit of the Town through the issuance of serial notes or bonds of the Town pursuant to the Municipal Finance Act, RSA Chapter 33.

Article 19: To see if the Town, pursuant to RSA 31:105, will vote to indemnify and save harmless any officer of employee of the town, for loss or damage occurring after this vote, including reasonable legal fees and costs, if any, arising out of any claim, demand, suit or judgment by reason of negligence or any other act resulting in accidental injury to a person or accidental damage to or destruction of property while such officer or employee is acting within the scope of his employment or office.

Article 20: To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to purchase a comprehensive general liability insurance policy necessary to protect the town and its officers and employees from liability for loss or damage, arising out of any claim, demand, suit or judgment by reason of negligence or other accidental damage to or destruction of property while any such officer or employee is acting within the scope of his office or employment.

Article 21: To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to administer, lease, rent, sell and convey or otherwise dispose of any real estate or mineral rights Acquired by the Town by any Tax Collector's deed.

Article 22: To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes and pay the obligations of the Town.

Article 23: To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to apply for, contract for, accept and expend on behalf of the Town such aid as the Town may now be entitled to receive or hereafter become entitled to receive from the Federal Disaster Assistance Administration.

Article 24: To see if the Town will vote to become a member of the North Country Council, organized in July, 1973, under RSA 36:45-53. The Council has been designated by the State Office of Comprehensive Planning to be the official planning commission for New Hampshire Planning Region One. The objectives of the Council are to provide local planning assistance to member Towns, to work on problems of area-wide concern. The Selectmen appoint two representatives to the Council.

Article 25: In the event of an affirmative vote on Article 24, to see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$750.00 as the Town's share of the operating expenses of the North Country Council for the year July 1, 1975, to June 30, 1976.

Article 26: To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$500.00 for the Baker River Audio Visual Center which was established in 1974 as the result of a Federal Grant.

Article 27: To see if the Town will express its feelings with respect to the possibility of extending Interstate Highway 93 through this town as an alternate route to Franconia Notch.

Article 28: To hear the reports of agents, auditors and committees heretofore chosen and to pass any vote relating thereto and to transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

The commission has continued studying the solid waste situation by circulating a questionnaire in April of 1974 and printing the results in the Plymouth paper. Deep borings were made on the site on February 8, 1975 and the results indicate the site is suitable for a sanitary landfill. A joint meeting with the Planning Board and the Selectmen was attended by all members of the commission concerning the Stinson Lake development.

The commission helped circulate a petition and attended several meetings involved with the Orford to Plymouth Alternative to I-93 through Franconia Notch. A position paper against the Orford route was prepared by the commission and it appeared in the newspaper and was presented to VTN where with other documents has provided evidence indicating that severe environmental impact would result if a four lane limited access highway was built through the Baker River Valley.

The Baker River was monitored every Monday starting in late Spring and continuing through December of 1974. A grant from the Spaulding-Potter Charitable Trusts was obtained through Plymouth State College and the Baker River will be more closely studied to determine sources of coliforn bacteria that on occasion were high during the monitoring period.

PEMI-BAKER HOME HEALTH AGENCY, INC.

ANNUAL REPORT TO THE TOWN OF RUMNEY

The Pemi-Baker Home Health Agency, Inc. is a non-profit organization, (Inc. 7/17/67), supported in part by an annual appropriation in the budget of each member town. The Board of Directors is made up of an appointed member from each town; ministerial representative; nurses and a physician. Its purpose is to provide part-time nursing service in the home, under the supervision of a licensed physician. A Medical Advisory Committee determines and approves medical policies for nursing care and interprets the Agency's services to the public.

There is a standard fee covering each visit. Patients are expected to pay this fee if they are able to. However, under certain conditions fees can be adjusted to reflect the financial ability of the patient, by the Agency Nurse.

The scope of care by the Agency ranges from new-borns to the elderly. The Agency is equipped to handle Medicare; Blue Cross/Blue Shield '65'; Medicaid and private patients.

The Nurses work on a salary basis and all fees are turned over to the Agency. They are on duty Monday-Friday from eight to four. There are two full-time RN's; one part-time RN; and two Homemaker/Home Health Aides.

The office is staffed by a part-time secretary/bookkeeper. She is available Monday-Friday to answer any calls. The telephone number is 536-2232. For your convenience, when there is no one in the office, the Agency has installed a Codaphone to receive any messages.

Anyone living in one of the eleven member towns may ask for a visit from the Nurse. However, treatment and continuing care can be provided for a patient only under doctor's orders.

