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# WARRANT

## THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

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To the Inhabitants of the Town of Stewartstown, in the County of Coos in said State qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the town house in said town of Stewartstown on Tuesday, the 11th day of March, next at ten o'clock in the forenoon to act upon the following subjects:

1. To see if the town will vote to accept State Aid.
2. To see if the town will vote to accept the budget, as approved by the Budget Committee and to raise money for the same. If not, to see what sum of money the town will vote to raise to defray town charges for the ensuing year as follows:
  - (a) Town Officer's Salaries.
  - (b) Town Officer's Expenses.
  - (c) Election and Registration.
  - (d) Town Hall, office and other buildings.
  - (e) Damage and Legal Expenses.
  - (f) Health Department.
  - (g) Town Dump Expenses.
  - (h) Vital Statistics.
  - (i) General Expense of Highway Department.
  - (j) Civil Defense.
  - (k) Interest of Temporary Loans.
  - (l) County Tax.
3. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for support of the poor.
4. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for support of libraries.
5. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for care of cemeteries.
6. To see if the town will vote to raise two thousand seven hundred dollars (\$2,700.00) for street lighting.
7. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the following departments:
  - (a) Police Department.
  - (b) Fire Department.
  - (c) Sewer Department.

8. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise in addition to that required by law, for the town maintenance.
9. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for winter roads.
10. To see if the town will vote to raise seven hundred fifty dollars (\$750.00) for the North Country Community Services.

  - (g) Collector of Diamond Pond Rent
  - (h) One or more Sextons
  - (i) Trustee of Trust Funds
  - (j) One library trustee for three years ensuing
  - (k) Two members of the Budget Committee for three years ensuing.
  - (l) One member of the budget committee for one year

## REPORT OF THE SUPERINTENDENT

### To The School Board and The Citizens of The School District

#### Foreward

With the allocated "grace Period" granted by the State Board of Education, it has become especially important that Supervisory Union No. 7 analyze its school systems, determine their status, and plan for the direction that these schools will take in the immediate future.

These are not decisions that can or should be made by your appointed school personnel and elected administrative boards alone, for in the last analysis it is you, the voter and taxpayer, that will determine the course and direction that your schools will take.

These decisions become even more complex when considered in light of recent events. Our texts still relate on Columbus's three month voyage over the ocean blue, yet in the past few months three men retraced this historic voyage in fourteen minutes and thirty-two seconds and repeated this fantastic accomplishment one hundred and thirty-two times in eleven days. Even more recently men compounded this feat by traveling to the moon and observing sights never before seen by man. God's greatest mystery, the secret of life, is now revealed to man with his understanding and duplication of the DNA molecule. The moral, social, and religious implications of this scientific discovery are yet to be realized. More history and scientific advancement has been made the last forty years than during man's entire previous span on this planet. Man is no longer concerned with "why" and "how" but with "when" and "how soon".

We can not ignore that these events are having and will continue to have a tremendous impact on education and society, and we are fortunate that we have time to meet this challenge. With the advent of elementary school standards, goals and long range plans will have to be examined and re-examined. What educational services and needs that can or can not be realistically provided must be determined with the greatest thought and community effort. Whether we can afford to prepare our children for a jet and space age orientated society or whether we can afford not to is a decision that each of us will be involved in making.

To meet this challenge through individual community planning and action, and if need be, through inter-community planning and sharing, can and will result in the assurance of maintaining our excellent educational standards and schools and preparing our youngsters for a realistic future.

## SCHOOL HEALTH

The objectives of a school health program are to perform the necessary functions to maintain and promote good health of the pupils in our schools.

Services performed include: pre-school clinics every spring for in-coming first graders; checking heights and weights, vision and hearing yearly; physical examinations for all students in grades 4, 8, 11 and athletics; immunizations as necessary; TB skin tests as recommended by the state TB Association and continuous supervision of general health.

January through April, a dental health clinic sponsored by the local towns and the state in what is called a Matching Fund Program, was held in Groveton one morning a week. Due to transportation difficulties and cancellations from weather conditions only twenty-two youngsters from the whole district were treated this year.

We were fortunate to have a dental hygienist from the state department of Dental Health come and visit all the elementary schools in the area. She gave us interesting instruction in the ways of achieving and maintaining good dental health.

Generally, the overall program of school health in this area is adequate, but there is always chance for improvements. It is hoped that by working together, these improvements can be realized to the mutual benefit of our students and the community as a whole.

To the many others who make up the school set-up, thank you. Without each and every one of you we would not have the splendid schools that I feel we have today.

Many new problems will be just ahead of you to challenge and inspire you to greater efforts but I know you will carry through.

I hope you will use my experience and ask me to serve you on education committees in the future. I hope to keep a “finger in” the education scene. I have really enjoyed my thirty years of serving and trying to help others. I am sure I can still be of use to you in the future.

Thinking over the years I have been truly blessed with many honors in education. Three years ago I received a distinguished service citation from the New Hampshire School Boards Association for my long service in education. I am very proud of this citation. About seven years ago or  $2\frac{1}{2}$  terms to be exact, I received appointment to membership on the New Hampshire School Boards Executive Council. There are sixteen of us on this Council serving four Districts in New Hampshire. I was the first member from Northern New Hampshire, of which I am very proud. Mallet Anderson is now also serving with me and will continue to serve after my term is over. I have one more year to go and intend to serve out my time. These folks on the Council are trying to improve our schools from the School Boards standpoint and I might add are doing a wonderful job. I feel honored to be included with such distinguished folks. I have served for over seven years as Supervisory Chairman of Supervisory Union No. 7, working with members from all five Districts comprising this Union. They have been a great group of guys and gals working for the betterment of schools in this area. One of the things I take the most pride in, is being Chairman of my own Stewartstown District for eleven different terms, appointed by the members of our Board as their Chairman.

Lately, the several districts comprising the Supervisory Union No. 7 have been carrying on evaluation projects centered around "How to better serve our schools in the North Country". These have taken the form of informal get togethers between the School Boards, Supervisory Staff, State Dept. of Education Staff and other interested parties to find ways to collaborate and better share services with all the schools in this locality. This study has included Canaan, Lemington, and Norton, Vermont also. We are now making headway and hope soon you will be hearing from the committees appointed on ways to make these findings useful in the future. We hope to provide for shared services which will cost you less financially but help to improve your schools where necessary.

It has been a nice 30 years folks, thanks a million times for allowing me to share them with you. May God bless the citizens in their efforts to provide and maintain better schools and education for the children of our town.
