# TOWN WARRANT

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**To the Inhabitants of the Town of Sharon in the County of Hillsborough in said State:**

You are hereby notified to meet in the Brick School House in said Sharon on Tuesday, the thirteenth of March next at ten of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

Article 1. To choose a Town Clerk, one Selectman for three years, and all other necessary Town Officers.

Article 2. To see if the Town will vote to establish the amount which shall be paid the Town Officers for their services, or take any action relative thereto.

Article 3. To raise and appropriate such sum of money as may be necessary to defray Town expenses.

Article 4. To raise and appropriate such sum of money as may be necessary for the care of cemeteries, or take any action relative thereto.

Article 5. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the use of the Town Health Officer, or take any action relative thereto.

Article 6. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for fire protection, or take any action relative thereto.

Article 7. To see if the Town will vote to install three 100 C. P. street lights in Sharon Center and raise and appropriate \$66.00 for the operation of same, or take any action relative thereto.

Article 8. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$250.00 for Civil Defense, or take any action relative thereto.

Article 9. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of approximately \$108.00 to have street signs (purchased in 1949) painted by the State.

Article 10. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of approximately \$115.00 for a new adding machine.

Article 11. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$416.61 for repairs incurred on the town bulldozer.

Article 12. To see if the Town will vote to prohibit the use of the town bulldozer for private or individual use.

(Proposed by Edward Elliott)

Article 13. To see if the Town will vote to sell the town bulldozer.

(Proposed by John Milton Street)

Article 14. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the purpose of plowing and sanding.

Article 15. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money which might be derived by a tax of forty cents on each one hundred dollars of equalized valuation of the preceding year, to equal ninety dollars on each mile of regularly maintained Class V. highway in the Town, or take any action relative thereto. The allotment from the State will be \$107.80 (The legislature has under consideration a bill that would change the formula for allotting these funds. If the bill becomes law our allotment will be \$341.80).

Article 16. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$181.82 for Town Road Aid, and the State will allot to the Town the sum of \$1,212.15.

Article 17. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money for repairing the Jaffrey Road from Harold Wilson's to the Jaffrey Line.

Article 18. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1500.00 for tarring Temple Road from Route 123 to the New Ipswich line.

Article 19. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,600.00 for tarring of the Temple Road from Route 123 to the Temple line.

Article 20. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$200.00 to be used for Blister Rust control.

Article 21. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$14.00 to the Monadnock Region Association of Southern New Hampshire.

Article 22. To see if the Town will vote to have an audit made and to make an appropriation to cover the expense of same, or take any action relative thereto.

Article 23. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow a sum of money not to exceed three thousand dollars in anticipation of taxes.

Article 24. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$60.00 for interest to be paid on long term notes and temporary loans.

Article 25. To see if the Town will vote to repair the bulletin board on Jarmany Hill Road and raise a sum of money to cover same, or take any action relative thereto.

Article 26. To hear reports of Agents, Auditors or Committees and officers heretofore chosen, and pass any vote relative thereto.

Article 27. To adopt the following bylaw: Under authority S39 Z233 RL it shall be unlawful for any person to kindle or cause to be kindled a camp or cooking fire in this town without the permission of the fire warden.

Article 28. To transact any other business that may legally come before this meeting.

5. To determine and appoint the salaries of the School Board, and fix the compensation of any other officers or agent of the district.
6. To hear the reports of Agents, Auditors, Committees, or Officers chosen, and pass any vote relating thereto.
7. To choose Agents, Auditors and Committees in relation to any subject embraced in this warrant.
8.