REPORT OF THE FOREST FIRE WARDEN AND DISTRICT CHIEF

REPORT TO TOWNS

All open burning when the ground is not covered with snow is controlled by the Town Forest Fire Warden in cooperation with the New Hampshire Forest Fire Service. Anyone wishing to kindle a fire out-of-doors when the ground is not covered with snow must have a written permit signed by th3 Town Forest Fire Warden. If the fire is to be kindled on land not owned by the person kindling the fire then he must have the permission of the landowner. No outdoor fires can be kindled between 9 A.M. and 5 P.M. unless it is raining, without the additional approval of the District Forest Fire Chief.

The 1974 forest fire season was one of the worst in the past two decades. Woodlands in central and southern New Hampshire became so dry in mid August that the Governor and Council, upon the recommendation of the State Forester, enacted a partial woodlands closure in Sullivan, Cheshire, Hillsborough, Merrimack and Belknap Counties and a complete woodsland closure in Strafford and Rockingham Counties plus the Towns of Barnstead, Gilmanton and Alton in Belknap County. Through the excellent cooperation of the citizens of our State no major forest fire occurred at any time during the year.

REPORT OF TRUSTEES OF TRUST FUNDS as of December 31, 1974

Three new Cemetery Funds have been established in 1974 as shown on the Report.

In 1974 Individual Trusts earned 5.25% while funds in the Common Trust earned 7.90% or \$5.25 and \$7.90 respectively per \$100.00 of principle and unused interest.

By tradition past and present caretakers have mowed the cemetery lots three or four times during the summer. Exceptions to this custom can be made by specific request to one of the Trustees providing the fund has sufficient income to cover the special care. By Law, a fund's principle cannot be used. Whether the present inflated interest rate and lot care costs will continue, rise, or fall, is uncertain and depends on the general economy. At this time, the yield of the smaller, newer funds is insufficient for extra care unless the principle is increased. The older and larger funds have sufficient accrued interest for more care and it is hoped that these lots can be gradually improved. We have found that the amount of lot care desired varies with the individual. Please contact one of the Trustees in case of question, change in care, or addition to principle of desired.

The Trustees have purchased "Perpetual Care" markers to help present and future Trustees and Caretakers in identifying the lots.

This is the second year that the standard Trust Fund Report has been used, which, by Law, has to be filed with the State.

REPORT OF THE SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

Even when we see all the different benefits that education gives us, we can still wonder whether it's necessary to spend as much money on schools as we do. Can your school be run more economically? Probably every human activity can be conducted more efficiently than it is, and it is likely that your school system is no exception to this general rule. However, let's look at some facts about Rumney education and see how economically - or wastefully - it is being conducted.

When a school district is very small, inefficient operation is inevitable. If a school district has roughly 170 students, then it really faces the choice of having 8 teachers trying to do everything or hiring a few specialists to at least minimally meet the needs of students.

The biggest single item of school expense is teachers' salaries. Are your teachers' salaries too high? Generally speaking, the amount of money people make is related to the amount of education they have. Teachers, curiously enough, are the big exception to this rule. Ironically, teachers provide the educational basis of the income differences that exist in our society, but their own incomes do not reflect the amount of education they have had. This is said not so much to plead for higher teacher salaries as to point out that we are truly getting a bargain when we pay taxes to buy educational services.

It has been pointed out that there is a tremendous surplus of teachers. I agree, but I assure you the number of outstanding teachers remain about the same from year to year. The Rumney teachers work extremely hard to meet the needs of your children and under the merit pay plan, those who are outstanding are rewarded financially.

How does Rumney education stand with respect to administrative costs? Well, if we take expenditures on administration and ask what these expenses are of the total annual cost of schools the answer is obvious - very low. For the most part your school system is very economically administrated.

Your budget for the 1975-1976 school year was prepared with great concern for the economy. The 1975-1976 requested appropriation is only up slightly. Your School Board has spent many hours preparing and analyzing the final budget. Your Principal and teachers have labored many hours trying to find ways of meeting the needs of the students and yet keeping the budget down. The final budget is indeed the result of thoughtful regard for the students and the economy.

EXPLANATION OF SUPERINTENDENT'S AND ASSISTANT SUPERINTENDENT'S SALARY FOR 1973-1974

Chapter 189, Section 48 Revised Statutes Annotated of the State of New Hampshire, requires that the school district annual report show the total amount paid to the Superintendent of Schools as per the following quotation: "Reports. Each superintendent of a supervisory union shall annually prepare a report of the total salary paid to the superintendent, showing in detail the amount paid by the state and each local school district, and their share of same. Said report shall be filed with the school board of each school district involved and shall be included in the annual report of the respective school district as a separate entry. A like report and entry shall be made for each assistant superintendent, teacher consultant, and business administrators, if any is in service in the union."

One-half of the supervisory union expenses is prorated among the several school districts of the union on the basis of adjusted valuations. One-half is prorated on the basis of average daily membership in the school for the previous school year ending June 30th. The salary of \$16,500 which was received by the Superintendent of Schools of Supervisory Union #48 during 1973-1974 was made up as follows: \$2,500 paid by the State of New Hampshire and \$14,000 was prorated among the school districts comprising the Supervisory Union. Allowance for \$800 travel within the Union was also prorated as stated above.

The salary of the Assistant Superintendent during 1973-1974 was made up as follows: \$2,400 paid by the State of New Hampshire and \$11,600 was prorated as stated above. Allowance for \$1,200 travel within the Union was also prorated as stated above. The table below shows the portion of salary and travel charged to each school district:

REPORT OF THE SCHOOL NURSE

The following is a report of the health services of the Russell Elementary School for the school year 1973-1974.

Pre-school registration was held in May with 15 pre-schoolers registering. This is a scheduled day for parents and pre-schoolers to visit and gain information regarding health requirements, school policies and 1st grade expectations.

TB testing, as required, was done on all of the teaching staff, cooks, custodians and school bus drivers. This is done every two years with the cooperation of the N.H. State TB Nurse, Miss Constance Martin.

Height, weights, routine vision and hearing screening, health conferences, first aid treatment and assisting parents with medical doctor follow-up appointments is all a part of the routine health work.

A dental health program was presented to Grade 4 students through the efforts of Mrs. Herberta Stark, N.H. State Dental Hygienist.

Over 90% of all pre-school children are screened at the Pre-School Hearing and Vision Clinic held each year at the Plymouth Elementary School through the combined efforts of the Plymouth Lion's Club, the N.H. Dept. of Public Health and the school nurse.

Home visits are made as necessary or requested for any health problem.

Pre-School registration will be held in May again this year. To inform you of the required immunizations, they are as follows: Measles, German Measles, TB Test, DPT and Polio Boosters. The physical exam by your family physician is recommended.

The Pre-School Hearing and Vision Clinic will be held in April again this year at the Plymouth Elementary School for all four and five year old youngsters in your community.

I wish to thank the teaching staff, the many physicians, parents and students for their fine cooperation this past year.

REPORT FROM THE PRINCIPAL

RUSSELL SCHOOL

When the doors of the Russell School opened this Fall, students were greeted with a clean, bright, and newly painted school interior. We were pleased that the enthusiasm of the faculty was matched by that of the students.

One of the prime objectives at the Russell School this year was expansion of individualized instruction. With individualized instruction a student can progress at his or her own rate. The Ginn 360 reading program has been fully implemented at grades 1 through 8. A variety of stimulating materials are now available to aid students in specific problem areas of reading. Individualization of our Math program is also progressing quite satisfactorily. We have, again this year, put additional stress on Math computational skills.

We have expanded the Berg-Warner program (programmed instruction). The program is utilized not only in the 1-4 grades, but also in the 5-8 grade level.

One area of concern in the Russell School is the library facility. Although we have received several book donations this year, our reference materials must be updated. We hope to continue adding, a little each year, to our present facility.

In our resource room under the tutelage of Miss Godin, our learning disabilities program has been broadened. One new aad very successful aspect of this program has been "movement education" for grades 1-4. The emphasis in "movement ed." has been on refining gross meter skills.

Also in effect in the resource room this year is a much needed speech therapy program. Our speech therapist, Mrs. Goodnough, has interviewed and diagnosed each and every child in the school. Unfortunately, the number of students needing therapy far exceeds the limits of Mrs. Goodnough's schedule. In the basis of the greatest need, several students are presently receiving speech therapy. However, many more students are on a waiting list. We hope to expand this vital program so that all students in need of speech therapy will be facilitated.

Finally, we would like to thank all of the towns-people who have given so much of their time and effort to the Russell School. Several volunteers have been working in the school in an on-going basis. Again this year, Mrs. Chisholm has been helping with the music programs for grades 1-4. Mrs. Chamberlain has been giving art lessons to the children of grades 1-4. hopefully, she will be able to branch out into grades 5-8 later this year. We would like to thank all the people, too numerous to name, who have helped with the student activity program, field trips, and transportation in our athletic programs.
